IHC disposes of contempt of court plea against Fawad

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court (IHC) on Tuesday disposed of a contempt of court plea against senior PTI leader Fawad Chaudhry over his anti-judiciary remarks.

IHC's Justice Babar Sattar disposed of the plea, declaring it inadmissible.

A transcript of multiple statements of Fawad against the judiciary was attached along with the petition filed by lawyer Saleemullah Khan.

The petition stated that Chaudhry had made derogatory statements against additional sessions judge Zeba Chaudhry and in his statement, the PTI leader said that Imran Khan can't be given punishment in a contempt of court case as he is a popular leader.

The petitioner further pleaded with the court to initiate a contempt of court proceeding against Chaudhry.

At the outset of the hearing, the petitioner's lawyer said he would like to read the transcript of the statement in question.

"Fawad said that penalisation of Imran Khan is not possible as he is a popular leader. His statement is not against a judge only but the entire judiciary, including the chief justice of Pakistan," he said, moving the court to take a contempt of court action against Fawad.

At this, the court nauired what kind contempt of court action can be taken against Fawad. Responding to the query, the lawyer said that criminal contempt action

should be taken. However, Justice Sattar remarked that the case the lawyer is referring to is already under trial by a larger bench.

"Political statements don't constitute contempt of court. Nothing else will be there to do if [the court \(\) keeps taking actions on such statements," the justice said. Agencies

Bizenjo slams statement of PTI chief

QUETTA: Chief Minister Balochistan Mir Abdul Quddus Bizenjo slammed the statement of Chairman PTI Imran Khan regarding the appointment of the next army chief, saying it is very inappropriate to involve the military leadership in politics.

"The attempt to make controversial the constitutionally set procedure of the appointment of the Pakistan Army's chief is not in the interest of the country," said Bizenjo while releasing his statement on social media on September 5. On September 4, the PTI chairman said the coalition government wanted to "appoint an army chief of their own choice" therefore it was stalling the elections.

The PTI chairman said that PPP Co-chairman Asif Ali Zardari and former premier Nawaz Sharif "feared" a strong and patriotic army chief, who could hold them accountable for the looted money they had stashed abroad.

The former prime minister said a new army chief was going to be appointed in November this year. They [Zaradri and Nawaz] wanted to appoint a favourite [general] as the next army chief, he said.

Both have committed corruption worth billions, and they wanted to appoint an army chief who could protect them and their corruption, Imran Khan alleged.

The PTI chair alleged that PM Shehbaz, his brother Nawaz, and Zardari had been laundering public money. The two families had been looting the national exchequer for the last 30 years,

The Pakistani Army expressed displeasure over Imran Khan's statement against the military and said it as "aghast" over it.

In a statement, the Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said that the army was "aghast" at the defamatory and uncalled-for statements about the military's senior leadership made by the PTI chairman during a Faisalabad rally.

The military's media wing said that regrettably, an attempt was made to discredit and undermine the senior leadership of the army at a time when the institution was laying lives for the "security and safety of the people every day".

Chinese firm to establish automatic weather station in Pakistan

Chinese pioneer industrialists invited to invest in Pakistan's SEZs

BEIJING: Chinese meteorological company will set up an automatic weather station and is looking forward to building meteorological labs in Pakistan.

"Currently, we are working on the provision of automatic weather stations (AWS) and technologies. If conditions permit, we are also looking to building meteorological labs with our Pakistani partners, Zhuge, CEO of ZOGLAB, a professional Chinese manufacturer specialized in instruments for atmosphere and environment, told China Economic Net (CEN).

The quantity and quality of meteorological equipment in China top the world. For customers in South and Southeast Asia, Chinese meteorological equipment is more cost-effective compared with similar products with the same

index and precision manufactured in the US and European countries.

"A set of automatic weather station sold at around RMB 300,000 by western countries can be bought at around RMB 200,000 from China," he said, citing the AWS for field environment monitoring displayed during the China International Fair for Trade in Servic-

es (CIFTIS) which ended yesterday in Beijing. The cost is controlled at RMB 50,000-60,000. Automatic Weather Station is a very economical option for Pakistan compared with the radars and satellites which require longterm, huge investment", Zhuge added.

According to the CEO, Pakistan and China can also collaborate to establish meteorological standards to improve the accuracy of the

data acquired by the existing weather stations. Taking a step further, China can provide the

meteorological radars, satellite receivers, etc. to Pakistan to set up a three-dimensional meteorological observation system that covers equipment on the ground, in the sea, in the air and in the space", informed Zhuge.

He further elaborated that meteorological alert is different from weather forecast. The former, which targets the meteorological disasters, requires a whole set of observation devices and equipment.

"In this sense, all countries are a community with a shared future in the face of meteorological disasters, and the future lies in data sharing," he added.

Meanwhile, Commercial Counsellor, Pakistan Embassy Beijing, Ghulam Qadir has called upon the Chinese pioneer industrialists to take advantage of the incentives and investment-friendly policies offered by Paki-

stani government for the foreign investment in the special economic zones (SEZ's).

The Chinese entrepreneurs could avail incentives offered at Special Economic Zones (SEZs) as well as lease and transfer of land by foreign investors and facilitation for foreign real estate developers, he told participants of a seminar titled 'Summit Forum on China's International Economic Cooperation Going Global' held on sidelines of the 2022 ChinaInternational Fair for Trade in Services (CFTIS)

He remarked that investors could also get advantages of a complete tax holiday for contractors and sub-contractors for 20 years and exemption from customs duty for 40 years on the import of equipment and material for construction and operation of the free zone.

Trade Agreement paved way for Pakistan to promote local products through e-commerce



Kinnared College: a lighthouse in women education

innaird College (KC) Lahore is not just a college but it is a symbol of excellence which has produced hundred of thousands quality graduates who have played vital role in their respective fields. Female students all over the country and abroad love to get admission in this prestigious institution. KC is known for its quality education as well Co curricular activities. Kinnared College was established in 1913 by the Zenana Bible and Medical Mission.

In 1919, Presbyterian Mission Church and the Church Mission Society joined a consortium to fund and operate the college. In 1926 it moved to its current campus on the Jail Road, where it grew over the years and by 1939 the college had grown into a 20-acre (81,000 m2) campus. The college is named after Lady Mary Jane Kinnaird co-founder of YWCA and a great philanthropist of her time.

The now university was established at the start of the 20th century when it was housed near Kinnaird High School. In 2002 college was given the status of government Degree Awarding institution and its administration was handed over to Association of Kinnaird College. Board of governors run its administration. Zenana and Bible Medical Mission started college classes at Kinnaird Christian Girls' High School in Lahore.The founders wished to give Punjabi Christian women the opportunity to gain professional qualifications as teachers.

The first principal was Joan MacDonald. From 1913 to 1922 the college was the only women's liberal arts college in the Punjab. In its initial years, college life was designed for the predominately Christian student body and on graduation many students found employment in the mission school network.

The popularity of missionary schools among non-Christian families, with their emphasis on English language teaching and the chance to study with British and American teachers, led to a demand for the type of graduate teachs produced by the College.

In 1928, Isabella McNair became principal of the College. McNair believed that women's education should be intellectually equal to men's and alumnae encouraged to be active in public life. During the 1930s, admission standards, teacher/pupil ratios, extracurruclar activities and a fee schedule set Kinnaird apart as the region's most prestigious women's college.

The demographics had also shifted with a majority of pupils now coming from middle to upper class Hindu families, where an English education from a leading women's college was regarded as an important step in arranging a good marriage. After Partition in 1947, the University of the Punjab Senate decided to replace English with Urdu as the medium of instruction and examination for higher education. Despite this change, Kinnaird continued to offer women higher education in newly created Pakistan and added science courses, typing, nursing and social work to its curriculum. Partition however significantly altered the student body, with Muslims, a minority at Kinnaird before 1947, now becoming a large majority. In 1972, the Pakistani government nationalised all private schools and colleges, including Kinnaird.

In 2002, Kinnaird college was given Charter of Degree Awarding institution and the board of governor was set up to run its administration.

One and two year master's degrees are available in English Literature, Environmental Science, International Relations, English Language Teaching, Business Administration and Media Studies. KC also offers M.Phil degree in Computer Science, Statistics, Environmental Science, English Literature, International Relations and English Language Teaching. Radio Kinnaird 97.6 FM is a campus radio of Kinnaird College for Women University.

The transmission of this radio channel was started in June 2010. KC also encourages it's students to enhance their skills in different co curricular activities. For this purpose the Students' Council was formed under the Presidency of the Senior Student assisted by the Deputy Senior Student and the Hostel Deputy.





Treating cancer without chemo or radiation

ISLAMABAD: Before a patient can undergo T cell therapy designed to target cancerous tumors, the patient's entire immune system must be destroyed with chemotherapy or radiation. The toxic side effects are well known, including nausea, extreme fatigue and hair loss.

Now a research team, led by UCLA's Anusha Kalbasi, MD, in collaboration with scientists from Stanford and the University of Pennsylvania, has shown that a synthetic IL-9 receptor allows those cancer-fighting T cells to do their work without the need for chemo or radiation. T cells engineered with the synthetic IL-9 receptor, designed in the laboratory of Christopher Garcia, PhD, at Stanford, were potent against tumors in mice, as published Wednesday in Nature.

When T cells are signaling through the synthetic IL-9 receptor, they gain new functions that help them not only outcompete the existing immune system but also kill cancer cells more efficiently," Kalbasi said. "I have a patient right now struggling through toxic chemotherapy just to wipe out his existing immune system so T cell therapy can have a fighting chance. But with this technology you might give T cell therapy without having to

beforehand." Kalbasi, a researcher at the UCLA Jonsson Comprehensive Cancer Center and

an assistant professor of radiation oncology at the David Geffen School of Medicine at UCLA, began the work while under the mentorship of Antoni Ribas, MD, PhD, a senior investigator on the study. The study was also led by Mikko Siurala, PhD, from the laboratory of Carl June, MD, at Penn, and Leon L. Su, PhD, of the

Garcia Lab at Stanford. "This finding opens a door for us to be able to give T cells a lot like we give a blood transfusion," Ribas said.

Ribas and Garcia collaborated on a paper published in 2018 that focused on the concept that a synthetic version of interleukin-2 (IL-2), a critical T cell growth cytokine, could be used to stimulate T cells engineered with a matching synthetic receptor for the synthetic IL-2. With this system, T cells can be manipulated even after they have been given to a patient, by treating the patient with the synthetic cytokine (which has no effect on other cells in the body). Intrigued by that work, Kalbasi and colleagues were interested in testing modified versions of the synthetic receptor that transmit other cytokine signals from the common-gamma chain family: IL-4, -7, -9 and -21.

"It was clear early on that, among the synthetic common-gamma chain signals, the IL-9 signal was worth investigating," Kalbasi said, adding that unlike other common-gamma chain cytokines, IL-9 signaling is not typically active in naturally occurring T cells. The synthetic IL-9 signal made T cells take on a unique mix of both stem-cell and killer-like qualities that made them more robust in fighting tumors. "In one of our cancer models, we cured over half the mice that were treated with the synthetic IL-9 receptor T cells."

Kalbasi said the therapy proved to be effective in multiple systems. They targeted two types of hard-to-treat cancer models in mice pancreatic cancer and melanoma — and used T cells targeted to cancer cells through the natural T cell receptor or a chimeric antigen receptor (CAR). "The therapy also worked whether we gave the cytokine to the whole mouse or directly to the tumor. In all cases, T cells engineered with synthetic IL-9 receptor signaling were superior and helped us cure some tumors in mice when we couldn't do it otherwise." (Courtesy Science Daily)

'An Addictive Wedlock: IMF & Pakistan'



ot all wedlocks are destined to continue forever, some situations compel us to put a stop to the continuity of an unhealthy relationship. Pakistan entered into a wedlock with the International Monetary Fund (IMF) back in July 1950, when the IMF embraced its membership into the fund. Since then, its dependency on IMF for financial assistance increased every single day and is now a cardinal concern for every decision taken in the policy corridors of Islamabad. Is Pakistan an IMF addict?

Data from the last seven decades shows that Pakistan approached IMF for multiple arrangements including 12 Stand-By Arrangements (SBA), six Extended Fund

ed Credit Facilities (ECF) and one Structural Adjustment Facility (SAF). These are the financing tools of IMF; SBA helps in bridging short term financing gaps while the other facilities are extended to rectify long run structural problems in the balance of payment. Last bailout of EFF for about US\$6 billion was approved by the Executive Board of IMF on July 3, 2019 under the regime of cricketer turned politician, Imran Khan. This facility originally aimed at helping Pakistan in addressing its structural financing problems, combating macroeconomic instability amid COVID-19 pandemic and achieving continued growth targets.

The IMF reprimanded Pakistan by stalling this deal after the disbursement of only US\$ 3 billion for not fulfilling to its terms and the parties were on a negotiation table for the last few months, and finally with much hesitation, the IMF has finally revived the facility and released the tranche of \$1.2 billion in the first week of September.

In the last week of August, the finance minister, an unflappable champion in locking this deal despite the mali-

Another development that surfaced with the announcement was the increase in aggregate amount of the facility to US\$ 7 billion and extension until the end of June 2023. Accordingly, this will help the cash strapped economy to fill its coffers with the aid from other institutions including World Bank, Asian Development Bank and other friendly countries.

Gratefully, Pakistan escaped from a double bind situation by subordinating itself to harsh terms; under the terms of the deal, it has committed to increase the petroleum development levy to Rs. 50/ litre until January 2023. The board also stressed on catching up in power sector reforms, thence the inflationary bomb which is already detonated by the monsoonal deluge is going to bring more trouble for the underprivileged class in the form of higher taxes and early fuel adjustments. The Pakistan Bureau of Statistics reported an inflation figure of 27.3% YoY, which is the highest in the last

to record high in the coming months. The gravity of the situation is more appalling as prices of essential edible items have surged by more than three times in the past one year with frequent shortages.

What has caused the IMF to place draconian terms? Internally, it was the Imran led government that had been extra generous by over subsidizing POL products. It was never a wise strategy given the size of dwindling reserves and increasing dependence on foreign products, which not only includes POL products but also medicines and even agricultural products. For 2021, its imports included POL products worth US\$ 19 billion (27%) while the other major imports included electrical equipment of US\$ 6 billion (8%), machinery & steel products of US\$ 10 billion (14%) and pharmaceutical products of US\$ 4 billion (5%). As of August 2022, reserves in the coffers of State Bank of Pakistan and other banks stood at US\$ 15.5 billion (August 2021: US\$27.7 billion) and the ousted government relied heavily

al oil prices amid Russia-Ukraine war and surging global commodity prices proved to be a doom loop for Pakistan, warranting assiduous involvement of the IMF in the domestic financial affairs.

Pakistan was never short of crisis, economic crises, political crisis, power crisis and now it is in another stroke of bad luck with the climate catastrophe which is estimated to have a potential impact of US\$ 10 billion, required for the rehabilitation of the flood affectees. The Ministry of Finance is considering plans to seek emergency loan to fight the menace.

This time Pakistan narrowly escaped the fate of its Asian neighbor but the rising dependence on foreign loans for its survival entangles it into a debt trap, where it buys new loans to repay loans on dictatorial terms and loses the supremacy of an independent

Truss could make 'Little Britain' even smaller globally

fter an arduous and protracted two-month leadership contest, Britain finally discovered its new prime minister on Monday. Liz Truss' immediate in-tray will inevitably prioritize domestic issues given the cost-ofliving crisis, rising inflation and soaring energy bills. But what of her foreign policy? The former foreign secretary's pronouncements during her leadership campaign do not suggest she will divert much from the approach of her predecessor, Boris Johnson. This is a concern.

Johnson oversaw a shrinking of Britain's global importance and a plummeting in its international reputation, and Truss' campaign pledges imply that she will extend this trend further, making post-Brexit "Little Britain" even smaller globally.

On the one hand, Truss should be praised for vowing to continue one of Johnson's most important and successful foreign policies: Support for Ukraine in its war with Russia. Whether Johnson was as committed to Kiev as he made out, or whether photo-ops with President Volodymyr Zelensky made for useful distractions from his troubles at home, is a moot point.

London's support has been vital to Ukraine and the policy has enabled Britain to exhibit some global clout after Brexit. The same will be true of Truss. She also has a penchant for martial poses and no doubt will be on a plane to Kiev as soon as possible, but this should not detract from the policy's continued importance.

Another positive has been Truss' pledge to increase defense spending to 3 percent of gross domestic product by 2030. However, how she will fund this alongside other promises to slash taxes and provide an energy rescue package remains unclear. The promise may end up being shelved. But beyond Ukraine and defense spending,

most of Truss' foreign policy positions have ranged from underwhelming to downright alarming. She has doubled down on the almost petulant hostility toward the EU that has characterized Britain's relationship with Brussels after Brexit. This included a promise to deliver the Northern Ireland Protocol bill, "in full," which would tear up some of the commitments London agreed to on leaving the EU, breaking international law and risking a trade war with the bloc. Similarly, when asked whether French President Emmanuel Macron, leader of one of Britain's oldest allies. was a friend or foe, she remarked, "the jury's out," raising fears of a more antagonistic relationship

Truss seems committed to continuing and expanding other Johnson-era approaches that damaged Britain's reputation. She said she would keep the aid budget "as it is," sustaining Johnson's cut from the UN-recommended 0.7 percent of national economic output to 0.5 percent. She pledged to "support and extend" the policy of deporting illegal migrants to Rwanda - a move that was slammed by Britain's courts, human rights groups and provoked an international backlash. Truss' Britain looks set to roll back further on environmental pledges.

Her political allies have explored drilling for more gas and oil in the North Sea, and have shown skepticism toward renewable power and the net zero policies of Johnson. With London already facing criticism from France for the raw sewage being pumped onto its beaches, Britain under Truss could quickly become the "dirty man of Europe," with further environmental backsliding.

Finally, some of Truss' domestic policies could negatively affect Britain's standing. On the campaign trail she took a bullish approach

Ireland. Were this to continue in power, it could accelerate moves toward Scottish independence and a united Ireland.

Such a scenario would make Britain physically smaller, resource weaker and less able to influence international politics. Likewise, her proposed economic policies of tax cuts and limited assistance on the cost-of-living crisis has been criticized by most economists, arguing it will spark further inflation and worsen Britain's economic crisis. Such miserable conditions, especially if catalyzed by government mismanagement, would do Britain's soft power few favors and decrease its global appeal.

Of course, given Truss' reputation as a political shapeshifter — she supported Remain during the Brexit referendum, but has since become an ardent Leaver — it is possible many of these campaign pledges will not translate into policy. To become prime minister, she had to court a very small right-wing constituency, just under 82,000 Conservative party members. But to stay in power after the next election she will need to appeal to a broader, more moderate electorate. That said, British elections are rarely won or lost on foreign policy, which might make Truss feel she has more of a free hand.

Indeed, foreign policy might prove an area she can throw red meat to her right-wing base, upping the rhetoric against Europe and bashing migrants, as a way to distract from possible compromises on energy, taxes and the economy. If that proves to be so, Britain's descent into international triviality will continue apace.

Consequences of Grave Mismanagement

onsoon floods are wreaking havoc all across the country. Some unofficial stats state that almost 60-65% country is submerged in the water and every 1 in 7 Pakistanis is displaced, staying under the open sky. 116 districts are affected in different intensities, including 66 districts officially declared 'calamity hit' by GOP.

No doubt that the primary reason besides this natural calamity is more than the 700% monsoon rains and Global Warming, but that cannot mitigate the fact that this situation is a ginormous administrative failure as well.

Amongst the core reason behind all the destruction caused by floods in Swat is the encroachments all around the River Swat, which unfortunately couldn't be eliminated, despite all the encroachment operations and efforts to combat erosions in the past couple of years.

In Punjab, the most affected area is Salman Range. The destruction in the area is more than the Super Flood of 2010 despite the intensity of the flood being less than that. The sole reason-Asian Development Bank pointed out several areas in 2013 where there was a dire need to construct flood prevention waterbodies. However, those were approved in 2021 by concerned authorities, and there is still no work on the ground regarding these constructions. In Balochistan, 30 out of 32 districts are severely affected by this flood. Balochistan is always at high risk of Flash Flooding; there was a suggestion presented in 2013 that riverine areas in the way should have the Early Warning System and with that, school buildings should be construct- every time.

ed in a way that not only the people can take shelter in those schools but with that their animals can be kept safe here. But that's another story that all credits to the corruption, schools in Balochistan were the amongst the structures that were destroyed first in the floods of 2022. To date, one cannot find these early warning systems that were recommended 9 years ago.

Urban flooding, for which the better term is "administrative failure", is considered the primary reason behind the flooding in Sindh, but with that, another primary reason is not the construction of a single big dam in the past 4 decades, especially in Islamabad. No dams mean that all of the rainwater fills up the Indus River without any formality. Just a little more rain than usual, and the Indus River starts overflowing which ultimately ends up in flooding of different intensities.

Though Sindh constructed a few smaller dams, those are nothing to deal with the havor that these floods came bearing. The only possible solution is the construction of flood dams and an effective drainage system in the Riverine areas of Kashmour, Shikarpur, Larkana, Nawabshah etc, and in Southern Sindh from Tandu Muhammad Khan to Badin and Thatha). If possible, build new flood drains and pressure the federal government to build large water storage upstream of Sindh to regulate floods.

After the flood, the next challenge will be a prolonged drought. Pakistan urgently needs large water storage in Potohar basin or Mianwali upstream. The need of the hour is to learn lessons from all the situations and losses and take measures to ensure that at least there isn't any lack from our side to amplify the natural situation otherwise we will continue to watch our own destruction

Fears grow for Ukraine nuke plant ahead of inspector report

Ukraine says Russian forces shelled residential buildings in Nikopol

KYIV: Fears grew Tuesday for Europe's largest nuclear power plant as shelling around it continued, a day after the facility was again knocked off Ukraine's electricity grid and put in the precarious position of relying on its own power to run safety systems.

Repeated warnings from world leaders that fighting around the Zaporizhzhia plant has put it in an untenable situation that could lead to a nuclear catastrophe have done little to stem the hostilities. Russian-installed officials accused the Ukrainian forces of shelling the city where the plant is located on Tuesday, hours after the Ukrainians said Kremlin forces attacked a city across the river.

Both sides have traded such accusations since Russian troops seized the plant early in the war. With the danger rising, an International Atomic Energy Agency team finally traveled to the plant last week, and inspectors are expected to report what they found to the U.N. Security Council later in

Two inspectors remain at the plant, which is run by Ukrainians workers, and Ukrainian presidential adviser Mykhailo Podolyak applauded that



"There are Russian troops now who don't understand what's happening, don't assess the risks correctly," Podolworkers there, who need some kind of protection, people from the international community standing by their side and telling (Russian troops): 'Don't touch these people, let them work."

But that appears to have done little to lessen the risks. On Monday, the IAEA

said Ukrainian authorities reported that the plant's last transmission line was disconnected to allow workers to

guished," the IAEA said.

In the meantime, the plant's only remaining operational reactor would "generate the power the plant needs for its safety and other functions," the agency said. Mycle Schneider, an inde-

pendent analyst in Canada on nuclear energy, said that means the plant was likely functioning in "island mode," producing electricity just for its own

"Island mode is a very shaky, unstable, and unreliable way to provide continuous power supply to a nuclear plant," Schneider said.

It was just the latest incident that fueled fears of a potential nuclear disaster in a country still haunted by the world's worst nuclear accident at Chernobyl. Experts say the reactors at Zaporizhzhia are designed to withstand natural disasters and even aircraft crashes, but the unpredictable fighting around the plant had repeatedly threatened to disrupt critical cooling systems, raising the risk of a meltdown.

Russian-installed officials in the Zaporizhzhia region on Tuesday accused the Ukrainian forces of shelling Enerhodar, the city where the plant is located, and damaging a power line close to the plant.

Russian state news agency RIA Novosti reported, citing its correspondent on the ground, that the power was off in Enerhodar on Tuesday and sounds of explosions could be heard.

Dutch minister resigns after protests over pollution THE HAGUE: The Dutch agriculture minister has unexpectedly

resigned, telling reporters he wasn't the right person for the job following a tumultuous summer of protests by farmers over pollution regu-

Henk Staghouwer, who held the position for only nine months, announced his decision Monday night. He had just returned from Brussels, where he negotiated an agreement with the European Commission to scrap a Dutch exemption to manure spreading limits.

The Netherlands, along with Denmark, Ireland and the Flanders region of Belgium, had been allowed to exceed caps on how much manure farmers could return to their fields because of the country's comparatively small land area. But Brussels wants to phase out this dispensation because the Dutch are failing to meet EU water quali-

The country's lucrative agriculture sector has been in crisis since a 2019 court ruling forced the government to slash emissions of nitrogen oxide and ammonia, which livestock produce. Thousands of farmers have staged protests, blockading cities with tractors and burning hay bales along highways.

A 60-year-old former baker, Staghouwer had been tasked with transitioning the sector away from intensive farming practices and buying out farmers to reduce total emissions.

Southwest China quake leaves 46 dead, triggers landslides

BEIJING: At least 46 people were reported killed and 16 missing in a 6.8 magnitude earthquake that shook China's southwestern province of Sichuan on Monday, triggering landslides and shaking buildings in the provincial capital of Chengdu, whose 21 million residents are already under a COVID-19 lockdown.

The quake struck a mountainous area in Luding county shortly after noon, the China Earthquake Networks Center said.

Sichuan, which sits on the edge of the Tibetan Plateau where tectonic plates meet, is regularly hit by earthquakes. Two quakes in June killed at least four people.

Power was knocked out and buildings damaged in the historic town of Moxi in the Tibetan autonomous prefecture of Garze, where 29 people were killed. Tents had been erected for more than 50,000 people being moved from homes rendered unsafe by the quake, the official Xinhua News Agency reported Tuesday.

State broadcaster CCTV showed rescue crews pulling a woman who appeared uninjured from a collapsed home in Moxi, where many of the buildings are constructed from a mix of wood and brick. Around 150 people were reported with varying degrees of injuries.

Earlier, authorities had reported 7 deaths in Luding county and 14 more in neighboring Shimian county to the south. Three of the dead were workers at the Hailuogou Scenic Area, a glacier and forest

Along with the deaths, authorities reported stones and soil falling from mountainsides, causing damage to homes and power interruptions, CCTV said. One landslide blocked a rural highway, leaving it strewn with rocks, the Ministry of Emergency Management said.

Buildings shook in Chengdu, 200 kilometers (125 miles) away from the epicenter. Resident Jiang Danli said she hid under a desk for five minutes in her 31st floor apartment. Many of her neighbors rushed downstairs, wary of aftershocks.

Putin attends joint military drills with China, others

MOSCOW: Russian President Vladimir Putin on Tuesday attended sweeping war games in his country's far east involving troops from China and other nations, in a show of military muscle amid the tensions with the West over Moscow's action in Ukraine.

The weeklong exercise that began Thursday is intended to showcase growing defense ties between Russia and China and also demonstrate that Moscow has enough troops and equipment for the massive drills

even while its forces are engaged in fighting in Ukraine. The Russian Defense Ministry said that the Vostok 2022 (East exercise that runs until Wednesday at seven firing ranges in Russia's Far East and the Sea of Japan involves more than 50,000 troops and over 5,000 weapons units, including 140 aircraft and 60 warships. It engages troops from several ex-Soviet nations, China, India, Laos, Mongolia, Nicaragua and Syria.

Beijing sent more than 2,000 troops along with more than 300 military vehicles, 21 combat aircraft and three warships to take part in the drills, according to Chinese news reports. As part of the maneuvers, the Russian and Chinese navies in the Sea of Japan practiced joint action to protect sea communications and support for ground forces in coastal areas.

Israeli forces kill Palestinian in firefight in West Bank

JERUSALEM: Israeli troops killed a Palestinian man during a firefight Tuesday in the occupied West Bank, the Palestinian Health Ministry said. The violence erupted after Israel demolished the home of a Pales-

tinian who killed three Israelis in an attack earlier this year. The military said it demolished an apartment in the West Bank city of Jenin belonging to Raed Hazem, the gunman who opened fire at a Tel Aviv bar in April.

During the operation, the army said "violent disturbances erupted that included stone-throwing, firebombs, hurling of explosives and massive gunfire toward the troops" and that soldiers returned fire.

The Palestinian Health Ministry said a 29-year-old man was killed and 16 others were wounded in the fighting. The Palestinian official news agency, Wafa, identified the man as Mohammad Musa Sabaaneh. It was not immediately clear if he was armed or involved in the clashes.

Israel maintains a policy of demolishing the homes of Palestinian attackers. Israeli officials say the demolitions deter future attacks, while rights groups view it as a form of collective punishment.

Israel has been conducting near-daily arrest raids in the West Bank for months, which were prompted by a spate of deadly attacks against Israelis earlier this year that killed 19 people.

Russia to buy rockets, artillery shells from North Korea: US

WASHINGTON: The Russian Ministry likely part of a Russian plan to acquire tries. Its possible dispatch of laborers to of Defense is in the process of purchasing millions of rockets and artillery shells from North Korea for its ongoing fight in Ukraine, according to a newly downgraded U.S. intelligence finding.

A U.S. official, who spoke on the condition of anonymity to discuss the intelligence determination, said Monday that the fact Russia is turning to the isolated state of North Korea demonstrates that "the Russian military continues to suffer from severe supply shortages in Ukraine, due in part to export controls and sanctions."

U.S. intelligence officials believe that the Russians could look to purchase additional North Korean military equipment in the future. The intelligence finding was first reported by The New York Times.

The U.S. official did not detail how much weaponry Russia intends to border controls. purchase from North Korea. The finding comes after the Biden adminfor use on the battlefield in Ukraine.

MOGADISHU: The United Nations says "famine is at the door" in Somalia with "concrete indications" famine will occur later this year in the southern Bay region. This falls just short of a formal famine declaration as thousands are dying in a historic drought made worse by the effects of the war in Ukraine.

U.N. humanitarian chief Martin Griffiths told reporters he was 'shocked to my core these past few days" on a visit to Somalia in which he saw starving babies too weak to cry. More than 850,000 people are in the affected areas, with tens of thousands more arriving in the months to come, according to U.N.

A formal famine declaration is rare and a warning that too little help has come too late. At least 1 million people in Somalia have been displaced by the driest drought in decades, driven by climate change, that also affects the wider Horn of Africa including Ethiopia and

Famine is the extreme lack of food and a significant death rate from outright starvation or malnutrition combined with diseases like cholera.

Real can defend Champions League title: Ancelotti

MADRID: Real Madrid manager Carlo Ancelotti is optimistic about the Spanish club's chances of winning back-to-back Champions League titles even though bookmakers have not picked them among the top-four favourites.

"It's not a surprise for me not being the odds-on favorite, I think it's a good sign," Ancelotti told a news conference in Glasgow on the eve of Tuesday's opening Group F game against Celtic.

"I think that last year we had even less probability in the statistics to win it. And we have an improved team this season. "What happened last year will happen again. We are going to compete until the end and, hopefully, we will compete in the final."

Last season, Real Madrid were considered to be the underdogs during their knockout round matches against Paris St Germain, Chelsea and Manchester City as well as in the final showdown with Liverpool but they went on to win a record-extending 14th European Cup title. "In this competition, Real Madrid have always been respected. The history of the club is part of the history of this competition," Ancelotti said.

"We start with enthusiasm, as always, but you never know what is going to happen. We have to think about the group-stage first, win it and then see what happens after the (break in November and December for the) World Cup." Ancelotti said that he will probably rotate his squad more often to keep players fresh with Champions League and La Liga matches overloading the schedule.

The Italian said he was concerned about how the players will cope with the packed schedule once they return from the World Cup in Qatar that kicks off on Nov 20. "Until the World Cup I believe we won't have problems because the players are prepared and motivated. They want to get to the World Cup in good condition," Ancelotti said.

The question is how the players will return after the World Cup. We just don't know because it is a unique situation." Real Madrid are grouped together with Leipzig, Shakhtar and Celtic in Champions League Group F.
