

Govt, PTI to resume talks on election date today

First round of negotiations between govt and opposition concludes in Islamabad

leaders representing the federal government and a team of Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) senior leaders finally kicked off highly-anticipated negotiations at the Parliament House on Thursday in efforts to build consensus on holding elections for the national and provincial assemblies on one date.

The MQM-P's Kishwar Zehra was also a part of the government-nominated committee.

Meanwhile, PTI Vice Chairman Shah Mahmood Qureshi, Barrister Ali Zafar and senior leader Fawad Chaudhry represented the former ruling party. Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-

F) skipped the talks. As per details, the first round of

ISLAMABAD: A committee of talks between the government and hours after Chairman Senate to both sides of the aisle has been the opposition concluded Thursday evening, with both sides set to meet on Friday at 3pm to continue the negotiation process.

Speaking to reporters after the meeting, Gillani said that PTI will present its demands before the government negotiating committee tomorrow. "Today's discussions were held in a positive atmosphere," he said. He also mentioned that the government has no specific demands and will present PTI's demands to coalition leadership.

Finance Minister Dar said the government committee had taken a principled stance to handle the matter within constitutional limits. SBP-held reserves rise to \$4.46b

KARACHI: As the country tries to find ways to secure external financing and keep itself afloat, the State Bank of Pakistan (SBP)-held foreign exchange reserves recorded a meagre rise.

The SBP, in its weekly bulletin, mentioned its reserves have jumped by \$30 million to \$4.46 billion as of April 20, which will provide an import cover of less than a month — a position that has been the same for several months now.

The net foreign reserves held by commercial banks stand at \$5.56 billion, \$1.1 billion more than the SBP, taking the total liquid foreign reserves to \$10.02 billion.

 $Although \, the \, central \, bank \, did$ not specify the reason behind the increase, there was a \$300 million rise in the reserves last week — which was due to the loan provided by the Industrial and Commercial Bank of China.

Veto responsible for non-resolution of Kashmir, Palestine issues, says Pakistan

NEW YORK: Pakistan has told the UN General Assembly that it considers the veto power vested in the Security Council's five permanent members an important issue that needed to be tacked as part of the 15-member Council's reform to make it more

Speaking in a debate marking the first anniversary of the 193-nation Assembly's landmark resolution that requires the permanent members - Britain, China, France, Russia and the U.S. — to justify the use of veto, Ambassador Munir Akram said the Security Council has been paralyzed by the strategic rivalries of its permanent members and the exercise

disputes such as Kashmir and Palestine could not be resolved," the Pakistani envoy said, adding that the vetoes in the Council have prevented and hindered the implementation of UN resolutions.

"The final resolution of the issue of the veto will have to be resolved - not separately - but as an integral part of the reform of the Security Council," he

The 2022 Assembly's resolution, adopted by consensus, calls for the General Assembly to automatically meet within 10 days if any of the five permanent members uses their right of veto.

The aim is to hold those countries accountable for exercising this special voting power, which allows them to block any Council resolution or decision.

This right is enshrined in the UN Charter, the Organization's founding document, because of their key roles in establishing the global body more than

seven decades ago. All five have exercised the right of veto at one time



or another, with 44 vetoes alone since the year 2000. In his remarks, Ambassador Akram said that expe-"It is precisely for this reason that longstanding rience has confirmed that the abolition or restraint on the misuse of the veto rights of the permanent members will have to be an integral part of the Security Council's reform, pointing out that it was for this reason that Pakistan - together with the UfC (Uniting for Consensus) Group - remains opposed to the creation of new permanent members on an expanded Security Council.

"More permanent members and more veto powers will multiply the likelihood of paralysis and inaction in the Security Council," the Pakistani envoy told the General Assembly.

Progress towards restructuring the Security Council remains blocked as the so-called Group of Four India, brazil, Germany and Japan — continue pushing for permanent seats, while the Italy/Pakistan-led Uniting for Consensus (UfC) group opposes any additional permanent members.

As a compromise, UfC has proposed a new category of members — not permanent members with a longer duration in terms and a possibility to "there is no wrong answer, only new ideas."

Besides the five permanent members, the Security Council has 10 non-permanent members elected

Noting the negative power of the veto, Ambassador Akram said this can be "balanced" by, on the one hand, placing restrictions on the use of the veto, and, on the other, enhancing the role of non-permanent members through larger and perhaps longer representation.

At the same time, the Pakistani envoy said that any measures to restrict or constrain the veto must be in line with the rules of the Charter.

Pakistan, he said, remains convinced that the IGN (Inter-governmental Negotiations) process offers the best avenue to reach an agreed outcome on the Council's reform.

"It is only through patient exchanges, mutual accommodation, and compromises that we can broaden the areas of convergence and reduce the points of divergence and thus evolve a 'model' for the reform that can be accepted by the widest possible majority of member states."

In his opening remarks, General Assembly President Csaba Korosi said "The issue of the use of the veto affects the whole UN. And the decisions taken in these halls - or the lack of decisions - reverberate world-wide," adding that "vetoes should always remain the very last resort."

He said this first-ever formal debate on the veto initiative was being held "to figure out the best ways to exploit this new instrument in our big UN toolbox."

LAHORE: Research conducted by Gallup Pakistan and PRIDE, using data from the Labour Force Survey 2020-21, shows that the overall unemployment rate of youth in Puniab is 6.69%

The overall unemployment rate in the Punjab province is 6.69%, with the unemployment rate of females being substantially higher than males (8.32% vs. 6.06%) and that of urban residents being relatively higher than the rate for their rural counterparts (7.94% vs. 6.11%). The analysis of division-wise youth unemployment rate in Punjab shows that the overall youth unemployment rate varies from a low as 4.45% for Bahawalpur division to as high as 17.78% for Rawalpindi division.

The distribution of unemployed youth by level of education indicates that youth having education level of 'matric but below Intermediate', make up the highest proportion of unemployed youth at 20.01%, while youth having 'less than one year of education' comprises the lowest share of unemployed youth at 0.39%.

23.52% of unemployed female youth in Punjab have a Masters level degree. This share is over 7 times higher than the corresponding share of unemployed male youth (around 3% of unemployed males have a

The research analysis shows that the Lahore division has the highest population (20.7 million) in Punjab province, whereas Sahiwal division has the lowest population at 7.9 million.

PEMRA raids cable networks during Eid holidays



Clean initiative to realize UN 2030 Agenda

hina has been building communication platforms to push for global low-carbon energy transitions and green recovery to realize the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Devel-

As the world faces cascading crises including accelerating climate change, surging energy prices and sluggish growth of economy, the aspirations set out in the United Nations' 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development are in jeopardy. Amid intensifying major-country competition, the global clean energy transition is faced with new development trends as well as multiple challenges. China is playing a significant role in the global clean energy transition and gradually becoming a key driving force in advancing the transition.

Over the past few years, with accelerated technological innovation, constantly falling prices and ever-expanding application scenarios, clean energy has displayed growing potential in solving the climate crisis, ensuring energy security, improving access to modern energy services, and stimulating green recovery. Wind and solar generated a record amount of global power in 2022, accounting for 12 percent of global electricity generation, up 2 percentage points from 2021, according to the Global Electricity Review published by the independent climate think tank Ember.

Despite the growing global consensus on clean energy transition, hurdles are emerging on the path to clean energy. Aside from addressing uncertainties associated with breakthrough green technologies and project implementation, we have to navigate several major challenges

to realize the energy transition.

To start with, the growth in clean energy generation falls well short of what is needed to meet the carbon neutrality goal.

To ensure short-term energy supplies and rein in energy prices, countries around the world have been accelerating the clean energy transition and at the same time, investing in and subsidizing fossil fuels, thus resulting in a rapid rebound in carbon emissions in the post-pandemic era. Furthermore, the share of clean energy use is much lower in the traditional industrial sector than in the power generation sector. Obstacles to green recovery are stark because of carbon lock-in and path-dependence amid green energy transitions. Currently, the nationally determined contributions are not on track to meet global climate goals. To solve the problem within eight years, all countries must increase their levels of ambition to reduce emissions, which is a grave challenge for all.

Second, the global North-South divide over clean energy development and divergences on the transition have been grow-

To date, Chinese startups have attracted over one-third of global early-stage venture capital investment in the energy sector and China is increasingly playing an irreplaceable and important role in global clean energy technology value chains. China has noticeable advantages in the production of wind turbines, solar panels and electric vehicle batteries, etc. For instance, China takes up seven spots among the world's top 10 wind turbine manufacturers for wind power. China's photovoltaic industry has taken a lead in the world, accounting for around 70 percent of the global output. The country has been instrumental in bringing down costs worldwide for solar PV. China is also

collectively account for over 50 percent of the global power battery market.

Second, according to data from China's National Energy Administration, China's investment in renewable energy projects in Belt and Road Initiative partner countries has been growing in recent years, and has remained at more than \$2 billion annually.

In 2022, Chinese companies completed power generation projects in 87 countries and regions. As a result, the new energy power generation industry (solar PV, wind power, biomass and energy storage) maintained a growth momentum, and 195 projects with a total contract value of \$19.22 billion were signed, increasing by 9.9 percent year-on-year and accounting for 56.5 percent of the total energy project contract value.

Currently, Chinese clean energy companies and green investment projects are making great efforts to go global. The foundation for international cooperation on clean energy has been constantly consolidated. The key projects include the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, the Bangladesh-China-India-Myanmar Economic Corridor, the China-Indochina Peninsula Economic Corridor, the China-Central Asia-West Asia Economic Corridor, the New Eurasian Land Bridge, the China-Mongolia-Russia Economic Corridor and the Sino-African cooperation, among others.

In the meantime, China has been advancing the integration between the green development of the Belt and Road and South-South cooperation on climate change. Since 2020, China has signed memorandums of understanding with Laos, Cambodia and Seychelles on low-carbon demonstration zones for

China has not only provided clean-energy materials, including solar PV, wind power equipment and electric vehicles, but also jointly mapped out low-carbon development plans in collaboration with the recipient countries and strengthened assessment of clean energy development potential and low-carbon talent training.

Last, China has been advocating open, win-win international multilateral cooperation to share development opportunities with the rest of the world, building communication platforms to promote global low-carbon energy transitions and green recovery and to realize the UN 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development, and constantly pushing the establishment of a new governance order concerning climate change and new energy development.

The global clean energy partnership is an important platform and channel for China to carry out global climate governance, which helps promote relevant governance mechanisms by making them more fair, reasonable and efficient and provides a feasible pathway toward better governance of global clean energy.

ince Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan's visit to Damascus last week, the discourse in the international community has centered on whether or not to talk to Bashar Assad. Actually, what the international community should do is move from a normative discourse to a more practical one. It should talk to whoever makes a difference on the ground.

The UN-backed meetings in Geneva are not representative of the people, nor can they make a difference on the ground. Assad, despite the claim he has control over 70 percent of the country, in reality has no real control over any part of the country. His army is nothing but a collection of gangs and fragments ruled by Assad-affiliated warlords that take the name "shabiha." The only two legions that have a cohesive command and control structure are the 4th Armored Division of Maher Assad, which is under Iranian control, and the Tiger Forces commanded by Suhail Al-Hassan that take orders directly from the Russian base of Hmeimim.

So, even if Assad agreed to anything, would he be able to enforce it? Not really. On the other hand, the opposition that meets in Geneva, how much are they in touch with the people on the ground? Again, if they agree to anything, could they enforce it on the ground? Is the armed opposition accountable to them? Not really, the armed opposition is as fragmented as the Syrian army and is only accountable to its foreign backers.

This is only regarding the domestic actors. If we talk about the regional and global players, the situation gets even more complicated. Can we have an agreement whereby the US, Russia, Turkey, Saudi Arabia, Jordan, Israel and Iran are all on the same page regarding Syria? Very

the areas bordering Lebanon. The actors are also different. Jordan is very active in the southwest because it is next to its borders, whereas it has no presence in Idlib.

In this respect, the international communitv should set clear, achievable goals and realize that Syria cannot be fixed and become a modern, democratic state as a result of a deal signed in Geneva. The goals should be to stabilize the security situation, ensure the safe return of refugees and jumpstart the local economy so that people can sustain themselves. Once those basic goals are achieved, then the international community can have the luxury of talking about political systems and democracy.

To achieve those three basic goals, a deal needs to be brokered with actors on the ground. In fact, in this approach, at least four deals need to be prokered, each one with different actors.

In the southwestern Deraa region, the international actors are Israel, Jordan and Russia, Israel and Jordan need to have their borders secured. Russia is the one that brokered a deal between opposition groups and the regime in July 2018. The main group, Quwaa Shabab Al-Sunna, which was rebranded as the 8th Brigade, is still very much in charge of the security of the area, of course under Russian tutelage. Hence, the Russian-brokered deal should allow refugees to negotiate an agreement regarding their safe return. In parallel, a plan should be laid out to allow for local development with the involvement of the community.

Regarding the areas around Lebanon, a deal should be clinched with the Iranians and Hezbollah to allow refugees to return. Hezbollah would want to cover its back and make sure no hostile force is at its doorstep.

As for the northeast, the Americans have a moral obligation toward their Kurdish allies, who were instrumental in pushing back against Syria simply because the landscape is not the Daesh and still today guard the prisons housing extremists. However, the Americans need to

and offer security guarantees to Turkey.

As for Idlib, the main power in control here is Turkey. Idlib also has a high concentration of internally displaced people. When the Russians came to save Assad in 2015, the armed opposition groups had the choice of either reconciling with the regime or taking the green buses to Idlib. The Russian plan was to concentrate the opposition in one place, separate it from the regime and make a truce between them. It could then broker a deal between Assad and the opposition that would stabilize the country and allow Moscow to reap the benefits of its intervention. However, events did not go as expected and Assad kept playing the Russians off against the Iranians in

an attempt to remain relevant. Since then, Idlib has gathered all of the opposition to Assad. Today, they are under Turkish influence. This is why Idlib should be the last area to be handled. Once the other areas of the country are stabilized, then it can be tackled and an orderly return of internally displaced people from Idlib to all the different areas of Syria can

be planned. Given the chaotic situation the country is currently experiencing, the fragmented security situation and the lack of any legitimate representatives of the Syrian people, it is very unrealistic, even pedantic, for the international community to ask the Syrians to agree among themselves and find a settlement that will end the war and transition Syria into a democracy. So, the international community should move from the frame of mind of a comprehensive solution to a series of localized solutions. Once local solutions are found, the Syrian people themselves can find a solution for the entire country. (Courtesy: Arab News)

One of the consequences of intensified violence in Sudan is that the refugee crisis could worsen, potentially affecting other countries. Sudan shares borders with seven countries — Libya, Egypt, Chad, the Central African Republic, South Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea. As the World Bank has warned: "The high incidence of conflict, particularly past fighting that led to South Sudan's secession, has led to a large population of refugees and internally displaced persons. Sudan is now a source, destination and transit country for irregular migration, including refugees and asylum seekers using the East African northbound migratory route through Libya to Europe. The country hosts an estimated 800,000 South Sudanese refugees and 330,000 refugees and asylum seekers from Eritrea, Syria, Ethiopia, CAR, Chad,

The first key step to take in this kind of situation is to keep humanitarian corridors open in order to allow humanitarian and medical assistance to enter the conflict-affected areas and Volker Perthes told reporters last week, when safe passages and humanitarian corridors are not respected, "We cannot deliver when our staff is

attacked, is thrown out of their offices, when their offices are destroyed, their vehicles looted, and sometimes even their residencies being under fire or destroyed."

Secondly, mediation plays a vital role in helping to encourage reconciliation between the parties in conflict. Inflation in developed nations raises concerns for US economy

NEW YORK: That core consumer price indexes in major developed economies remain high has not only led to disagreement on their future monetary policies, but also increased concerns about their economic outlook, especially about the risk of an economic recession in the United States.

The overall eurozone inflation slowed to 6.9 percent in March, but core prices, which excludes energy, food, and alcohol and tobacco prices, rose to a 5.7 percent record high. The Office for National Statistics showed that CPI in the United Kingdom rose 10.1 percent year-on-year in March, down from 10.4 percent in February but was well above the 9.8 percent market expectation, while core inflation reached 5.7 percent, unchanged from February. The European Central Bank's policymakers are concerned that rising energy costs are affecting various areas of the economy and that core inflation data could continue to

Japan, too, has struggled with its core inflation figures. Japan's core CPI excluding fresh food rose 3.1 percent year-on-year in March, rising for the 19th consecutive month. In

bank took office in early April, Japan has frequently sent a prudent monetary policy signal, but in the context of consumption recovery and tight labor market, it is not easy for Japan to check core inflation.

The situation in the US is more typical. In March the US' CPI rose 5 percent from a year before, down 1 percentage point from February, but core prices rose 5.6 percent, up from 5.5 percent in February. The duality of overall falling inflation and rising core prices has increased the divergence of market institutions on the US' future monetary policy.

Advanced economies are facing a somewhat similar conundrum, that is, monetary policy needs to find a solution that balances the interests of all parties by suppressing inflation, avoiding recession, and dealing with financial risks. China Daily

ISLAMABAD: Fauji Fertilizer Company Limited (FFC) has announced its financial results for the period ended March 31, 2023 in its Board of Directors' meeting held on Thursday.

Urea production by the Company stood at 633 thousand tonnes whereas sales were recorded at 631 thousand tonnes, same as last year.

The Company continued to face economic challenges including very high level inflation, escalating GST rates, increased interest rates, besides continued devaluation of the Pak rupee, negatively impacting the operating and financing costs of the Company. Shortage of foreign currency reserves have also caused delay in procurement of essential spares and machinery.

The increase in interest rates enabled the Company to earn income on deposits of Rs 3.5 billion. This income also included an unrealized exchange gain of Rs 930 million earned on the foreign exchange deposits of the Company due to devaluation of Pak rupee.

The net profitability of the Company thus stood at Rs 7.7 billion with earnings per share of Rs. 6.08 per share compared to Rs 4.90 per share for 2022. The profitability in dollar terms however declined to USD 30 million compared to USD 35 million last year.

Influential sugar mafia robbing poor masses

Dr. Hanif Mughal says uncontrolled exports, smuggling will push up the prices to Rs200 per kg

ISLAMABAD: Dr. Hanif Mughal, Senior Vice President of Pakistan Economy Watch (PEW) on Thursday said powerful sugar mafia is depriving poor masses of billion of rupees by constantly increasing the price of the commod-

Inflation is increasing due to the increase in the price of sugar and if the indiscriminate export and smuggling of sugar is not stopped, its price will reach two hundred rupees per kg,

Dr. Hanif Mughal said in a statement issued here that the consumption of sugar in the country is five million tonnes and an increase of one rupee per kg in its price increases the burden of five billion rupees on the public, which is transferred to the coffers of the sugar mafia.

He said that before the export of sugar, many circles had expressed the fear of its price hike,



but the warning were ignored to please the influential.

The political interest and the acquisition of wealth are always more important than the interest of the people for the rulers, he said.

Mughal said that the sugar which was available at 95 rupees a kg a few months ago is now available at 120 to 140 rupees in different parts of the country and its price is set to increase.

In the months of February and March last year, not even a kg of sugar was exported. But this year, in the same two months 172,180 tonnes has been exported, and the process continued during the April.

In the month of March, three times more sugar was exported than in February. While in April, May and June, the speed of exports will be increased to provide benefit of billions to the sugar mafia at the cost of masses, he lamented.

He said that orders of a crackdown against sugar smugglers, hoarders, and profiteers issued in the mid of this month was nothing but an eyewash.
