### **Defamation case Court fines on IK for seeking** adjournment

ISLAMABAD: A session court Saturday fined former prime minister and PTI chief Imran Khan for seeking an adjournment of the hearing in the Rs10 billion defamation case filed against Defence Minister Khawaja Asif.

Additional Sessions Judge Adnan Khan imposed a fine of Rs5.000 on the PTI chief for seeking an adjournment in the hearing due to his involvement in the ongoing relief operation for the flood victims in Sindh.

The PML-N leader's lawyer Advocate Ali Shah Geelani appeared before the court during the hearing, but his cross-examination of Khan's statement had to be postponed.

The court accepted Khan's counsel's request to adjourn the hearing, after which the hearing was adjourned till September 24.

### lf economy to decline Nation will hold establishment responsible: Imran

PTI chief tells nation to wait for his call

GUJRANWALA: Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) supremo and former Prime Minister Imran Khan on Saturday said that the nation will hold the establishment responsible if the country's economy continues to decline.

Addressing a public rally in Gujranwala, the former PM said that the Secretary General of the United Nations (UNSG) has come to visit the flood-affected areas, and Shehbaz Sharif assured him that he would spend money honestly while the majority of his federal cabinet members are on bail. They keep money outside the country and beg from others, Imran added.

"80,000 Pakistanis were sacrificed in American war which was imposed on us. Such rulers bow before foreign countries, and they will do whatever orders they get from outside. That is why Pakistan is independent in its decision," the former PM said.

While reacting to the contempt of court case, Imran Khan said Shahbaz Gill was not a terrorist but he was treated and tortured like a terrorist that is why he reacted.

"The court of Chief Justice Athar Minallah has made very good decisions, I will accept whatever decision the court makes," the PTI chairman said.



"The imported government is rapidly taking the country down, I know you are neutral, but if the country's economy continues to decline like this, the nation will hold you responsible. If nothing is done, the economy will be destroyed, and the national security will be directly affected if this happens," Imran said.

The PTI chairman addressed his party's Insaf Student Federation (ISF) and the youth in general, and said he would need them both in the light of 'things I am going to say ahead".

"The thing I am preparing this nation for ... I would need the youth of this nation a lot for Haqeeqi Azadi (actual freedom)," he said.

Imran Khan directed his party leaders to mobilise workers at the local level and urged his supporters to await his call to steer the country out of the quagmire. "Mobilise party workers in every district and wait for my final call. We have to free Pakistan from these thieves," he said while issuing directives to district organisations and added that the only way out of this crisis was to conduct clean and transparent general elections.

The former prime minister once again warned Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif that his government would not be able to stop the sea of people when they will gather in Islamabad from all four provinces. Agencies

### Sold security **Masood forewarns** world about perils of climate change

WASHINGTON: Pakistan's Ambassador to the United States Masood Khan has alerted international community about the serious perils of erratic climate change that were threatening the nations across the globe.

He was briefing American and international media persons about the flood situation in Pakistan at the National Press Club in Washington DC.

He said that the recent flood and the massive devastation in Pakistan is an exhibit for the devastations of climate change. He said this phenomenon is going to grow whether it is Pakistan or any other countries in South Asia or the world.

The Ambassador said that though international media was extensively showing heart-wrenching visuals of the affected areas vet it has only captured "a fraction of the calamity what we are facing in Pakistan."

He said that while it was a collective responsibility to reduce emissions, the international community must think of ways and means for compensation to those bearing the brunt of climate change despite making negligible contribution towards global warming.

While sharing harrowing details of the devastation caused by the flood that has submerged one third of the country, he informed the participants that over 1400 lives have been lost in Pakistan. More than 13,000 have been injured. A population of 33 million has been affected by flooding. He said around 6.6 million people needed immediate assistance. Nearly 800,000 farm cattle have perished.

Crops have been destroyed in an area as big as 5.5 million acres that includes all sorts of crops including rice, wheat, corn and sugarcane. Over 7000 kilometers long roads have been washed away with 246 bridges destroyed.

The Ambassador said that as large as 5.5 million acres of cropland has been destroyed resulting in a looming food security crisis. He said "WFP and other international organizations must come forward and give necessary support to the people of Pakistan so that we can maintain our food security.

The Ambassador thanked the US government, Congress, US philanthropic and charity organizations and most importantly Pak-American community for their generous Masood Khan suggested that we contributions towards relief and should make quick transition from rescue activities.

# UNSG applauds efforts of GoP for addressing post flood issues

Antonio Guterres calls for substantial support from world to overcome challenges posed by climate-induced floods in Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: United Nations Secretary-General (UNSG) Antonio Guterres visited Pakistan on 9-10 September 2022 to show solidarity with the people of Pakistan, braving a colossal climate-induced natural disaster caused by unprecedented rains and floods across the country. The two-day visit comprised high-level meetings, briefings, interactions with displaced people, first responders, UN country representatives, civil society and media.

The UNSG called on Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif. Several members of the Federal Cabinet joined the meeting. The PM expressed his gratitude for the Secretary-General's personal attention to the situation arising from the floods and greatly appreciated his visit and concern for the affected people. The PM informed the

lenges posed by the flash floods, including the provision of Rs.35 billion cash relief through Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP), rescue and relief operations, and delivery of humanitarian assistance in coordination with all national stakeholders and with support of international partners. While appreciating the UNSG's video message for the UN Flash Appeal, the PM highlighted that with less than 1% of global carbon emission Pakistan is facing brunt of natural calamities in the form of heat waves, glacial outbursts, droughts, torrential rains and unprecedented monsoons. The PM called for urgent mitigation and adaptation efforts in addition to mobilizing support for recovering and rebuilding from such extreme climate events.

The UNSG said that countries like Pakistan, who have done almost nothing to contribute to global warming, do not deserve this. He UNSG about the efforts of the Government added, "I know how volunteers, civil servants, of Pakistan in addressing the daunting chal- army, NGOs have been working together in



a remarkable way to mitigate the suffering of Pakistani people". The UNSG stated, "My voice is at the service of the Government and people

of Pakistan. I have seen the enormous generosity of Pakistanis in protecting and assisting

more than 6 million Afghan refugees and helping each other in previous calamities such as during the earthquake and floods. My admiration for this country is limitless". He assured that the UN would do everything in its capacity to help the people of Pakistan. The UNSG appealed to the international community to provide massive support to Pakistan for not only relief assistance but also for rehabilitation and climate resilient reconstruction. He emphasized that it was not just a matter of solidarity but a matter of justice, as countries like Pakistan who have not contributed to climate change are amongst the frontline countries impacted by climate change.

The UNSG was briefed on the overall ground situation, humanitarian activities and coordination amongst national and international stakeholders at the National Flood Response and Coordination Centre

(NFRCC). The PM and the UNSG also had a joint presser.

The UNSG held delegation level talks with Foreign Minister Bilawal Bhutto Zardari, followed by a joint press stakeout. A broad range of issues related to the recent floods and climate change came under discussion. The FM noted that one-third of the country was inundated, around 33 million people affected across the country, over 1300 lives lost including more than 400 children, nearly 800,000 livestock perished, more than 1.7 million houses and 6000 km of roads have been destroyed or damaged. The Foreign Minister said that though the people impacted by the floods have made no contribution to the climate change, they were suffering the most due to it, and therefore, it was the shared responsibility of the international community to do its utmost to assist the millions of affectees to return to normal lives and livelihoods in a sustainable manner.





WANA: In the tribal district of South Waziristan Wana, a "Loyya Jirga"/ Grand Jirga was arranged regarding the transfer of all line departments from Tank District to their own district South Waziristan under the shadow of Pakistan People's Party in Wana.

Local leaders of all political parties in "Loya Jirga"/Grand Jirga newly elected VC, NC chairmen, councillors, social workers and people belonging to different communities participated.

District President Aman Ullah said that case number 6057\_2019 is pending in the Peshawar High Court, therefore, all the offices of South Waziristan should be shifted from District Tank to Wana.

All the speakers on this occasion said that the erstwhile FATA was known as Landless Land for the past 70 years, where the black laws of the British era, the Frontier Crimes Regulation, were in force.

Under which the people of erstwhile FATA did not have the right to appeal, argument and lawyer, while for the past several decades, this backward region



has become engulfed in international conspiracies and terrorism.

Majority of the population of Ex FATA had to be IDPs & TDPs in 2018 expressing the aspirations of the people of erstwhile Ex FATA, their long-standing desire was merged into Pakhtunkhwa through the 25th Amendment Constitution and given not only the right to appeal, counsel, lawyer and argument.

Rather, a notification was also issued to shift the offices of FATA from the planned areas to the newly merged districts But the district administration

of South Waziristan is still reluctant to implement this notification.

They said that the tribal district of South Waziristan is one of the unfortunate district, whose judiciary including all the line departments is located in another district of Tank, 120 km away from the district of South Waziristan.

All the offices and courts of South Waziristan district are not located in their district, not only causing financial loss to the people, but also the precious lives are exposed to hostility while going to appear in the court.

South Waziristan district contributes billions of rupees annually to the national exchequer in taxes

The tribal district of South Waziristan is spread over 6619 square kilometers, the population of Jaski consists of 674065 people, while the district has 8 tehsils and 3 sub-divisions.

District South Waziristan has 97 village councils including 15 neighborhood councils and 82 village councils. Annually 8500 tons of natural fruit pointes apple is produced from different mountains of the district, while 64500 tons of apples are produced, South Waziristan district produces 70 thousand tons of different types of vegetables.

All the political parties participating in the "Loya Jirga"/ Grand Jirga presented a unanimous demand that all the offices of district South Waziristan should be transferred from District Tank to South Waziristan.

All the offices of Wana sub-division. Ladha sub-division and Sarvekai sub-division should be transferred to the respective divisions of District Tank.

# Eating eggs can boost heart health

ISLAMABAD: Researchers have shown how moderate egg consumption can increase the amount of heart-healthy metabolites in the blood, publishing their results today in eLife.

The findings suggest that eating up to one egg per day may help lower the risk of developing cardiovascular disease.

Eggs are a rich source of dietary cholesterol, but they also contain a variety of essential nutrients. There is conflicting evidence as to whether egg consumption is beneficial or harmful to heart health.

A 2018 study published in the journal Heart, which included approximately half a million adults in China, found that those who ate eggs daily (about one egg per day) had a substantially lower risk of heart disease and stroke than those who ate eggs less frequently\*.

Now, to better understand this relationship, the authors of this work have carried out a population-based study exploring how egg consumption affects markers of cardiovascular health in the blood.

'Few studies have looked at the role that plasma cholesterol metabolism plays in the association between egg consumption and the risk of cardiovascular diseases, so we wanted to help address this gap," explains first author Lang Pan, MSc at the Department of Epidemiology and Biostatistics, Peking University, Beijing, China.

Pan and the team selected 4,778 participants from the China Kadoorie Biobank, of whom 3,401 had a cardiovascular disease and 1,377 did not. They used a technique called targeted nuclear magnetic resonance to measure 225 metabolites in plasma samples taken from the participants' blood. Of these metabo-



lites, they identified 24 that were associated with self-reported levels of egg consumption.

Their analyses showed that individuals who ate a moderate amount of eggs had higher levels of a protein in their blood called apolipoprotein A1- a building-block of high-density lipoprotein (HDL), also known as 'good lipoprotein'. These individuals especially had more large HDL molecules in their blood, which help clear cholesterol from the blood vessels and thereby protect against blockages that can lead to heart attacks and stroke.

The researchers further identified 14 metabolites that are linked to heart disease. They found that participants who ate fewer eggs had lower levels of beneficial metabolites and higher levels of harmful ones in their blood, compared to those who ate eggs more regularly.

Together, our results provide a potential explanation for how eating a moderate amount of eggs can help protect against heart disease," says author Canqing Yu, Associate Professor at the Department of Epide-miology and Biostatistics, Peking University. "More studies are needed to verify the causal roles that lipid metabolites play in the association between egg consumption and the risk of cardiovascular disease." (Courtesy Science Daily)

# Tough times ahead for Britain's new PM

n the spring of 1945, after towering over the American political landscape for a generation, Franklin Delano Roosevelt died suddenly at his retreat in Warm Springs, Georgia. At the time, Vice President Harry Truman was up on Capitol Hill, sharing a customary drink with the Congressional leadership at the end of a hard week (yes, opposing leaders actually socialized with one another in those faraway days).

Abruptly summoned to the White House, Truman ran straight into the president's wife, Eleanor, who told him the news. Shocked into his basic Midwestern decency, Truman asked if there was anything he could do for her. She wisely replied: "No, Harry, is there anything we can do for you? For you are the one in trouble now."

I thought of this historical vignette last week as Liz Truss succeeded the shambolic Boris Johnson as prime minister of the UK. When Britain's period of official mourning for Queen Elizabeth comes to an end and the business of government resumes, rarely will a new polit-

with such a bulging and dangerous in-tray.

Following the semi-criminal failure of Europe and the UK to worry much about their energy policies for the past few decades (indeed, just days before the Ukraine war began, Berlin was still pushing to get the Nord Stream 2 gas pipeline operational, which would have preposterously increased its energy dependence on Moscow), knock-on inflation marching in tune with stratospheric energy price rises has been the doleful result – both on the continent and in the UK.

The beast of inflation, now fully loosed from its cage in Britain, sits at an unhealthy 10.1 percent. The specter of stagflation, and a permanent cost-of-living crisis, beckons. Indeed, in political risk terms, if both Europe and the UK do not master (and quickly) the current economic crisis, the grim reality of overall absolute

decline awaits them. Calmly (a blessed relief from Johnson's rollercoaster tenure), Truss has set out a four-pronged strategy for dealing with the calamity. First, her administration intends to freeze average annual household energy prices

On her very first day, Truss has wagered the overall success of her premiership on this one, overwhelming economic bet. She is all in.

Second, Truss wants to make sure the UK never again finds itself the prisoner of its energy supply. Fracking, outlawed under the Johnson premiership, will be allowed, in an effort to increase domestic energy production, as will further drilling for oil and natural gas in the to do so, then Brexit will have

Third, the new prime minister is betting on aggressive growth as the ultimate way out of the crisis. Despite the mammoth new borrowing, Truss is pressing for large tax cuts amounting to  $\pounds 30$  billion to free up the animal spirits of British business and extricate the UK from its parlous economic state. She has called upon Jacob Rees-Mogg, the new business and energy secretary, to drastically cut government regulation and further unshackle the British commercial sector

Fourth, with rising Conservative Party star Kemi Badenoch the new trade secretary, Truss will try to bank the winnings from Brexit. I have long been exasperated by both sides of the Brexit debate, locked as they are in their deafening self-regarding theologies. In policy terms, the issue is simple. If, in the medium term, Britain manages to secure free trade deals with the parts of the world that are actually economically growing (India, the US, the Anglosphere countries), then Brexit will have been worth it as the UK looks beyond an economically sclerotic Europe for its economic future. If it does not manage

done is alienate its largest trading partner.

On these monumental policy issues, the Truss leadership will rise or fall. During her inaugural session at Prime Minister's Question Time in the House of Commons, Truss's tone was strikingly different from Johnson's. Gone was the bombast, the showmanship, the sly humor, and the loose relationship to the facts. In their place were sobriety, a low-key confidence, a reassuring calmness. In both cases, the style of the two leaders belies reality. For all his gaudiness, Johnson's actual policy agenda was incredibly boring; he was a vanilla, garden-variety Macmillanite. On the other hand, beneath Truss's dullness lies a radical, updated, Thatcherite policy agenda that will either actually work or obviously fail. In terms of substance, as was true for Truman, stirring days lie ahead.

## Enthusiasm abounds as GCC, Central Asia launch strategic dialogue

he Gulf Cooperation Council foreign ministers on Wednesday met in Riyadh with their counterparts from Central Asia -Kazakhstan, Kvrgvzstan, Taiikistan, Turkmenistan and Uzbekistan. After centuries of isolation and estrangement, the Arabian Peninsula and Central Asia are seeking to revive ancient ties and explore new opportunities, economically, politically and culturally.

At the meeting, the ministers inaugurated the GCC-Central Asia Strategic Dialogue, a new arrangement to launch cooperation in all areas of mutual interest, including political and security dialogues, trade and investment cooperation, and cultural engagement. Although the project has been in the making for some time, recent developments have made that reconnection urgent. Supply chain disruptions as a result of COVID-19, the war in Ukraine and the US withdrawal from Afghanistan have made it imperative to speed up the process of reengagement between the two regions.

As part of the new strategic dialogue, the ministers exchanged views on a wide range of regional and international developments, including Afghanistan and combating terrorism, two issues in which the two regions are keenly interested. They agreed to regularly coordinate their positions on existing and emerging issues.

As a landlocked region, Central Asia is in need of secure transportation links, which have frayed recently as a result of COVID-19. As such, the ministers emphasized their commitment to working together to commitment. There also appears to be clear ensure the resiliency of supply chains and determination for this effort to move on a fast

to "bolster global economic recovery efforts. address economic repercussions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic." They expressed interest in transport-transit connectivity as it relates to food, energy and water security. They also called for the development of green energy sources and technologies and for environmental challenges and climate change to be addressed.

To map out the way forward, the ministers endorsed an indicative Joint Action Plan for Strategic Dialogue and Cooperation for the period 2023-2027, including political and security dialogue, economic and investment cooperation, enhancing people-to-people contacts, and developing effective partnerships between business sectors. It was agreed to fast-track the plan and take all necessary measures for its proper implementation at both the bilateral and multilateral levels.

While the new plan is quite ambitious, several countries expressed a desire to augment it by adding new areas of cooperation. That desire reflected the palpable enthusiasm that has prevailed during all the meetings between the two groups since they started discussing the establishment of a regular dialogue. It was agreed to explore those additions over the coming weeks and months and update the plan accordingly.

At Wednesday's meeting, the ministers welcomed Kazakhstan's invitation to host the first GCC-Central Asian Economic Forum, to be held in 2023. They also accepted Uzbekistan's invitation to host the second ministerial meeting of the GCC-Central Asian Strategic Dialogue in Samarkand in 2023.

The aspirations are quite high for the new engagement between the GCC region and Central Asia. There is an obvious political

track. The economic and security challenges the two regions are facing need collaborative efforts. At the same time, the potential benefits of such cooperation could be immense. Combined, the two regions are home to a young population of about 130 million, who are in search of quality education and training. In the two regions, there are countries that are among the world's most resourcerich in conventional energy, especially oil and gas. They also aspire to be leaders in renewable energies.

The GCC and Central Asia could contribute significantly to energy security globally. Their energy cooperation could be one of the quick wins in their new strategic dialogue, starting with policy coordination and the sharing of knowledge and best practices.

The challenges facing such long-distance strategic engagement are, however, equally huge, especially in terms of infrastructure and energy projects. First, there is a need to energize investors in both regions, which requires educating them about the new opportunities and business environment. Second, it is important to explore the possibility of investment triangulation, by bringing third-party investors with the capital and expertise needed for large energy and infrastructure projects, both conventional and renewable. Third, public-private partnership is needed to sustain these efforts. One of the most formidable challenges is addressing Central Asia's need for transport-transit connectivity to other regions, such as the GCC countries.

## **Digital transformation to** spur growth

n July, Shanghai released a blueprint to boost the development of its digital economy during the 14th Five-Year Plan period (2021-2025), setting ambitious goals and also putting forward a series of supporting policies to promote enterprises' digital transformation.

The digital economy has seen unprecedented progress around the world in recent years, especially when it comes to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Such progress is promoting profound changes in industrial production, people's way of life, and governance.

In Shanghai, targeted policies have been adopted to boost the development of artificial intelligence, 5G technology, and industrial internet throughout the city over the past few years. Thereby, a large number of high-tech enterprises have emerged and reached new achievements. More investments have also been injected into new infrastructure projects across the city, ensuring a boon for the city's digital economy development. In 2021, the share of digital economy in Shanghai's GDP surpassed 50%, making it a prominent driving force for the city's economic growth. Furthermore, a new generation of information and communication technologies is expected to see remarkable progress as cooperation between Chinese and international companies grows. This will ensure an accelerated integration among various industries and thereby boost the digital transformation of enterprises and industries as a whole.

Since the 18th CPC National Congress, China has attached great importance to the development of the digital economy. According to a report on the global digital economy released last month, the share of the digital economy in China's GDP has increased from 20.9% to 39.8% between 2012 and 2021, making it a key driving force spurring China's economic growth. Moreover, the added value of China's digital economy hit \$7.1 trillion last year, accounting for over 18% of the amount of 47 major countries across the world.

Now second year in its 14th Five-Year Plan period, China's development of the digital economy is expected to be a new boon, aiming to ensure that the added value of core industries accounts for 10% of GDP by 2025, which will ultimately add new impetus to the country's high-quality development.

Against this backdrop, Shanghai has made the digital transformation of industries a long-term priority in order to build the city into a "digital hub" by 2035. More efforts are expected to be made to boost innovation in terms of planning, policies, and core technologies so as to foster a favorable environment for the development of the digital economy. # King Charles vows to follow queen's example as he is proclaimed monarch

Britain has declared a period of mourning until the state funeral for Elizabeth

LONDON: King Charles pledged on Saturday to follow the example of his late mother as he was officially proclaimed as Britain's new monarch on Saturday at a historic ceremony in St James's Palace.

The death of 96-year-old Queen Elizabeth on Thursday after 70 years on the throne set in train long-established and highly choreographed plans for days of national mourning and a state funeral that will be held in just over a week.

Charles, 73, immediately succeeded his mother but an Accession Council met on Saturday to proclaim him as king, with his son and heir William, wife Camilla and Britain's new prime minister, Liz Truss, among those to sign the proclamation.

The death of Elizabeth, Britain's longest-reigning monarch, has drawn outpouring of tributes from at home and around the globe. Landmarks have been used to celebrate her life, with buildings in Europe, America and Africalit up in the red, white and blue of the United Kingdom.

In Britain, people started gathering outside royal palaces in the early hours of Saturday morning, with thousands flocking to Buckingham Palace to pay respects to the queen and Charles-who was proclaimed king at the nearby St James's Palace.

"It's a poignant time in our country's history," design manager Ian Bilboe, 54, said. "(We're) here to be part of that and show respect to the late queen and also to the new king." Charles is king and head of state not only of the United Kingdom but of 14 other realms including Australia, Canada, Jamaica, New Zealand and Papua New Guinea.

Britain has declared a period of mourning until the state funeral for Elizabeth, once described by her grandson Harry as "the nation's grandmother". The date for that has not been announced but it is expected in a little over a week's time.

STOCKHOLM: A surge in gun violence and gang crime has emerged as a major issue in what Swedish media have dubbed one of the ugliest election campaigns in history.

"Right at this spot here we had a shooting about this time last year," says Martin Gunér, a police officer in Gottsunda, a 15-minute drive from the mediaeval spires of Uppsala's university city.

Gottsunda is notorious for drug and gun battles, and police have named it one of Sweden's top ten most dangerous neighbourhoods.

South Sudan declares disaster in flood-affected areas

JUBA: South Sudan's government has declared flood-affected parts of the country as national disaster areas and appealed for assistance.

Friday's appeal came after torrential rains in the Upper Nile and Bahr el-Ghazal regions. Information Minister Michael Makuei Lueth said the floods have displaced thousands of people and claimed hundreds of lives.

Earlier this week, President Salva Kiir appealed to humanitarian partners for help. South Sudan has experienced extreme flooding over the past three years, with more than 800,000 people affected in 2021 alone. Since the beginning of rainy season in May, flooding in parts of the country has forced some health centers to close and stranded populations, leaving them vulnerable to water-borne diseases and snake bites.

# UN global congress vows to support terrorism victims

UNITED NATIONS: The first United Nations Global Congress of Victims of Terrorism concluded Friday at the UN headquarters in New York with a commitment to strengthen support for terrorism victims.

Themed "Advancing the Rights and Needs of Victims of Terrorism," the congress aims to adopt a victim-centric approach to countering terrorism and preventing violent extremism, said a press release of its organizer, the United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism.

More than 600 participants, including close to 100 victims of terrorism from 25 countries across the globe, attended the congress in person.

The congress concluded with the presentation of the chair's summary by Vladimir Voronkov, the under-secretary-general for counter-terrorism. In his remarks, Voronkov reiterated a threepronged approach to promote the rights of victims of terrorism and better support their financial, legal, medical, and psychosocial needs.

The chair's summary also foresees the launch of the United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism Victims of Terrorism Association Network in 2023, which would bring together victims, victims associations and civil society organizations to further the rights of victims and survivors of terrorism. The Global Congress of Victims of Terrorism is a critical first milestone towards strengthened global solidarity in highlighting the support to victims of terrorism.

In recent months, some high-profile arrests in the area have helped to calm the violence. However, according to the Swedish National Council for Crime Prevention's 2021 report, gun crime in Sweden is increasing faster than anywhere else in Europe. So far this year, 47 people have been killed in shootings across the country, which is more than the entire year of 2021.

"At first they'd shoot just to injure and make people afraid, but now they're shooting to kill," Mr Gunér says. The violence is now spreading beyond troubled suburbs and into other cities: last month, a mother and her five-year-old child were shot at a playground in Eskilstuna's central city, and two people were injured in a shooting at one of Scandinavia's largest shopping malls in Malmö.

As Swedes prepare for Sunday's general election, polls show that crime is one of the top concerns for voters. "[Crime] beats questions relating to the environment and inflation, the economy and the pandemic," says Sten Widmalm, a professor at Uppsala University. "It's affecting ordinary people as well, because some of these shootings have led to innocent bystanders being killed."

JAKARTA: A series of strong inland earthquakes shook Indonesia's easternmost province Saturday, but there were no immediate reports of serious damage or casualties.

The Indonesian Meteorology, Climatology and Geophysics Agency said at least four land-based earthquakes between 6.2 and 5.5 magnitude were centered about 37 kilometers (23 miles) northwest of Central Mamberamo district of West Papua province at a depth up to 16 kilometers (10 miles).

Those earthquakes posed no danger of triggering a tsunami, said Daryono, who heads the Earthquake and Tsunami Mitigation Division. He said the earthquakes were triggered by a thrust in the Memberamo Anjak fault.

There is no report on the impact of damage," said Daryono, who goes by a single name. The U.S. Geological Survey measured the quakes between 6.1 and 5.9 magnitude at a depth of 19 to 33 kilometers (11.8 to 20.5 miles). Variations in early measurements are common

Indonesia is a seismically active archipelago of 270 million people that is frequently struck by earthquakes, volcanic eruptions and tsunamis

In February, a magnitude 6.2 earthquake killed at least 25 people and injured more than 460 in West Sumatra province. In January 2021, a magnitude 6.2 earthquake killed more than 100 people and injured nearly 6,500 in West Sulawesi province. A massive quake off the coast of Aceh in 2004 triggered a powerful tsunami that killed around 230,000 people in a dozen countries.

Two months before Egypt hosts the key COP27 climate summit in Sharm El-Sheikh in November, African ministers made their request in a statement at the conclusion of a three-day session in the Egyptian capital Cairo

The 24 leaders concluded their statement by urging "rich countries to fulfil their pledges in connection to climate and development funding, and deliv-

CAIRO: Twenty African leaders er on their obligations to double adaptation finance, in particular to Africa."

This Monday, former UN chief Ban Ki-moon observed that only 3% of the world's CO2 emissions originate from the African

continent. Despite this, African countries are among those most impacted by climate change, particularly because droughts and floods are getting harsher.

In light of "the disproportionate impact of climate change and environment loss on the African continent," the African leaders claimed that financial assistance was required.

They claimed that Africa not only has a "minimal carbon foot-

print," but also actively participates in absorbing greenhouse gases, particularly in the Congo Basin, which is home to the second-largest tropical rainforest in the world after the Amazon.

According to the communiqué, impoverished nations should be allowed to thrive economically while also receiving greater funding to help them cope with the effects of climate change. It also urged affluent countries to uphold and enhance their climate pledges. In order to protect Africa's growth, the statement emphasized the need to "avoid approaches that induce rapid disinvest-

ments from fossil fuels." At COP27, the role of gas in

the switch to cleaner energy is expected to be a major source of debate. According to climate campaigners, it has to be phased out swiftly and replaced with renewable energy. However, the finance minister of Nigeria, Zainab Ahmed, stated at the Cairo summit that gas was essential for her nation's survival. "We are depriving the population of our countries of the possibilities to accomplish fundamental development if we are not getting properly priced credit to develop gas," she said. The communiqué also recom-

mended that a review of multilateral development banks and



other international financial institutions include a discussion of climate change. It advocated for its negative repercussions.

for the development of a viable sovereign debt hub that would support debt-for-nature swaps and lower capital costs for poor nations.

A major topic at COP27 will be funding to assist less developed nations in reducing their emissions and building their resilience. The industrialized world has long promised to invest \$100 billion year starting in 2020 to support the adaptation efforts of less developed countries. The African Development Bank estimates that between 2020 and 2030, the continent will require up to \$1.6 trillion for internal efforts to slow down climate change and prepare



# World Cup final stadium tested with first sellout crowd

DOHA: The \$675 million stadium that Qatar will use for this year's World Cup final was put through its first sellout test Friday with a match between the Egyptian and Saudi champions.

Seventy-two days from the start of the tournament, organisers said the 80,000 capacity Lusail Iconic Stadium was full for the pre-match concert by Egyptian superstar AmrDiab and the game in which Al Hilal beat Egyptians Zamalek on penalties after a 1-1 draw.

Lusail was the last stadium to be officially inaugurated and Hassan Al-Thawadi, head of the Qatari organising committee, said it was "an emotional moment".

"It is the culmination of a 13-year journey," he told beIN Sports. The stadium, shaped like a traditional Arabic bowl, is at the heart of a new city being built north of the tiny Gulf state's capital. It will host 10 World Cup matches, including the December 18 final.

No more games are planned before the tournament starts on November 20 however. The game was a test run for security, the border immigration system and the multi-billion dollar driverless train metro that will take the strain, ferrying more than one million fans around Doha during the World Cup.

To take pressure off the main international airport, Qatar this week reopened an old airport that had been kept for use by the ruling family and other VIPs. Hundreds of Saudi and Egyptian fans crossed the Abu Samra frontier in buses, after leaving their cars on the Saudi side. All had to apply for a special fan ID, the Hayya card, that all supporters will need to enter Qatar during the World Cup. The processing system in a tent at Abu Samra was being used for the first time. Qatari authorities are expecting thousands of Saudis to support their national team during the tournament. "We entered with just our passport and the Hayya card," said Muhammad Mujahid, an Egyptian living in Saudi Arabia. "It was simple and well-organised."
