KARACHI: The country recorded a rise in cement sales by 37% in August 2023 to 4.518 million tonnes from 3.297 million tonnes a year ago, ARY News reported on Monday

According to the All Pakistan Cement Manufacturers Association (APCMA), it recorded a rise in the sale in August 2023 in the local markets by 30% as compared to August last

A significant rise in cement exports was witnessed by 87% to 724,777 tonnes from 387,440 tonnes a year

In July, there was an increase in cement sales by 57.44% in July to 3.212 million tonnes from 2.040 million tonnes as compared to July 2022.

The 57.4% increase in cement sales signalled the commencement of ries sold 739,376 tonnes, up 109.61%

Aga Khan Universitu's 5th Paediatric Research Week

KARACHI: Research done by faculty at the Aga Khan University has contributed to the decline of mortality rate of babies and children 35% and 50%, respectively, at its field sites of research. This is not a quick win but years of scientific work and building trust with communities.

"A published paper takes months, or even years to develop. It emerges, however, as the first single datapoint that is collected out in the field, far from the campus, between a vulnerable mother and child and one of our community health workers. We're now witnessing tangible outcomes of efforts initiated over a few decades ago," said AKU Chair of Paediatrics Dr Fyezah Jehan.

She was speaking at the University's fifth annual paediatric research week which brought together over 300 students and healthcare professionals from Pakistan and beyond. This was significant because of what he had to say about institutions in Europe and the US working with those in Africa or South Asia.

Indeed, chief guest Nadia Jamil, an actor and child protection activist, stressed that, "Children have an inclination to thrive. You give them an opportunity and they will lean towards healing."

Kashmir now a settlercolonial project, Kashmiri leader tells **Islamic convention**

noted Kashmiri leader told the annual Convention of the Islamic Society of North American (ISNA) in Chicago that Jammu and Kashmir, which India unilaterally annexed in August 2019, was now "a full-fledged settler-colonial project," one similar to Israel's in the occupied Palestinian territories.

"A genocidal and ethnic cleansing plan is in place", Ghulam Nabi Mir, President of the World Kashmir Awareness Forum and Chairman of the Kashmir Global Coalition, said in a speech to delegates from across the United States.

Under the new Domicile Law, he said, 4.2 million Indian Hindus have been issued domicile certificates to demographically flood Kashmir with non-Kashmiri Indian settlers to dilute the Muslim population.

"Kashmir has had its checkered history of strife, foreign invasion and occupations just like all other nations of the world," Mir pointed out.

Referring to several of India's actions to occupy Kashmir after the independence, he said, "In August 2019, (Prime Minister Narendra) Modi revoked Kashmir's semi-autonomous status and imposed a media and internet blockade, after building up a massive military presence in the area and shutting down and imposing curfew that virtually cut off the disputed territory from the world.

'Thousands of additional Indian troops were deployed, a major Hindu pilgrimage was canceled, schools and colleges were shut, tourists were ordered to leave, telephone and internet services were suspended, and thousands of youth and resistance leaders and activists were detained, Mir said.

'The Hindu nationalist BJP wants to change the demographic character of the Muslim-majority region by allowing non-Kashmiris to buy land there." Dr.

Ghulam Nabi Fai, Secretary General of the World Kashmir Awareness Forum was the Emcee of the event.

He said that Kashmir, Palestine and Rohingya genocide are the three important international conflicts.

The Palestinians and Kashmiris should be provided an opportunity to decide whatever they want without any external pressure or compulsion.

"That choice was given to Palestinians under UN Security Council resolutions as well as to the Kashmiris also under the 15-member Council's resolutions.

"The denial of the right to self-determination to the people of Palestine and Kashmir is a clear danger to the international eace and security" Dr. Fai warned

He added that the genocide in Myanmar should not go unnoticed as more than 1 million Rohingya Muslims have fled and are languishing in refugee camps in Bangladesh and some other countries.

The pain and suffering of Rohingya Muslims are a challenge to the world's conscience," Dr. Fai said, "Time has come that the United Nations need to intervene in all these three situations to bring peace to the region of South Asia and Middle East."

its own constitution, autonomy over internal matters except defense, foreign affairs, and communications, and a separate set of laws that governed various aspects of the state's affairs. It was a unique arrangement that aimed to respect the cultural, religious, and political diversity of the region. The abrogation of Article 370 was framed allegedly by the Modi led Indian government to merge Jammu and Kashmir in India. The decision was met with opposition within India and the world. Critics saw it as a violation of the unique identity of Jammu and Kashmir and a threat to its demographic and cultural fabric.

The immediate aftermath of the abrogation saw significant changes in the region. The state was reorganized into two union territories - Jammu and Kashmir, and Ladakh. The removal of Article 370 resulted in the loss of the special autonomy that had been a defining feature of the region for decades. While the Indian government promised economic development, investment, and opportunities, there were concerns about the commu-

nication blackout, restrictions on movement, and human as an erosion of the region's distinct identity. rights violations that followed the decision. These concerns sparked debates on the balance between security measures and fundamental rights. The abrogation of Article 370 had broader geopolitical implications. Article 35A, a provision enshrined in the Indian Constitution, held a special place in the context of Jammu and Kashmir until its abrogation in 2019. Article 35A was added to the Indian Constitution through a Presidential Order in 1954, effectively granting the state government of Jammu and Kashmir the authority to define who qualified as a "permanent resi-

his special status allowed the state to have dent" of the State. These permanent residents were entitled to certain rights and privileges, including the right to own property, access government jobs, and avail of social benefits. Supporters of Article 35A argued that it was a vital safeguard for the unique identity and cultural heritage of Jammu and Kashmir. They believed that the provision protected the region's demographics and preserved its distinct character by preventing non-residents from acquiring property or benefiting from employment opportunities. For many residents of Jammu and Kashmir, Article 35A represented a symbol of the special autonomy that the state enjoyed within the Indian Union. It was seen as a measure to protect the region's interests in the face of integration.

Article 35A faced challenges over the years, with petitions questioning its constitutionality. The abrogation of Article 370 in 2019, which granted special autonomy to Jammu and Kashmir, also led to the nullification of Article 35A. This move was met with a range of reactions, including support from those who believed that it would promote greater integration and equal rights across the nation, and criticism from those who saw it

The abrogation of Article 35A led to significant changes in Jammu and Kashmir's legal and administrative landscape. World's largest rhino farm now in hands of African Parks NGO



African Parks, an NGO, announced its acquisition of the world's largest rhino farm, situated in South Africa and housing a staggering 2,000 rhinoceroses.

The move comes amid a pressing need to safeguard these huge creatures, given

South Africa's status as a poaching hotspot driven by demand for rhino horns in traditional Asian medicine.

Despite increased protection efforts at national parks like Kruger, South Africa witnessed the tragic loss of 448 rhinos last year, just three fewer than in 2021.

African Parks has now stepped in to take charge of this critical rhino breeding operation, spanning 7,800 hectares in the North West province, presently sheltering 15 percent of the world's remaining wild southern white rhino population.

Previously owned by 81-year-old South African conservationist John Hume, who aimed to find a billionaire successor, the farm faced great poaching risks without any takers.

Hume had poured approximately \$150 million into his philanthropic mission to save the world's second-largest land mammal, with security and surveillance forming the farm's major expenses.

African Parks, a custodian of 22 protected areas across Africa, has outlined a comprehensive plan to reintroduce 2,000 southern white rhinos into the wild over the next decade.

The species, once on the brink of extinction in the late 19th century, has gradually rebounded due to sustained protection and breed-

The landmark acquisition marks a significant stride in rhino conservation, emphasising the urgency of safeguarding these magnificent creatures from the persistent threat of poaching in South Africa.

Pakistan businesses fear default still imminent, Gallup Survey

KARACHI: Majority of Pakistan's businesses are "not hopeful at all" about the ability of caretaker Prime Minister Anwaar-ul-Haq Kakar to save the country from a potential default on its international financial obligations, shows a latest survey.

The 72% of more than 500 businesses surveyed in the second quarter of 2023 by Gallup Pakistan were found concerned over the country's potential default.

The survey results come despite Islamabad's success in securing a \$3 billion fresh bailout package form the International Monetary Fund (IMF) that helped dollar-hungry Pakistan avoid an

imminent default. Of the total nearly half, 49%

expressed significantly high concern while 17% respondents were not concerned at all, according to the Gallup Pakistan Business Confidence Index Q2 2023

However, the survey found that the business community was less pessimistic about the fate of their businesses than previous quarter despite snowballing crises, worsening inflation and rising power

"Inflation, utility bills and rupee devaluation cause growing concern among business community, but overall fewer businesses express hopelessness compared to the previous quarter," said the

Less pessimistic about current conditions, the business owners are largely negative about future prospects and the direction

in which Pakistan is heading. "Prevailing economic and political crises have contributed to persisting business insecurity," it said. The backbreaking inflation

was cited as the most important problem the businessmen would want the caretaker government to solve as price hike has significantly eroded people's purchasing power besides keeping the interest rate at a record high in recent

The freefall of the rupee and the imposition of taxes were other problems more and more businesses want the government to address. The number of businesses facing load-shedding rose by 25% this quarter as 69% said yes when asked if they were braving power outages.

Half of the businesses surveyed said they had laid off their employees because of tough business conditions in the quarter under review, showing 13% increase over the previous quarter.

Asked questions about their current and future business situation as well as the direction of the country, the businessmen's view on all three fronts was negative.

The scores in each strand, however, rose by a few percentage points as compared to the last quarter.

"While the overall negative trend persists, this indicates a marginal improvement in business confidence after quarter 1," marked the report.

The current business situation score on Gallup's second quarter Business Confidence Index has improved by two percentage points regardless of the fact that economic insecurity has risen in


