# Kashmir key to India-Pakistan peace, says PM Kakar, urges UN resolutions' implementation

UNITED NATIONS: Caretaker Prime Minister Anwaar-ul-Haq Kakar Friday called on the UN Security Council (UNSC) to secure the implementation of its resolutions on Kashmir, which, he said, was the key to peace between Pakistan and India

"India has evaded implementation of the Security Council's resolutions which call for the 'final disposition' of Jammu and Kashmir to be decided by its people through UN-supervised plebiscite," he told the UN General Assembly in its iconic hall with several world leaders, top diplomats and officials in the audience.

In his maiden address to the 193-member Assembly's high-level session, PM Kakar also focused on a range of issues, including the cross-border terrorist attacks against Pakistan by Afghanistan-based TTP; the Palestine tragedy; the threat posed by far-right groups like Hindutva-inspired extremists; Islamophobia; global economic crises stemming from Covid, conflict and climate change; Sustainable Development fake "encounters" and so-called accept Pakistan's offer of mutual



Goals (SDGs), Pakistan's efforts to recover from its economic challenges, and the UNSC reform.

"Development depends on peace," the prime minister said, adding, "Pakistan desires peaceful and productive relations with all our neighbours, including India."

Since August 5, 2019, PM Kakar said India, with 900,000 troops in the occupied Kashmir, imposed extended lockdowns and curfews; jailed all the genuine Kashmir leaders; violently suppressed peaceful protests; resorted to extra-judicial killings of innocent Kashmiris in should convince New Delhi to

ments, destroying entire villages. "Access to occupied Kashmir, demanded by the UN High Commission for Human Rights and over a dozen Special Rapporteurs, has been denied by New Delhi," he told delegates from

around the world. In this regard, the prime minister called for the reinforcement of the UN Military Observer Group for India and Pakistan (UNMO-GIP), stressing that global powers

restraint on strategic and conventional weapons.

Pakistan, he said, shared the concerns of international community with respect to Afghanistan, its first priority being to prevent and counter all terrorism from and within that neighbouring country.

"Yet," the prime minister said, we advocate continued humanitarian assistance to a destitute Afghan population in which Afghan girls and women are the most vulnerable; as well as revival of the Afghan economy and implementation of the connectivity projects with Central Asia.

'Pakistan condemns the crossborder terrorist attacks against Pakistan by the TTP, Da'esh and other groups operating from Afghanistan," the prime minister said, adding, "We have sought Kabul's support and cooperation to prevent these attacks. However, we are also taking necessary measures to end this externally encouraged terrorism." He told the international community that Pakistan's government was committed to rapid economic recovery — stabilize its foreign exchange reserves and currency; expand domestic revenues and mobilize significant

domestic and external investment. To that end, he said, Pakistan had established a Special Investment Facilitation Council (SIFC) to expedite investment decisions, with 28 projects identified in priority sectors - agriculture, mining, energy and IT - for implementation in collaboration with the country's partners. The second phase of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC), he said, had been initiated covering railway, infrastructure and manufacturing projects.

Noting the far-reaching commitments made at the SDG summit to implement the 17 anti-poverty goals, he called for ensuing implementation of the "SDG Stimulus"; the re-channelling of unused Special Drawing Rights (SDRs) for development; the expansion of concessional lending by the multilateral development banks; and the resolution of the debt problems of the 59 countries in debt distress.

# Canada's Trudeau wants India to cooperate in murder probe

NEW YORK: Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau on Thursday called on India to cooperate with an investigation into the murder of a Sikh separatist leader in British Columbia and said Canada would not release its evidence.

Trudeau said on Monday that Ottawa had credible allegations linking Indian government agents to the murder of Hardeep Singh Nijjar in June, prompting an angry reaction from New Delhi. Nijjar, 45, was a Canadian citizen.

The Canadian government has amassed both human and signals intelligence in a months-long investigation into the Sikh separatist leader's murder, CBC News separately reported on Thursday citing sources.

Traditional Canadian allies have so far taken a relatively cautious approach to the matter. Politi-



cal analysts said this was partly because the United States and other major players see India as a counterweight to the growing influence of China.

"There is no question that India is a country of growing importance and a country that we need to continue to work with ... and we're not looking to provoke or cause problems," Trudeau said in a press conference in New York on the sidelines of the annual high-level United Nations General Assembly. "But we are unequivocal around the importance of the rule of law and unequivocal about the importance of protecting Canadians."

"That's why we call upon the government of India to work with us to establish processes to discover and to uncover the truth of the

The CBC report said, citing Canadian sources, that no Indian official, when pressed behind closed doors has denied the allegation that there is evidence suggesting Indian government involvement in Nijjar's death. India's Ministry of External Affairs did not immediately respond to a Reuters request for comment on the CBC report.

The report said the intelligence included communications involving Indian officials, among them Indian diplomats present in Canada, adding that some of the intelligence was provided by an unidentified ally in the Five Eyes alliance.

Five Eyes is an intelligence-sharing network that includes the US, the UK, Canada, Australia and New Zealand.

### NAB reopens corruption cases against ex-Balochistan CMs

# APPA urges Governor State Bank to timely conduct biometrics

ISLAMABAD: All Pakistan Pensioners Association (APPA) General Secretary Aurangzeb Tanuli Friday appealed to the Governor State Bank of Pakistan to oblige the management of all banks to conduct timely biometrics of all pensioners in March and September as per the policy. In a statement here, the Association General Secretary said it was not possible for pensioners to submit biometrics along with life and no marriage certificate together, which was against the policy. Tanuli said blocking the pension account of a pensioner on this basis was illegal and this issue should be resolved immediately so that the problems of the pensioners could be resolved. The general secretary pointed out the important issue and said that there were clear orders from the State Bank and the Finance Minister that all pensioners were required to get their biometrics done in March and September every year. "And if for any reason, if the biometric is not obtained, then the pensioner will have to submit the life certificate. Similarly, if a widow is a pensioner, then she will also be required to undergo biometrics and submit a no marriage certificate. After the age of 60 years, the requirement to submit a no marriage certificate will also cease to fulfill all these strict conditions," he added. He further mentioned that all male and female pensioners start visiting their respective banks in March and September, but every time they were turned away by the bank management asking them to come next time or month.

To understand this nuanced approach, we must acknowledge the deep-rooted historical and cultural ties that TTP has with its Afghan counterparts.

TTP and Afghan Taliban share a common history, having fought together against the Russian invasion and later against Allied forces. TTP and similar groups adhere to an extremist interpretation of Islam and seek to establish a strict Islamic state, often using violence to achieve these goals. Their shared philosophy, ethnicity, language, and cultural bonds have forged a strong connection.

Recognizing these intricacies is crucial when developing a response to either the TTP or the Afghan Government in light of the Doha Agreement. Pakistan rightly demands that Afghanistan adheres to its commitment to prevent terrorists from using Afghan soil to attack other

The Prime Minister astutely pointed out that the Afghan government remains in an interim and arguably illegitimate state, with rudimentary governance structures and communication mechanisms. This informality in governance has led to various local commanders and tribal chieftains exercising significant autonomy, sometimes sheltering TTP terrorists and aiding their nefarious activities within Pakistan. Pakistan's response to these challenges requires careful consideration of these factors.

The Prime Minister himself, being of Pathan heritage, possesses an innate understanding of the Afghan, TTP, and similar groups. He is well aware of their attitudinal, psychological makeup, and their unwavering commitment to certain ideol-

They possess a deep-seated commitment to their cause, making it challenging to disassociate them through

Adding to the complexity, the TTP now possesses state-of-the-art weaponry left behind by the departing Allied

during its 2021 withdrawal, left approximately \$7 billion worth of military equipment and weapons, including firearms, communications gear, and armored vehithe fall of the Western-backed Afghan government, significantly bolstering their military capabilities.

Regrettably, some of this American military gear and weaponry have found their way into neighboring Pakistan, where they are utilized by armed groups, including the TTP. This influx

of U.S. weapons has enhanced the TTP's capacity and emboldened ethnic Baluch separatist groups in Pakistan, leading to a surge in violence.

The United States Institute of Peace has noted a "robust and growing black market"

armed groups obtaining advanced U. S. weaponry and equipment like M16 machine guns, M4 assault rifles, night-vision goggles, and military communication gear. These sophisticated weapons have had a "terrifying" impact, especially on the under-equipped Pakistani police force.

According to the Pakistan InInstitute of Peace Studies (PIPS), terrorist attacks in Pakistan increased by 27 percent last year compared to 2021. These attacks claimed the lives of at least 419 people and left 734 injured in 262

incidents. TTP's use of sniper rifles with thermal scopes has given them a distinct advantage, enabling pinpoint accuracy even in the dark.

The Taliban seized this arsenal after and weaponry have enabled the militants to carry out sophisticated attacks, particularly on security checkpoints along Pakistan's western border with Afghanistan. The situation poses a serious threat, especially in areas that were previously relatively peaceful and less prone to violence.

The Pentagon has conveyed to the U. S. government that retrieving the material left in Afghanistan is currently unrealistic, given that the United States does not recognize the Taliban as a legitimate government. The Taliban, however, denies supplying U. S. weapons to TTP fighters and instead blames former members of Afghanistan's security forces for selling arms on the black market after the fall of the internationally recognized government in Kabul.

In Pakistan, the black market has become inundated with U.S. weapons since the Taliban's takeover of Afghanistan. These weapons are known for their excellent quality and lethality, attracting buyers from various quarters. A U. S.-made M4 assault rifle in good condition can be purchased for approximately \$1,400, while military communication gear like Harris Engineering Falcon Three Radios is available for around \$3,500. Some of these weapons have also fallen into the hands of criminals, giving them an edge over civilian law enforcement agencies, which are equipped with outdated and less lethal weaponry.

# Failed SOEs should be privatized to reduce government expenditure

ISLAMABAD: Chairman of National Business Group Pakistan, President Pakistan Businessmen and Intellectuals Forum, and All Karachi Industrial Alliance, and former provincial minister Mian Zahid Hussain said on Friday that failed State-Owned Enterprises (SOEs) should be sold without delay to reduce the expenditure of the government.

It seems that instead of reducing expenditure on the part of the government, consensus is being reached on statements, while there is no concrete plan to privatize failed government institutions, he said.

Mian Zahid Hussain said that the people have reduced their expenditure as much as possible to survive, and there is no room for further reduction.

Talking to the business community, the veteran business leader said that people are being frugal in their consumption of fuel and electricity while they are forced to subsist on substandard food items, but the situation is still not under their control.

He said that immediate steps should be taken to eliminate the losses of government institutions and give immediate relief to the



The business leader said that the political instability that has been going on for the last six years has caused a lot of damage to the people and the economy. IMF conditions and the continuous increase in the price of gas, electricity, and fuel have left people drained.

The country has not been brought to this state by the people, but failed government institutions, tax, electricity, and gas thieves are responsible for it, he added.

Mian Zahid Hussain said that the condition of the people is getting worse; millions are becoming poor, and due to desperation,

an unexpected reaction can come from them at any time.

He further said that stopping the smuggling of petrol and diesel from the border areas is welcome, which will stabilize the value of the rupee and will also increase the revenue of the government.

There has been a shortage of many commodities in the country, notably the raw materials of the pharma industry, leading to a shortage of life-saving drugs, he said, adding that due to the ongoing political and economic crisis in the country, everyone is being badly affected except the rich and very wealthy class.

Some people have shifted their capital abroad, and the situation in Pakistan cannot affect them. The solution to Pakistan's problems lies in the privatization of failed government institutions, an increase in the tax base, foreign investment, import substitution, and

an increase in exports. It is no longer possible to manage situations by avoiding problems instead of solving them. For many decades, Pakistan has been using shortcuts to solve all kinds of corruption, mismanagement, and incompetence through borrowing instead of governance and reforms, and this will not be possible in the future, he warned.

## **SECP** notifies amendments to **NBFC Rules 2003**

ISLAMABAD: The Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP), with the approval of the federal government, has notified amendments to the Non-Banking Finance Companies (Establishment & Regulations) Rules, 2003.

The amendments, which have been introduced after a comprehensive stakeholder consultation process, aim to revitalise growth in the non-banking finance sector and facilitate establishing a contemporary and conducive regulatory framework.

Ease of doing business has been provided by eliminating redundancies and requirements such as submission of certified copies of the memorandum, articles of association, and certificate of incorporation, providing reasons for select-



ing the proposed place of business, statistical data, and additional facts in support of the application, etc. Additionally, directors and chief executive officers are no longer required to submit affidavits with respect to the correctness of information and instead can only submit a declaration to this effect. Moreover, the term "investment company" has been deleted from the rules as the

structure no longer exists. The SECP believes that introducing measures for ease of doing business and streamlining licencing requirements is critical to the long-term sustainability of the NBFC sector in

# World Bank launches 'Reforms for a Brighter Future

ISLAMABAD: The World Bank has launched a new program to foster debate on the critical development policy issues facing Pakistan. 'Reforms for a Brighter Future: Time to Decide' is intended to engage in discussions with a broad range of stakeholders on what fundamental policy shifts are most needed to durably steer the economy towards stronger, more climate-resilient and sustainable growth and development. This consultation program includes the publication, today, of a series of draft Discussion Notes.

These will be progressively enriched by feedback received from a broad range of stakeholders. The Notes, which draw on international experience as well as a large body of evidence on Pakistan, propose fundamental policy shifts that are needed to move away from the current low-growth, anti-development status quo:

From underfunded, inefficient, and fragmented service delivery and social protection systems towards coordinated, efficient, and adequately financed service delivery, targeting the most vulnerable—in particular to reduce abnormally high child stunting rates and to increase learning outcomes for all children, especially for girls.

From wasteful and rigid public expenditures benefiting a few, towards tightly prioritized spending on public services, infrastructure, and investments in climate adaptation, benefiting populations most in need.

From a narrow, distortive, and inequitable tax system towards one that is broad-based, efficient, progressive, and equitable-generating sufficient revenues to significantly increase public investment in human development, infrastructure, and climate adaptation.

From a protected, stagnant, and unproductive economy with a large state presence towards a dynamic open

and exports.

From agriculture sector policies that lock farmers into a low-value, low-productivity farming towards a more market-driven, productive agricultural system, including value chains that are resilient to climate change impacts and

From energy sector policies that drive high energy costs, environmental harms, and unsustainable accumulation of debt, towards efficient, sustainable, and resilient generation and distribution, based on accurate price signals, increased competition and private participation, and a cleaner energy mix.

From a public sector that is inefficient, often ineffective, and vulnerable

to capture by vested interests towards accountable, efficient, and transparent government, including at the local level. "Pakistan has been facing numer-

ous economic hardships includ-

economy driven by private investment ing inflation, rising electricity prices, severe climate shocks, and insufficient public resources to finance development and climate adaptation—when the country is among the most vulnerable to climate change impacts. It is also facing a "silent" human capital crisis: abnormally high child stunting rates, low learning outcomes, and high child mortality.", said Najy Benhassine, Country Director for the World Bank in Pakistan.

"These discussion notes contribute to debates on long standing policy issues that are muting Pakistan's high economic and development potential. There is reasonable consensus on priorities and challenges. Determining specific solutions requires open debates on concrete, fundamental policy decisions. We hope this program of discussions will help build a consensus around a path towards inclusive, sustainable, and climate-resilient devel-

As part of the 'Reforms for a Brighter Future' engagement program, the World Bank together with the Pakistan Institute of Development Economics, conducted extensive consultations across the country to seek inputs and feedback on the recommendations included in the draft Discussion Notes. These have included discussions with students across 21 universities and provincial roundtables with thinkers from academia, and the public and private sectors. Participants in all four provinces have shared insights and perspectives that have helped shaped the understanding of what it would take to put Pakistan back on a path towards sustainable, climate-resilient, and inclusive growth. The 'Reforms for a Brighter Future' program will continue over the following months both online and at in-person events across the country, including the national conversation that will take place in Islamabad today and tomorrow.
