Lasting solution to J&K dispute possible only in accordance with UNSC resolutions: President

ISLAMABAD: President Dr Arif Alvi has said that Pakistan consistently maintained that a lasting solution to the Jammu and Kashmir dispute was possible only in accordance with the relevant UN Security Council Resolutions and wishes of the Kashmiri people.

"Pakistan also urges the international community and organizations to take practical steps to hold India accountable for its gross and widespread human rights violations in

IIOJK," the president said in a message on the occasion of Kashmir Solidarity Day being observed on February 5.

"We observe this day to draw the attention of the international community towards the relevant UN Security Council Resolutions which provide that the final disposition of the Jammu and Kashmir Dispute would be made in accordance with the will of the people, expressed through the democratic method of a free and impartial plebiscite conducted under the auspices of the United Nations," he stressed.

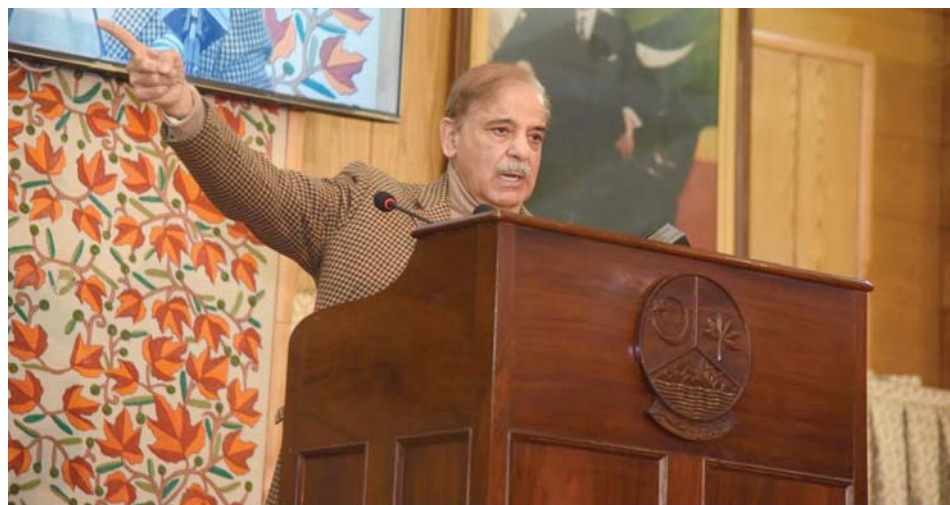
PM Shehbaz Sharif for unity to infuse vigour, strength to Kashmir cause

MUZAFFARABAD: Prime Minister (PM) Shehbaz Sharif on Sunday stressed the forging of unity and solidarity by shunning all the political differences which would further infuse vigour and strength into the Kashmir cause.

Addressing a special session of Azad Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly (AJKL) on the occasion of 'Kashmir Solidarity Day', the prime minister said Founder of Pakistan Quaid-e-Azam Muhammad Ali Jinnah had declared Kashmir as 'a jugular vein of Pakistan'.

The prime minister said that divisions were apparent in the society which was regrettable, but in Muzaffarabad, AJK and Pakistan, all the political parties, their leadership and the assem-



blly members were in unison which reflected the national unity, harmony and solidarity that certainly perturbed

India. "When a society moves with unity, its goals are achieved, giving it further power and strength," he observed.

The prime minister said that the entire 220 million Pakistani nation and the Kashmiris, on the day, gave a clear message of

national unity.

In Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir (IIOJK), for the last 75 years, he said, the blood of innocent Kashmiris was split mercilessly.

The prime minister referred to one of the gory incidents in IIOJK in which a little kid was seen sitting on the chest of his slain grandfather with melancholic looks.

The whole world witnessed the heart-wrenching spectacle, he said, adding thousands of Kashmiri Muslims had been subjected to cruelties and brutalities unleashed by Indian occupation forces while thousands were martyred. He recalled that during 2019, Prime Minister Modi had deprived the IIOJK of its special status, turning the whole occupied valley into an open jail.

Maryam Nawaz blames Imran Khan for inflation in Pakistan

MULTAN: Pakistan Muslim League Nawaz (PML-N) Senior Vice President and Chief Organiser Maryam Nawaz has blamed Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) chief and former premier Imran Khan for skyrocketing inflation in the country due to his agreement with the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

Maryam Nawaz, while addressing PML-N Workers Convention in Multan today, said today is Kashmir Solidarity Day and Kashmir will become part of Pakistan one day. She saluted the Kashmiris and their martyrs for the struggle for self-determination.

She later blamed PTI chief Imran Khan for the inflation due to his agreement with the IMF. "She knew the difficulties being faced by the nationals due to the skyrocketing inflation as the prices of essential commodities and fuel products have been increased across the country.

Former president and army chief Pervez Musharraf passes away in Dubai

DUBAI / ISLAMABAD: Former army chief and president retired general Pervez Musharraf passed away at a private hospital in Dubai. He was 79.

The former general had been admitted to the American Hospital, Dubai. Musharraf was admitted to Dubai hospitals more than once in the past. He had been facing prolonged battle with the rare disease amyloidosis.

The former military ruler was hospitalized for three weeks in June last year. "Going through a difficult stage where recovery is not possible and organs are malfunctioning. Pray for ease in his daily living," his family said at the time in a statement via Musharraf's official Twitter account.

The family had issued the statement after the



news of his demise had started circulating on social media after some Pakistani and Indian publications carried it.

On Sunday, Musharraf's family has filed an application in the Pakistani consulate in Dubai to shift the former military leader's body to Pakistan.

A special jet will fly to Dubai from Nur Khan Airbase to bring Musharraf's mortal remains back to Pakistan.

Politicians and others have expressed their profound grief over the

demise of Gen Musharraf. PTI leader Ch Fawad Hussain in a tweet uttered positive words about the departed soul, saying Pervez Musharraf himself was a great man, but his friends turned to be cheap.

Reacting to the news, Inter-Services Public Relations (ISPR) said that the Chairman Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee (JCSC) General Sahir Shamshad, and tri-services chiefs expressed heartfelt condolences on the former army chief's demise. "JCSC and services

chiefs express heartfelt condolences on the sad demise of General Pervez Musharraf, former president, CJCS and chief of army staff. May Allah bless the departed soul and give strength to the bereaved family," the military's media wing said.

PML-Q leaders Ch Parvez Elahi and Ch Moonis Elahi also expressed their deep sense of shock over the demise, saying the services of Gen Musharraf for the army and Pakistan would always be remembered.

In a series of tweets, Senate Chairman Sadiq Sanjrani expressed deep sorrow over the former president's death and extended condolences to the grieving family.

"May God grant the deceased a high rank and give patience to the family," he added.

Rana Sanaullah warns PTI of consequences over 'Jail Bharo' movement

IMF softens stance on Kisan Package, Balochistan tube wells subsidies

ISLAMABAD: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has softened its stance over subsidy in 'Kisan Package' and Balochistan tube wells in energy sector, citing sources ARY News reported on Sunday.

According to sources, the IMF also prepared to keep subsidy for Azad Kashmir intact.

Sources said that the energy subsidy to exporters will be removed. "There are differences with the IMF over tax revenue shortfall," according to sources.

"IMF deems taxes shortfall upto 840 billion rupees, while



Pakistani officials keeping taxes deficiency between 400 to 450 billion rupees," sources said. "Pakistan has floated steps to address this shortfall of taxes," finance ministry officials further said.

"Development budget and other expenditures are likely to

be slashed," sources said. "International Monetary Fund has also suggested hike in GST from 17 to 18 percent, while tax will also be imposed on banks profit and the flood levy," sources said.

The sides have also been in talks over removing relief in

the GST and the income tax, according to sources.

"The matters with the IMF will be decided by May 09, while dialogue over the medium-term budgetary framework with the lender will begin from Feb. 07".

The IMF has demanded hike in tax over luxury items, there are proposals to increase tax over cigarettes and drinks. A proposal also being considered about imposing federal excise duty over air tickets and enhancing 50 paisa per stick excise duty on expensive cigarettes.

The monetary fund has also demanded restricting the state interference in the economy by

privatization as well as it insisted for regular audit in government departments.

To meet another condition of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), the federal government has made it mandatory for all government officials of grade 17 and above to declare their assets.

A notification to this effect was also issued by the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR).

According to the notification, the government has also asked public servants to submit details of their overseas assets. "All 17 to 22 Grade officers have to provide all information before opening a bank account," the notification read.

Fawad fires a broadside at Sanaullah

Speaking to media, Mr Chaudhry schooled Mr Sanaullah, saying, "When Mr Sanaullah felt proud to talk about opening bullets on the PTI workers, there remains no difference between him and the Indian interior minister."

Citing the Mongols and Nadir Shah to take a jibe at the Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM) bigwigs, Mr Chaudhry said, "Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif, Nawaz Sharif, and Asif Ali Zardari have nothing to do for the sake of the country."

Profile of General Pervez Musharraf

ISLAMABAD: Pervez Musharraf was born on August 11, 1943 in New Delhi, India. He who took power in a coup in 1999 and also served as president of Pakistan from 2001 to 2008.

Musharraf moved with his family from New Delhi to Karachi in 1947, when Pakistan was carved out as an independent country. The son of a career diplomat, he lived in Turkey during 1949-56. He joined the army in 1964, graduated from the Army Command and Staff College in Quetta, and attended the Royal College of Defence Studies in London.

The former army chief held a number of appointments in the artillery, the infantry, and commando units and also taught at the Staff College in Quetta and in the War Wing of the National Defence College.

He fought in Pakistan's 1965 and 1971 wars with India. The then Prime Minister



Nawaz Sharif appointed Gen Musharraf head of the armed forces in October 1998.

On October 12, 1999, while Musharraf was out of the country, Sharif dismissed him and tried to prevent the plane carrying Musharraf home from landing at the Karachi airport. The armed forces, however, took control of the airport and other government installations and deposed Sharif, paving the way

for Musharraf to become head of a military government.

Although he was generally considered to hold moderate views and promised an eventual return to civilian rule, Musharraf suspended the constitution and dissolved parliament. He formed the National Security Council, made up of civilian and military appointees, to run Pakistan in the interim.

In early 2001 he assumed the presidency and later attempted to negotiate an agreement with India over the Kashmir region. Following the September 11 attacks in 2001 in the United States and the subsequent US invasion of Afghanistan later that year, the US government cultivated close ties with Musharraf in an attempt to root out Islamic extremists in the Afghan-Pakistan border region. Following a movement led by the political parties, Musharraf resigned as the president on August 18, 2008.

On March 30, 2014, Musharraf was indicted for suspending the Constitution on November 3, 2007. On December 17, 2019, a special court handed Musharraf death sentence in the high treason case against him.

The former military ruler left the country in March 2016 for Dubai to seek medical treatment and didn't return to Pakistan since.

He welcomed Dr. Faisal Sultan and appreciated his successful corona management strategy. He said that various policies were adopted to contain the spread

of pandemic in different regions and countries but the policy introduced in Pakistan was declared best and all its credit goes to Dr. Faisal Sultan.

He said that every individual in Pakistan has experienced to remain in touch directly and indirectly with the SKH and many of them may have some reservations. Dr. Khurram Tariq said that Pakistan has 180,000 patients every year, out of which 45-50 thousand visits SKH. Most of the relatives of these patients complain that their patient was not properly handled and treated. Clarifying the situation, he said that it is a matter of capacity as SKH could entertain 12-15 thousand patients which are only ten percent of the total cancer patients. He said that as per

policy of the hospital the curable patients are given priority.

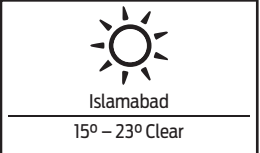
Moreover, the capacity of the hospital is also being enhanced as with the increase in average age, the number of cancer patients was also increasing. He appreciated the disciplined culture introduced in this hospital and said that the people tried to visit their patients during odd hours by greasing the palm of the ward-boys but they failed due to the strict administration of the hospital.

He highlighted yet another appreciable aspect of the hospital and said that if two patients are housed in a room. "One of them is fully paid and the other is free, but both are getting the same treatment without any discrimination", he said and

added that hospital administration fully takes care of this critical situation and believes that the ego of the poor patients getting free treatment in the SKH should not be hurt at any cost.

He also appreciated the professionalism in hospital administration and said that all doctors are equally competent and in the absence of one doctor, the other attend the patient with the same devotion and zeal. "The patients are not recognized with reference to a specific doctor but they all are the patients of the hospital", he added. Dr. Khurram appreciated the admission strategy of the hospital and said that it is encouraging that since 2016, one patient from Faisalabad is admitted in the SKH every month.

Speaking to the workers of CPEC projects in Port Qasim and Thar, Senator Mushahid Hussain termed CPEC as 'single most transformative initiative for economic development in the last 30 years, as it provided a basis for energy security, employment, and changing lives and livelihoods of the people of Pakistan'.

Senator Mushahid Hussain said that Pakistan's huge natural resources, including mineral wealth, natural gas and maritime wealth need to be exploited for the blue economy. Thar alone has 175 billion tons of coal reserves, more than the oil reserves of Iran and Saudi Arabia put together.

Thanks to CPEC, this 'black gold' is now contributing to the national economy.

"The natural gas reserves in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa are several times higher than these reserves in Sui," the Senator added, "if we truly exploit and utilise our mineral wealth, natural gas, and offshore blue economy, cumulatively worth almost a trillion dollars, Pakistan can bid goodbye to the IMF handouts, which we have received for 23 times, without bringing about quality change. He urged the need to change national economic priorities instead of policies that undermine national sovereignty and people's dignity.

The delegation was led by Senator Mushahid Hussain Syed. During the 3-day visit, the delegation first visited the Power China project at Port Qasim, which generates 1320 megawatts of electricity. Power China CEO Guo welcomed the delegation and briefed them on the project.

The Port Qasim power plant, an early harvest project of CPEC, provides electricity to over 4 million homes through clean energy, and it emits environment-friendly white smoke, using supercritical technology. The project has generated jobs, provided revenue to Pakistan worth over \$ 600 million in taxes and duties,

and contributed to resolving Pakistan's chronic energy shortage.

Then on day two of the Sind CPEC projects tour, the delegation flew to Thar where it first toured the Sindh Electric Coal Mining Company (SECMC), which is a joint private-public partnership with support of the Sindh government and China, witnessing the driving of dumper trucks by Thari women, in a living example of Women's empowerment.

The delegation also visited the newly established 1320 megawatts power plant established with investment from Shanghai Electric. China's total investment has been \$ 26 billion, generating 85,000 jobs, including 12,000 in Thar, plus 28,000 Pakistani students now study in China, resulting in a huge socio-economic transformation of the country, thanks to CPEC.

Over 5000 megawatts of electricity have been added to the national grid and some 700 kilometres of road infrastructure have knit the Federation of Pakistan closer together facilitating easier and faster travel.

Parliamentarians belonging to different political parties lauded CPEC as a guarantor of a better tomorrow for Pakistan and thanked China, as a trusted 'all weather friend', for reposing

such confidence in the future of Pakistan by investing in CPEC projects in Pakistan.

They also lauded the role of these companies in promoting people-centric development through Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR).

The parliamentary delegation included Mahesh Mailani, MNA, Minister of State for Health, Senator Dr Zaqra Suhrawardy, Qaiser Sheikh, MNA, Chairman of National Assembly Finance Committee, Senator Qurratul Ain Marri, Muhammad Abubakar, MNA, Chairman of NA Parliamentary Affairs Committee and Senator Muhammad Akram Baloch.

"It was an eye-opening experience to see the impact of CPEC on the local communities and the progress being made on these projects," stated Senator Qurratul Ain Marri.

Dr. Mahesh Kumar Melani, Minister of State for Health, added, "The visit gave us a deeper understanding of the benefits and opportunities created by CPEC for the people of Pakistan. The projects are transforming lives and providing a brighter future for all."

J. Salik said the UN should ensure distribution of its documents in Bangla, Turkish, Korean and Swahili as these languages were also spoken by millions of people around the globe.

Referring to his principle demand, he said the UN should realise that Urdu language is widely understood and spoken in the South Asia region and due to rising Indian, Pakistani, Bengali, Sri Lankan and Nepali diaspora in the Middle East it is understandable among a large number of people.

He added that Pakistan is the only country in the world that has been created by the minorities of the subcontinent against the majority Hindus. The flag of Pakistan is also custodian of equal minorities rights and representation in the country, he added.

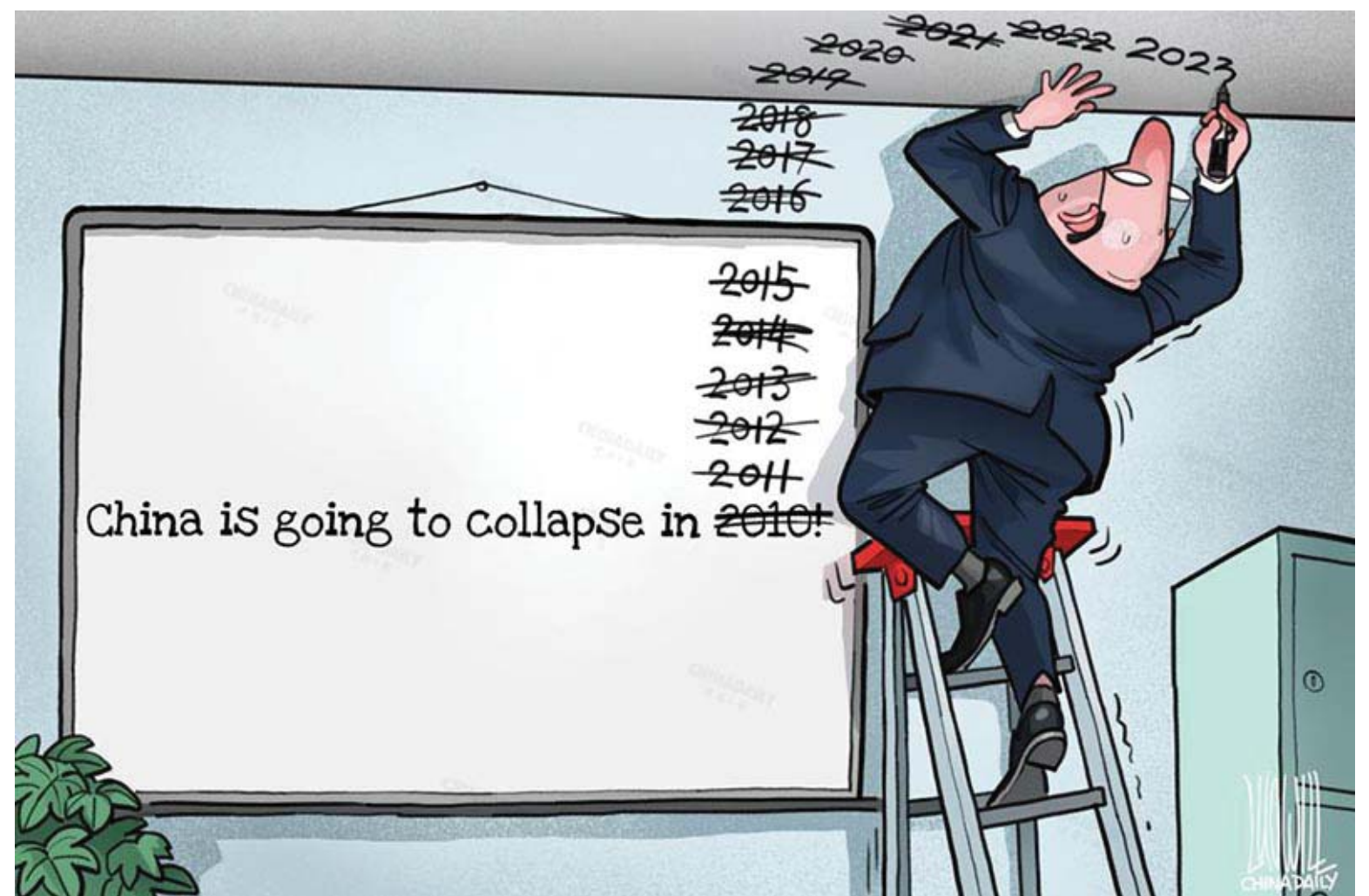

Adani's \$108 billion crisis shakes investors' faith in India

A short seller attack on the Adani conglomerate raises bigger, darker questions about India's credibility as a destination for global investors.

Just 10 days ago, Gautam Adani and his sprawling energy-to-ports empire looked invincible. Now, a damning short-seller attack has left the billionaire battling the worst crisis of his corporate life — and is raising bigger, darker questions about India's credibility as a global growth engine and a destination for international investors.

According to an article published on Bloomberg website, the Adani Group has shed \$108 billion in market value since Hindenburg Research accused it of stock manipulation and accounting fraud in a Jan. 24 report. But it was only when the tycoon scrapped a \$2.4 billion share sale this week that the potential for lasting impact became clear. Adani's rebuttal had failed to reassure investors. Once ranked No. 2 among the world's wealthiest, he has tumbled to No. 21 on the Bloomberg Billionaires Index.

The small, but famed, US short seller has revived old doubts about corporate governance at the Adani conglomerate. The fall-out from its almost 100-page report threatens to undermine investor confidence in India more broadly, and in the nation's regulatory framework — whether its claims ultimately prove to be true or not.

"Things are moving very fast in the market, with a potentially major reassessment of the risks of investing in Indian equities by international investors," said Singapore-based Gary Dugan, chief executive officer

of Global CIO Office, an asset manager and financial advisory firm. "That reassessment includes governance, corporate transparency, nepotism and indebtedness."

Adani, 60, has been close to Prime Minister Narendra Modi for decades. And his business — with investments in capital-intensive projects such as airports, power plants and data centers — is at the heart of Modi's growth agenda. As a national champion, the tycoon has aligned his business interests with Modi's development goals, often stepping in where the state lacks resources or competence, helping create thousands of jobs.

The turmoil has not only hammered Adani Group shares but is also hitting banks that have given loans to the companies. Government-controlled State Bank of India has tumbled 11% since the Hindenburg report came out. Foreign institutional investors pulled a net \$2 billion out of India's stock market from Jan. 27 through Jan. 31, the biggest three-day sell off since March, according to data compiled by Bloomberg.

"The Adani-related headlines are generating a high level of negative attention, which could dampen investor appetite for Indian stocks," said Jian Shi Cortesi, a fund manager at Zurich-based GAM Investments, which oversees more than \$80 billion in assets. "While we don't see Adani dragging down the whole Indian stock market, we think this could lead to India underperforming other Asian markets such as China."

However, some veteran emerging-market investors like Mark Mobius remain unfazed by the meltdown and dismissed chances of a broader contagion.

"This does not reflect the overall viability of the Indian market and economy," said Mobius, co-founder of Mobius Capital Part-

ners LLP. "We don't make decisions based on the index but on the viability of individual companies over the long term."

Hugh Young, Asia chairman of abrdn Plc, which managed more than \$600 billion in assets as of June, said his fund is waiting to dive in after the declines.

But it's apparent even to casual observers that the declining fortunes of the Adani empire has the potential to shake the fundamentals of the Indian economy in a way few other corporate crises can. In fact, Adani's key line of defense is to braid together the fate of his conglomerate with that of Asia's third-largest economy.

For years, Adani companies have delivered the sort of infrastructure projects India has needed. His integrated businesses touch hundreds of millions of Indians each day, from the chain of ports that deliver coal from Adani mines to company power plants running electricity to households through his transmission units.

Along with developing more than 3,100 miles of the country's road network, Adani Group is the largest private operator of India's sea and airports, controlling 33% of Indian air cargo traffic and 24% of its shipping capacity, according to company presentations. The conglomerate plans to plow some \$70 billion into renewable energy projects that are key to Modi achieving India's Net Zero goals.

The group's expansion has been fueled by leverage, with net debt at about 1.6 trillion rupees (\$19.7 billion) — another concern that's been dogging investors. The conglomerate has no dollar debt maturing until 2024. In a sign its debt servicing capacity in the near term looked safe, an Adani unit made a payment for scheduled coupons Thursday.

Kashmir is a matter of self-determination

Mr. Antonio Guterres, the Secretary General of the United Nations has called for renewed commitment to forge an "alliance of peace" amid a surge in hate speech, sectarianism, and strife. The Secretary General has further said that "The declaration 'Human Fraternity for World Peace and Living Together' - co-authored by His Holiness Pope Francis and His Eminence the Grand Imam of Al-Azhar Sheikh Ahmed El Tayeb - is a model for inter-faith harmony and human solidarity. Let us all take inspiration and renew our commitment to stand together as one human family."

President Joe Biden gave a message of hope to the whole world when he said on the occasion of 'International Day of Human Fraternity': "We have the opportunity to build a better world that upholds universal human



rights, lifts every human being, and advances peace and security for all."

It was on December 21, 2020, that the United Nations General Assembly passed a resolution 75/200 and unanimously proclaimed February 4 as 'the International Day of Human Fraternity'.

Dr. Ghulam Nabi Fai, Chairman, 'World Forum for Peace & Justice', said, "I am so proud to be an American and a Muslim from Kashmir. Because the Valley of Kashmir, where I come from, has remained the symbol of communal harmony and tolerance for centuries. Kashmir has been hailed as the land of saints. Its culture celebrates diversity, and it has been the confluence of a rich mixture

of philosophies and ways of life that merge without losing their distinct identities.

Dr. Fai asked, can anyone deny the fact - of no small significance - that while the Subcontinent under British rule was the scene of recurrent murderous strife, communal riots were unheard of in Kashmir? That unquestionable fact brings out the real character of Kashmir's heritage. A person no less important than Mahatma Gandhi, the father of the nation of India, has eloquently elucidated those sentiments in August 1947 in these words, "...It is really difficult for me to distinguish between a Hindu Kashmiri and a Muslim Kashmiri. You people speak one language and have one culture. While the rest of the country

burns in communal fire, I see a ray of hope in Kashmir only..."

India today, in 2023, needs Mahatma Gandhi more than ever who could take a larger view of matters and frame a constructive course of action, both humane and imaginative. The present Indian leadership of Narendra Modi is wholly absorbed in pretty political concerns. The Modi government has particularly failingly tried to equate Kashmiri people with fundamentalism. The term fundamentalism, Dr. Fai clarified, is quite inapplicable to Kashmiri society. A hallmark of Kashmir has been its long tradition of tolerance, amity, and good will across religious and cultural boundaries. It has a long tradition of moderation and non-violence. Its culture does not generate extremism or fundamentalism.

Fai added that the five religious groups of Kashmir - Buddhists, Sikhs, Hindus, Muslims and a tiny minority of Christians - have for centuries flourished in harmony and mutual bond: no religious ghettos; no religious apartheid; no economic or sharp cultural divides. All religious persuasions rejoiced at each other's holidays and times of joy, attended social gatherings together, lived as neighbors in harmony, and treasured their mutual trust. The various faiths of Kashmir eschew fanatical or extremist dogmas that distort and debase their doctrinal origins. Tolerance and mutual respect are their watchwords.

Dr. Fai cited two recent shining examples of tolerance, communal harmony, and open-mindedness in Kashmir, although there are hundreds of such instances. India's leading weekly 'India Today' reported on May 14, 2022, that 'Muslims helped in performing the last rites of a Kashmiri Pandit woman in Kulgam in a great show of solidarity amid heightened tensions in Kashmir.' And 'Kashmir Life Magazine' reported on September 2, 2022, that 'In a classic act of communal harmony and amity, members of Muslim community Friday performed the last rites of an elderly Pandit woman in Pargochi village in south Kashmir's Shopian district.

KARACHI: The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has asked the federal government to minimize the losses of Pakistan International Airlines (PIA), ARY News reported on Saturday, quoting sources.

The IMF mission is in Pakistan for the talks on the 9th review of the stalled loan programme.

The fund has directed the federal government to devise a strategy to lower the losses being faced by the PIA as the overall losses reach Rs400 billion.

The IMF has also sought a plan from Islamabad for making the PIA, a profitable organization, the sources privy to the development said.

Earlier in the day, it emerged that the International Monetary Fund (IMF) expressed concern over fiscal indiscipline and mismanagement in government departments.

According to sources, the global lender has expressed dissatisfaction over persistent deficit in state-owned entities.

"There is lack of improvement in electricity and gas transmission losses," IMF pointed out. "Pakistan continuously bearing losses in the energy sector," IMF delegation observed. "It insisted for privatization of the state entities bearing losses," sources said.

The monetary fund has also demanded restricting the state interference in the economy by privatization as well as it is insisting on regular audit in government departments, according to sources.

Saudi minister warns sanctions, underinvestment may cause energy shortages

DUBAI : Saudi Energy Minister Prince Abdulaziz bin Salman warned on Saturday that sanctions and underinvestment in the energy sector could result in a shortage of energy supplies.

The European Union has imposed a series of sanctions against Russia, reducing Russian energy exports, and other Western powers have also imposed measures as they seek to further limit Moscow's ability to fund its war in Ukraine.

In response to a question on how the sanctions environment would affect the energy market, bin Salman told an industry conference in Riyadh: "All of those so-called sanctions, embargoes, lack of investments, they will convolute into one thing and one thing only, a lack of energy supplies of all kinds when they are most needed".

The prince did not specifically mention Russia in his remarks. He said Saudi Arabia was working to send Ukraine liquefied petroleum gas (LPG), which is most commonly used as a cooking fuel and in heating.

Asked what lessons had been learnt from energy market dynamics in 2022, Prince Abdulaziz said the most important one was for the rest of the world to "trust OPEC+".

"We are a responsible group of countries, we do take policy issues relevant to energy and oil markets in a total silo and we don't engage ourselves in political issues," the prince said.

The minister said he remains cautious on any increase in production.

Japan needs stable, sustained inflation, government executive says

TOKYO: Japanese Deputy Chief Cabinet Secretary Seiji Kihara on Sunday stressed the need to achieve an economy where inflation rises stably and sustainably, when asked whether the next central bank governor should maintain ultra-easy monetary policy.

"What's important is to create economic conditions where prices rise stably and sustainably," Kihara told a television programme.

"As for the next BOJ governor, the prime minister will choose who he thinks is the most appropriate person," he said. "It's important for monetary, and the broader macro-economic policy, to be stable".

Kihara also said the government was ready to "respond flexibly as needed," when asked whether additional steps could be taken to cushion the economic blow from rising fuel and raw material costs.

"The priority now is to raise wages. Achieving wage hikes is the best growth strategy for us," he added.

Prime Minister Fumio Kishida's administration has offered subsidies to curb utility and gasoline bills, and prodded firms to hike wages, as it saw approval ratings hit by rising fuel and food prices.

Sri Lanka completing pre-requisites for IMF aid

ISLAMABAD: Sri Lanka is completing the pre-requisites to unlock a \$2.9 billion bailout from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) and expects rapid approval from the global lender, President Ranil Wickremesinghe said on Saturday.

"We are successfully completing the difficult stage required to get support from the International Monetary Fund. We expect to get their consent without delay," Wickremesinghe said in his address to the nation to mark the 75th Independence Day.

Sri Lanka, caught in the worst financial crisis since independence from Britain in 1948 triggered by a severe shortage of dollars, has seen steep inflation, a currency plunge and its economy slide into recession.

The island of 22 million people has also been hit by high taxes, a shortage of essential items such as medicine and fuel, and daily power cuts.

Wickremesinghe, who took over after his predecessor fled the country and resigned last year after thousands of protesters occupied his office and residence, has pledged to put the economy back on track but warned



it will be an uphill task. "I know that many of the decisions I have been compelled to take since assuming the presidency have been unpopular I will continue this new reform program with the majority of people who love this country," he added.

Sri Lanka is currently focused on getting

financing assurances from key bilateral creditors China and Japan. India, the third major creditor, agreed to support debt restructuring last month.

Sri Lanka's central bank estimates an economic turnaround in the second half of 2023 and inflation to reach single digits by the end of this year.

Nestle to hike food prices further in 2023, CEO says

ISLAMABAD: Nestle will have to raise prices of its food products further this year to offset higher production costs that it has yet to fully pass on to consumers, Chief Executive Mark Schneider told a German newspaper.

The increases will not be as steep as they were in 2022, but "we have some catching up to do over the full year," Schneider was quoted as telling Frankfurt-

er Allgemeine Zeitung in an interview due for publication on Sunday.

In the first nine months of 2022, the world's biggest food group, which makes KitKat chocolate bars and Nescafe reported organic sales growth of 8.5%, of which price rises accounted for 7.5 percentage points.

Inflation in many developed economies has been running at multi-decade highs, driven in large part by increases in prices of food and energy.

Over 66,000 Kg hoarded flour recovered in raids

RAWALPINDI: The Punjab Food department in a crackdown against hoarders on Saturday recovered over 66,000 kgs of hoarded flour in different raids in Rawalpindi, Punjab.

In order to provide relief to the citizens, the food department is monitoring the stocks by its tracking system.

As per details, the deputy director food department in different raids on godowns in Rawalpindi recovered over 66,000 kgs of hoarded wheat flour.

Cases have been regis-

tered against six people and sealed a flour mill. The recovered wheat flour will be provided to the masses at the government's fixed rate, the deputy director said.

Earlier, the Punjab food department decided to check the flour mills' record amid the intense wheat shortage.

As per details, the food department asked for three months' records from flour dealers and shopkeepers.

The officials asked if the flour which is provided by the government to flour mills, reaches the shops, as many shopkeepers complain about the shortage.

Indian refiners pay traders in dirhams for Russian oil

NEW DELHI : Indian refiners have begun paying for most of their Russian oil purchased via Dubai-based traders in United Arab Emirates dirhams instead of U.S. dollars, four sources with knowledge of the matter said.

While Western sanctions against Moscow are not recognised by India, and purchases of Russian oil may in any case not violate them, banks and financial institutions are cautious about clearing payments so as not to unwittingly fall foul of the many measures imposed against Russia following its invasion of Ukraine.

Indian refiners and traders are concerned they may not be able to continue to settle trades in dollars, especially if the price of Russian crude rises above a cap imposed by the Group of Seven nations and Australia in December.

That has led traders to seek alternative methods of payment, which could also aid Russia's efforts to de-dollarise its economy in response to the Western sanctions.

Previous attempts by Indian refiners to pay traders for Russian crude in dirhams through Dubai banks failed, forcing them to switch back to the U.S. currency.

But India's top bank, the State Bank of India (SBI), is now clearing these dirham payments, the sources told Reuters, providing details of transactions that have not previously been reported.

The SBI, which has overseas branches including in the United States, did not respond to requests for comment.

The G7 price cap prohibits any Western company, such as the insurance and shipping service providers that underpin much of global trade, from involvement in trading Russian crude if the purchase price is above \$60 a barrel at the loading point in Russia. That remains the case even if the oil is bound for countries such as China and India which do not recognise the cap.

The shift to dirham payments was also triggered by the SBI asking refiners looking to make dollar payments for Russian crude to provide a breakdown of the costs of the oil, freight and insurance, allowing it to vet trade and avoid violating the cap.

"The SBI is very conservative in its approach," one of the sources said, even though India does not follow the price cap mechanism and Western insurance and shipping are not used for delivery.



Indian refiners typically buy Russian crude from traders at a price that includes delivery to India.

An invoice for such a deal seen by Reuters showed traders asking for an average crude price including freight for Urals crude. The document calculated the price of the cargo in dollars and dirhams.

The four sources said Indian refiners are buying Russian oil on a delivered basis to mitigate any risks arising during shipping, and so far the calculated cost at the point of loading

has been below the price cap.

Indian refiners mostly buy Russian crude from Dubai-based traders including Everest Energy and Litasco, a unit of Russian oil major Lukoil (LKO.HK).

Everest Energy and Litasco did not respond to requests for comment.

India's oil secretary Pankaj Jain last month said Indian companies were not facing any problems in paying for Russian oil as the latest actions by the West do not impact the trade settlement mechanism.

Amir, Shaheen, Wahab and Wasim on fast bowlers in HBL PSL

LAHORE: The HBL Pakistan Super League has been synonymous with high-quality fast bowling since its inception in 2016. A distinct feature of the league has been the domination of pacers with four of the five leading wicket-takers in the tournament's history being fast bowlers.

Feeding into the depth of Pakistan's pace bowling arsenal, the HBL PSL has produced some talented quicks including Haris Rauf, Hasan Ali, Muhammad Hasnain, Muhammad Wasim Jnr, Naseem Shah, Shaheen Shah Afridi and Shah Nawaz Dahani who have made a mark on the international stage.

PCB Digital spoke with Muhammad Amir, Muhammad Wasim, Shaheen Shah Afridi and Wahab Riaz, as the fast bowlers discussed the mantra to success in T20 cricket, the bowling tactics deployed for different stages of an innings and the impact of HBL PSL on Pakistan's fast bowling landscape. These interviews are available at the HBL PSL YouTube Channel.

Muhammad Amir – Karachi Kings
A longtime member of the Karachi

Kings outfit, Amir was the first player to take a hat-trick in HBL PSL when he dismissed Lahore Qalandars' Dwayne Bravo, Zohaib Khan and Kevon Cooper on successive balls in Dubai in 2016. He has taken 54 wickets and also bowled six maiden overs in his 59-match HBL PSL career, most for any bowler in the tournament.

"In T20 cricket, you have to understand what the pitch demands from you as a bowler. You do not worry about which batters are on strike, but instead assess what the wicket requires you to do.

"If there is swing on offer, I will rely on fuller lengths but if the pitch is slow, I will use the off-cutter as my stock ball.

"Nowadays in T20s, there is not a lot of swing to play with apart from the first couple of overs, hence, you have to come up with a strong plan B. You must have different types of deliveries besides conventional swing to outfox the batter.

"As a new-ball bowler, my role in the team is to take early wickets in the Powerplay. On the other hand, while defending a target, I try to create pressure by bowling dot deliveries because if I go for a wicket, I may concede boundaries and the team cannot afford that."

Muhammad Wasim Junior – Islamabad United

Wasim Jnr has been a dynamic addition to the Islamabad United unit over the past two seasons with his skiddy pace often troubling the batters in the death overs. 12 of Wasim's 20 wickets in HBL PSL have come in the death overs of an innings, showing his utility in the final phase.

"Fitness is central to a fast bowler's success and bowling rhythm. Bowling an accurate yorker is a difficult task but the more practice you do in the nets, the better you get at executing the effective delivery.

"If you are bowling in the first innings, your main goal is to dismiss the batters early and keep the opposition restricted to a low score, whereas in the second innings, you can be defensive in your lines and dry up the runs depending on the target."

Shaheen Shah Afridi – Lahore Qalandars

Lahore Qalandars captain Shaheen has struck in his first over of an innings 15 times in the HBL PSL, consistently providing his team with an attacking start. He was the leading wicket-taker in HBL PSL 7 with 20 scalps. To date, he is the third most successful bowler



with 70 wickets in 50 matches at an average of just over 20 with an economy-rate of 7.63.

"Any good batter in the world who has played in the HBL PSL, will always appreciate the standards of fast bowling in the league.

"The main reason is that all the fast bowlers here have healthy competition amongst themselves. They are constantly looking to better each other and putting in impressive performances. This is a positive sign for Pakistan cricket that we have good quicks

coming through who bowl with some heat."

Wahab Riaz – Peshawar Zalmi

Wahab remains the only bowler in HBL PSL to reach the 100-wicket landmark when he took the scalp of Islamabad United batter Danish Aziz last year. The 37-year-old is also the most capped player in the league with 77 appearances and has donned Zalmi colours across all seven seasons.

"As a bowler, you should be aware of your strengths and weaknesses. You should know how to bowl according to

each phase of the innings. The more matches you play and the more experience you gain, you learn important lessons with the exposure.

"I keep things very simple in T20s. It is necessary you realise that batters will attack and you can go for runs, but you need to trust the process and not forget the basics."
