

## Power crisis worsens as shortfall reaches 7,300mw

LAHORE: The energy crisis in 1,060 megawatts from ther-Pakistan continues to deepen despite Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's strong directions to end load shedding. According to power division sources, the electricity shortfall has widened to 7.300 megawatts on Sunday. The demand in the country for electricity has surged to 27,300 megawatts amid the sweltering weather conditions. The duration of unannounced loadshedding nationwide also remained increased to 14 hours. They added that hardly nationwide power production of 20,000MW, resulting in a shortfall of 7200 MW.

KARACHI: The Pakistani rupee is up public finances will be a key. Some liquidity from exporters, say traders. Investors, however, are likely to remain somewhat cautious, seeking more clarity on the political front and ahead of the next fiscal year budget, traders said. The local unit consolidated its gains and rose to 197.59 against the dollar on Thursday. However, it bounced back the next day after the government hiked fuel prices to meet the International Monetary Fund (IMF) loan conditions. Pakistan is seeking to secure a staff-level agreement with the IMF in June. The dollar selling by exporters also supported the local unit in the outgoing week. However, the rupee gave up gains and ended weaker at 197.92 per dollar on Friday weighed by a sharp decline in the foreign currency reserves.

The rupee seems to trade on a stable note in the coming week. Markets will be closely watching the ongoing political turmoil in the country as when the ousted Prime Minister Imran Khan will announce the date for his next march. Caution is also likely to prevail ahead of the 2022/23 budget to be presented on June 10 (Friday) with investors expecting IMF conditions (fiscal consolidation) to dominate. Bilateral trade has grown from € 1.42 billion in 2019 to €1.52 billion in 2021. Trade volume in Jan-Feb 2022 stood at €289.37 million compared to €203.41 million during the same year 2021. It is worth mentioning that remittances from Pakistani workers in Italy hit an all-time high.

With the figures of \$711.7 million in FY22, Italy has become the seventh-largest center of worker remittances to Pakistan globally and the top one in the EU countries.

The ultimate Italy-Pakistan Mixed Economic Commission took place in Islamabad, where the two sides discussed trade opportunities between the two countries, focusing on developing foreign investments through SEZ (Special Economic Zones) in key sectors such as agro-industry, the Ambassador added.

The Ambassador further stated that Italy is home to more than 150.000 Pakistanis, the largest Pakistani diaspora in Europe (after Brexit). Engaged in various production sectors in Italy, they continue to make a great contribu-

## **Only One Earth**

his year's World Environment Day is significant because it marks fifty years since the 1972 United Nations Conference on the Human Environment, that was the first international meeting on the environment and led to the creation of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP). This planet is our only home. It is vital we safeguard the health of its atmosphere, the richness and diversity of life on Earth, its ecosystems and its finite resources. But we are failing to do so. The theme of this year's World Environment Day, "Only One Earth", is a simple statement of fact. We are asking too much of our planet to maintain ways life that are unsustainable. Earth's natural systems cannot keep up with our demands.

Over three billion people are affected by degraded ecosystems. Pollution is responsible for some 9 million premature deaths each year. More than 1 million plant and animal species risk extinction, many within decades. Close to half of humanity is already in the climate danger zone -15 times more likely to die from climate impacts such as extreme heat, floods and drought. There is a 50:50 chance that annual average global temperatures will breach the Paris Agreement limit of 1.5 degrees Celsius in the next five years. More than 200 million people each year could be displaced by climate disruption by 2050.

Fifty years ago, the world's leaders came together at the United Nations Conference on the Human Environment and committed to protecting the planet. But we are far from succeeding. We can no longer ignore the alarm bells that ring louder every day. The recent Stockholm+50 environment meeting reiterated that all 17 Sustainable Development Goals rely on a healthy planet. We must all take responsibility to avert the catastrophe being wrought by the triple crises of climate change, pollution and biodiversity loss.

On this issue Pakistan is fully committed to take ambitious actions to address climate change and environmental hazards. Going forward, we reaffirm our resolve in taking action on combating climate change, protecting biological diversity, and reversing ecosystem degradation. Pakistan is already in the midst of one of the world's most ambitious efforts to expand and restore its forests. In its quest for a Green Future, Pakistan is working towards setting national policies in motion to achieve by 2030, 60% of our energy mix, clean and green, and shift 30% of road transport to electric vehicles, as envisioned in its recently submitted Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) under the Paris Agreement.

Pakistan joined the international community in celebrating the "World Environment Day 2022" on the theme "Only One Earth". As one of top ten most climate-vulnerable countries, Pakistan highly values the global efforts to combat climate change, halt and reverse biodiversity loss, reduce pollution, and restore ecosystems. It is imperative for the international community to take ambitious actions and translate political commitments on combating climate change and environmental



The Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi gives the statement that "blood and water cannot flow together." As this sort of statement comes from India but didn't materialize. Later on, India decided to restart the Tulbul Project on the Jhelum River in the Kashmir Valley, which was previously suspended in response to Pakistan's objections. After Pulwama attack 2019, the Minister of Road and Water Resources Nitin Gadkari stated that "all water presently flowing into Pakistan in the three eastern rivers will be diverted to Haryana, Punjab and Rajasthan for various uses".

India can reduce the flow of water but cannot stop. Pakistan disagrees on Kishenganga and Ratle hydroelectric power plants being built by India. Pakistan has a lot of concerns and still, now Pakistan officials meet with World Bank in the US regarding the concern. The two countries disagree over the technical design features of the two hydroelectric plants breaks the Treaty. The plants are on respectively a tributary of the Jhelum and the Chenab Rivers. The Treaty designates these two rivers as well as the Indus as the "Western Rivers" to which Pakistan has unrestricted use. Under the Treaty. India is permitted to construct hydroelectric power facilities on these rivers subject to the terms.

# Depression & Suicide



mong various contributing factors. most notably mental disorders which tend to be closely related to suicide, depression is seen as a major risk factor. A great number of patients suffering from depression commit suicide never having had access to psychiatric care or proper treatment. Although depressed mood, psychomotor retardation, anxiety, panic attacks and autonomic symptoms may occur in depression, patients suffering from depression often visit a primary care physician rather than a clinical psychologist, complaining of various somatic symptoms.

Therefore, the role of primary care physicians not only that of clinical psychologists, is critical in preventing such patients from committing suicide. Since early diagnosis and implementation of intensive treatment for depression provide a good chance of preventing suicide, access to trained and well-informed mental health professionals remain at the heart of efforts aimed at preventing suicides among individuals. Statistics based on psychological autopsy method unveil the fact that 70-90 percent of those who committed suicide had credible evidence of some mental disorder when alive, and 60-70 percent was depressed.

It is much more likely for suicide to be undertaken by an individual with a mental disorder than for someone mentally competent to commit suicide. Among mental disorders, depression is particularly important in terms of its association with suicide. It should be noted that not all patients suffering from depression exhibit a typical clinical picture, and it merits emphasis that early diagnosis of depression and implementation of proper treatment provide a good chance of suicide prevention.

If Kyiv gets longer-range rockets, he added, Moscow will "draw appropriate conclusions and use our means of destruction, which we have plenty of,

we haven't vet struck.'

The U.S. has stopped short of offering Ukraine longer-range weapons that could fire deep into Russia. The four medium-range High Mobility Artillery Rocket Systems included in the security package include launchers on wheels that allow troops to strike a target and then quickly move away — which could be useful against Russian artillery on the battlefield.

The Spanish daily El Pais reported Sunday that Spain was planning to supply anti-aircraft missiles and up to 40 Leopard 2 A4 battle tanks to Úkraine. Spain's Ministry of Defense did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

# *Russian Embassy in Libya to function soon*

ANKARA: The Russian Embassy in Libya will resume work soon, according to the Russian presidential envoy for the Middle East and Africa

Mikhail Bogdanov told reporters on Saturday that the opening of the Russian Embassy in Libya will be "very soon."

Russia relocated its embassy in Libya to neighboring Tunisia in 2014 for security reasons. The move was taken after the embassy came under attack in October 2013, forcing Moscow to withdraw its diplomatic staff from Libva.

Oil-rich Libya has been mired by conflict and violence since the overthrow of strongman Muammar Gaddafi in 2011.

## Jordan signs agreements

AMMAN: Jordan's Ministry of Energy and Mineral Resources signed on Sunday agreements with a Jordanian and a Turkish company to explore copper and gold respectively in the kingdom, the ministry said in a statement.

Under the deals, the Jordanian company would conduct explorations for copper in a 78 sq-km area in the Dana area, while the Turkish company's exploration of gold would last for 14 months covering 155 square kilometers in the Abu Khashiba area in southern Jordan, it added.

Jordan's Minister of Energy and Mineral Resources Saleh Kharabsheh stressed the importance of the agreements, which will support the national economy and create more job opportunities for local communities.

### Posters expose India's anti-Kashmir designs in IIO7K

SRINAGAR: In Indian illegally occupied Jammu and Kashmir, posters have appeared in Srinagar and other areas to record the Kashmiris' protest against the divisive policies being pursued by the Hindutva BJP and RSS like the new genocide policies of the Kashmiris in the territory.

The Jammu and Kashmir Political Resistance Movement (JKPRM) and various other pro-freedom organisations have displayed the posters.

## Lebanon warns against any Israeli aggression

BEIRUT: Lebanon warned Israel on Sunday against any "aggressive action" in disputed waters where both states hope to develop offshore energy, after a ship arrived off the coast to produce gas for Israel. President Michel Aoun said any activity in the disputed area would amount to an act of aggression and a provocation, after the arrival of the natural gas storage and production ship operated by London-based Energean. Israel says the field in question is within its exclusive economic zone, not in disputed waters.

But in a statement, the Lebanese presidency said Aoun discussed with caretaker Prime Minister Najib Mikati the vessel's entry "into the disputed maritime area with Israel, and asked the Army Command to provide him with accurate and official data to build upon the matter".

Aoun said negotiations to delineate the southern maritime border continued and "any action or activity in the disputed area represents a provocation and an aggressive action".

There was no immediate response rom the Israeli government to Aoun's statement. Israeli Energy Minister Karine Elaharrar welcomed the vessel's arrival and said she hoped it would be brought online quickly.

## 60 Rohingya found abandoned on Thai island

BANGKOK: Fifty-nine Rohingya people have been discovered on a Thai island, saying they were abandoned by traffickers en route to Malavsia, a senior police officer said Sunday.

The group - among them five children - were found on Koh Dong island in the southern Satun province on Saturday, said lieutenant general Surachet Hakpan.

Each year, thousands of the mostly Muslim minority Rohingya people, heavily persecuted in Buddhist-majority Myanmar, risk their lives in months-long expensive journeys to reach Malaysia over Thailand's seas. Police said they had been charged with illegal entry and could face deportation to Myanmar following a court case.

"We are providing humanitarian assistance and will investigate whether they are victims of human trafficking or if they entered illegally," Surachet said. The group appeared "starving and was likely to have had no food for three to five days", a police statement said.

The boat's crew then decided to abandon those onboard on Koh Dong island - telling them that they had reached Malaysia, the group told officers.

The incident comes after the bodies of 14 Rohingya people, including children, were discovered washed up on a beach last month after they attempted to flee Myanmar.

# Digitized financial inclusion may change fate of underprivileged: Experts

DAVOS: Banking the unbanked population through digitized financial inclusion may bring positive change in the lives of the underprivileged populations and the national economy.

Pakistan win series 2-1; Sidra Amin declared Player of the series

KARACHI: Sri Lanka captain Chamari Athapaththu led from the front as Sri Lanka recorded a commanding 93-run win in the third and final ICC Women's Championship match at the Southend Club, Karachi on Sunday. Pakistan won the series 2-1 courtesy of their eight-wicket and 73-run win in the first two match-

At the end of the series Pakistan occupy the top-spot in the ICC Women's Championship 2022-25 cycle with four points from three games, Sri Lanka collected two points from their win today - this series was the first in the new championship cycle which will determine the six qualifying spots (top five plus the host) for the ICC Women's Cricket World Cup 2025.

Today's win was Sri Lanka's lone victory in their first tour of Pakistan in 17 years, before the ODIs, the visitors had lost the T20I series by a 0-3 margin.

Set a 261-run target, Pakistan were pegged back after a decent start. The hosts slumped from 41 for no loss to 48 for four in nine overs and never recovered from

# Haney produces masterclass to beat Kambosos

MELBOURNE: Unbeaten American Devin Haney fought a "smart fight" to comfortably beat Australia's George Kambosos on points Sunday and become the first undisputed lightweight world champion in modern boxing history.

Highly-rated WBC title holder Haney, a clear favourite, successfully defended his belt for a fifth time and in the process took the WBA, IBF and WBO straps off Kambosos with a unanimous verdict in Melbourne.

Victory made him the first undisputed lightweight champion since Pernell Whitaker in 1992 and the first in the four-belt era, which began in 2004.

Kambosos was undone by Haney's sensational speed, instinct and relentless left jab that frustrated the Australian who struggled to land enough big blows.

It was a defensive masterclass by the American, whose slick skills and tactical nous won the day in front of a 41,000-strong pro-Kambosos crowd at an electric Marvel Stadium.

All three judges scored in Haney's favour, 116-112, 116-112 and 118-110.

### Swiatek has 'no expectations' for Wimbledon

PARIS: Iga Swiatek says that she has "no expectations" for Wimbledon despite taking her winning streak to 35 matches by securing a second French Open title.

The world number one cruised past teenager Coco Gauff 6-1, 6-3 in Saturday's final at Roland Garros to win her sixth successive tournament this year, including four WTA 1,000 titles and one major.

The Pole won the Indian Wells-Miami double to show her hard-court prowess, having also lifted the title in Doha, and has now dominated on clay by emerging victorious in Stuttgart, Rome and Paris.
