ISLAMABAD: The tea imports witnessed an increase of 2.21 percent during the first four months of the current fiscal year as compared to the corresponding month of last year.

The tea imports during July-October (2002-23) were recorded at 8 192.474 million against the imports of \$188.304 million during July-October (2012-22), according to data of Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS). In terms of quantity, the tea imports however decreased by 8.90 percent during the period under review as these went down from \$4.590 metric tons last year to 77,065 metric tons during the same months of current fiscal year, the data revealed.

On year-on-year (YoY) basis, the tea imports surged by 54.09 percent in October 2022 when compared to the imports of the same month of last year. During October 2022, the country imported tea worth \$ 57.272 million as against the exports of \$ 37.169 million last August. APP

#### **UNGA adopts Pakistan**steered resolution on strengthening UN-OIC ties

he United Nations General Assembly Monday adopted by consensus a resolution, introduced by Pakistan, on cooperation with the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC), urging the UN system to enhance collaboration with the Jeddah-based body in areas of mutual interest.

Under the terms of the resolution, "Cooperation be-Under the terms of the resolution, "Cooperation be-tween the United Nations and the Organization of Islam-ic Cooperation", the 193-member Assembly affirmed that the UN and OIC shared a common goal of promot-ing and facilitating the Middle East peace process with the goal to establish a just and comprehensive peace in

It also affirmed that it shared a common objective of fostering peaceful and political solutions to other conflicts in accordance with the Charter of the United Nations and Security Council resolutions.

Introducing the resolution in the 193-member Assembly and the solution of the confliction of t

Introducing the resolution in the 193-member Assembly, Ambassador Munir Akram, speaking in Pakistan's capacity as chair of the OIC member states group in New York, said it highlights the two organizations' desire to work together on shared concerns, including global security, self-determination, respect for territorial integrity, decolonization, and combating terrorism.

The Pakistani envoy said the draft is consistent with the spirit of the resolution which, in 1965, invited the Islamic Organization to participate in the work of the United Nations and its subsidiary organs as an observer. "This year's resolution", he told the General Assembly, contains technical changes, and invites all member states to observe the International Day to Combat Islamophoba in an appropriate manner.

In its operative paragraphs, the draft recognizes the continuing cooperation between the Islamic Organization and United Nations entities, including the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UN-HCR) and the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-Women).

Cooperation between the two has never been more important than in these challenging times, Ambassador

Akram said.

Addressing complex challenges together brings countries and international organizations together.

Ambassador Akram thanked UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres for his constant engagement with OIC and its members, recognizing annual tradition of visiting Muslim communities during the holy month of Ramadan to demonstrate solidarity and exchange views on pressing issues.

"The OIC Group believes that addressing complex challenges requires a coordinated and comprehensive multilateral response that brings countries and international organizations together," the Pakistani envoy added.

hima is already a world leader in the production and sales of electric vehicles, and judging by their popularity, more of these continuous chiefles will be seen on the roads, writes a veteran journalist with China Daily.

the sales of EVs, the Beijing numicipal government has implemented a rule that gas-powered vehicles can be on the road for only six
days a week to ease tradic jams and recluce
carbon emissions but EVs can be driven on
all seven days, any other local governments
inspired by Beijing's con-friendly program,
are offering extra subsidies to EV buyers, ranging from 10,000 yaun (81,405) to 30,000
yaun, which could cover about 20 percent of
the price of an EV.

meto replace my car with a new energy-vehicle.

They say the operating cost is much cheaper. While it costs about 10 US cents for a gas-powered car to travel one kilometer, only about three cents are required for an EV to cover that distance. With oil prices rocketing because of the global energy crisk; it is wise to choose an EV. But despite being popular in China, EVS generally can cover 300-600 km after being charged, not enough for long-distance driving. True, there are EVS that can cover about 800 kilometers after one charge, but that's possible only with more than one fully changed battery, not because of any breakthrough in battery technology.

# Kim's sister warns US of 'a more fatal security crisis'

SEOUL, SOUTH KORRA: The influential sixter of North Korean leader Kim Jong Un warned the United States on Tuesday that it would face "a more fatal security crisis" as Washington pushes for U.N. condemnation of the North's recent intercontinential ballistic missile test.

Kim To Jong's warning came hours are U.S. Ambassador Linda Thomas-Greenfield told an emergency meeting of the U.N. Security Council that the U.S. will circulate a proposed prescribental statement condemning North Korea's banned missile launches and other destabilitying activities. After the meeting, Thomas-Greenfield also read a statement by 14 countries which supported action to limit North Koreas advancement offits weapons programs. Kim Yb Jong, who is widely consid-ered North Koreas second most power-



ful person after her brother, lambast-ed the United States for issuing what she called "a disgusting joint statement together with such rabbies as Britain, France, Australia, Japan and South Korea."

Kim compared the United States to "a barking dog seized with fear." She said North Korea would consider the U.S.-led statement "a wanton violation of our sovereignty and a grave political provocation."

"The U.S. should be mindful that no matter how desperately it may seek to disarm (North Korea), it can never deprive (North Korea) of its right to self-defense and that the more hell-bent it gets on the anti-(North Korea) acts, it will face a more fatal security crisis," she said in a statement carried by state media.

During the Security Council meeting. During the Security Council meeting, the United States and its allies strongly criticized the ICBM launch and called for action to limit North Korea's nucle-ar and missile programs. But Russia and China, both veto-wielding members of the Security

veto-weldting members of the Security Council, opposed any new pressure and sanctions on North Korea. In May, the two countries vetoed a U.S.-led attempt to toughen sanctions on North Korea over its earlier ballistic missile tests, which are prohibited by U.N. Security Council resolutions.

Overnight a hospital parking lot in Cianjur was inundated with victims, some treated in makeshift tents, others hooked up to intravenous drips on the pavement, while medical workers stitched up patients under the light of torches. "Everything collapsed beneath this child," Cucu, a 48-year-old resident, told Reuters, from the crowded hospital parking area. "Two of my kids survived, I dug them up ... #### Messi seeks history with Argentina



DOHA, QATAR: Lionel Messi returns to the World Cup for a fifth attempt at finally winning soccer's biggest prize. He'll also be hoping to make history with Argentina.

The Argentines are among the favorites to win in Qatar and victorywould fill the one gaping hole in his resume. But a win or a draw Tuesday against Saudi Arabia, one of the weakest teams in the tournament, would give Argentina a record-tying result. Argentina arrived in Qutar on a 36-match unboaten streak, one sky of tying Italy's record in international men's soccer, set from 2018-21. Argentina has not lost since falling to Brazil 2-0 in the 2019 Copa América. Argentina first won the World Cup in 1978, and then again in 1986 — one year before Messi was born. The team reached the final in 2014 and lost to Germany, and in a bitter follow-up four years later was eliminated in the round of 16 in Russia.

Messi, meanwhile, is one of four players making their fifth World Cup appearance. He Joins Portugal forward Cristiano Romaldo, and Mexico teamnates Guillermo Ochoa and Andrés Guardado.

Saudi Arabia was eliminated in the first round in 2018, opening with a 5-0 loss to host Russi. In a tough froup C that includes Mexico and Poland, the Saudis will be trying to advance out of the group stage for only the second time, after 1994. The team has won two of its last 10 matches.

Defending oleampion France opens play Tuesday against Australia in a rematch from four years ago. France won 2-1 in Russia when Paul Poglas shot in the 81st minute deflected in off a defender for an own-goal. Poglas is not in the squaf following knees ungery, and France is also down another two stars with NYGolo Kante and Karim Benzema sidelined. France does expect defender Raphael Varane to play following a hamstring injury he picked up in October. Kyliam Mbappé is ready to lead France to back-to-back titles. He was only 19 when he scored in the final and helped France wint the World Cup four years ago. With 28 international goals, Mbappé wants to add to his count in the Group D opener.

# Qatar first World Cup hosts to lose opener with Ecuador defeat

DOHA: Qatar became the first home team to lose their opening World Cup match as Ecuador cruised to a 2-0 victory over the hosts, with Enner Valencia scoring twice in the tournament curtain-raiser on Sunday.

Asian champions Qatar enjoyed the backing of the majority of the crowd at the 60,000-capacity Al Bayt Stadium, but could not follow a glitzy opening ceremony with a statement performance.

Ecuador thought they had made a dream start when they silenced the home fans as Valencia headed in, only for the goal to be ruled out by VAR for an offside in the build-up.

Valencia did break the dead- out in the first round.

Valencia did break the dead-lock with a penalty in the 16th minute and doubled his tally just after the half-hour mark. Qatar improved slightly in the second period, but by the end of the 90 minutes, the excitement which greeted the build-up — featuring Morgan Freeman and BTS star Jung Kook — was a distant memory as thousands of fans left early amid a deflated atmosphere. Pelix Sanchez's Qatar will like-ly need a positive result in their second Group A match against Senegal on Friday just to avoid the ignominy of becoming oily the second hosts, after South Africa in 2010, to be dumped

out in the first round.
Hopes were high among the crowd that Gatar could make a winning start, but the deficiencies of the World Cup debutants were ruthlessly exposed by an impressive Ecuador.
Qatar failed to even muster a shot on target in the game, with spectators filling out of the stands long before the final whistle.
In the 92-year history of the tournament, home countries had previously won 16 and drawn six of their opening matches.
The South Americans had the ball in the net inside three minutes when captain Valencia nodded home from Felix Torres' miscued overhead kick.

VAR officials spotted an offside against Michael Estrada in the build-up after Forres challenged for the ball with Qatar goalkeeper Saad Al Sheeb. Ecuador were completely dominant in the early exchanges, though, and were awarded a penalty after Valencia was tripped by Al Sheeb when through on goal. The former West Ham forward coolly sent Al Sheeb the wrong way from the spot and stroked the ball into the bottom corner to score his 36th interna-
