GAZA: Palestinians mourn their relatives killed in the Israeli bombardment of the southern Gaza Strip in Rafah.



Scores of civilian casualties due to indiscriminate Israeli strikes in Gaza

GAZA: Scores of innocent civilians were killed over the past few hours as a result of the continuing Israeli airstrikes and artillery bombardments targeting various regions of the Gaza Strip, according to local sources.

In Gaza City, Israeli warplanes targeted a gathering of civilians near the Saraya junction, resulting in the tragic murder of 10 civilians, with dozens sustaining injuries.

In Deir el-Balah, the central Gaza Strip, it was reported that three casualties were transferred

to the Shuhada Al-Aqsa Hospital following an Israeli airstrike which targeted the Khattab family's residence west of the neighboring Nuseirat refugee camp.

Medical sources reported that Israeli warplanes targeted a group of civilians on Street 2 connecting Nuseirat refugee camp and town of Az-Zawayda, resulting in the murder of a child and injuries to others. Simultaneously, Israeli forces fired phosphorus bombs towards the tents of displaced families in Nuseirat.

In the meantime, Captain Hani Al-Masri, a prominent Palestinian football star and coach of the

Palestinian Olympic football team, was also reported killed as a result of the ongoing Israeli shelling of Gaza City.

Israeli occupation forces also bombed a house in the Shujaiya neighborhood east of Gaza City.

Meanwhile, a girl was killed and other civilians were injured due to the Israeli shelling of a house in the Beit Lahia project in northern Gaza.

In the southern region of the Strip, the Palestinian Red Crescent in Gaza reported that Israeli forces continue to target its Al-Amal Hospital in Khan Yunis, aiming to send it out of service.

The Red Crescent added that Israeli artillery and drones are violently shelling the vicinity of the hospital in southern Gaza.

Furthermore, Israeli warplanes bombed several houses in central Khan Yunis, accompanied by intense artillery shelling in the eastern areas of the city. Medical sources confirmed the arrival of a martyr to the European Hospital following the shelling in the Fakhari village east of Khan Yunis.

Also in Khan Yunis, local media reports said four civilians, including three children, in the shelling that targeted a house west of the city.

In another tragic incident, a civilian lost his life in the Israeli shelling near the Sofa/Salah al-Din Street junction in the Nasr neighborhood northeast of Rafah.

The Ministry of Health announced earlier today that the death toll in the Gaza Strip since the beginning of the aggression on October 7 has reached 22,600 martyrs, with more than 70% being women and children.

The ministry also mentioned 7,000 individuals are still missing under the rubble, with difficulties in obtaining accurate numbers due to the continuous attacks and insufficient rescue missions.

Govt forms committee to probe May 9 violence



ISLAMABAD: The federal government constituted on Saturday a cabinet committee to investigate the incidents of May 9, when public and private property was vandalised by violent PTI supporters following the arrest of PTI founder.

According to the notification, the caretaker federal law and justice minister will be the convener committee. Other members of the committee include ministers of interior, information, and human rights.

The notification further stated that a new member can also be added to the committee to solve any problem.

According to the terms of reference (TORs), the committee is mandated to examine the events leading up to the incidents of 9th May, 2023, with a view to ascertain the identity and role of mastermind, planners, facilitators and executors.

The committee will analyse the causes, and determine responsibility for these events. It will evaluate their immediate and long-term implications.

The committee will suggest preventive measures to ensure that such a breach of national security is not repeated; and, recommend measures to strengthen the existing legal regime to deter such recurrences.

The Ministry of Interior will provide secretarial support to the committee. The committee shall submit its report for consideration of the cabinet within a period of fourteen days.

PML-N leadership decides to enter 'election fray' from mid-Jan



LAHORE: The top leadership of Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) has decided to enter 'election fray' from mid-January with the February 8 general election just a little over a month away.

Sources told ARY News that PML-N top leadership, Nawaz Sharif and Shehbaz Sharif, along with central leaders would address the election rallies.

Sources claimed that preparations were underway to chalk out schedule of the public gatherings ahead of the elections.

The PML-N has decided to start a series of public gatherings after allotment of party tickets and announcement of manifesto. Sources claimed the first public gathering would likely be held in Kasur if PML-N's election campaign starts from Punjab.

During his addresses, the three-time prime minister would point out "successful projects" of different eras. He would also point out the party's future economic and political strategy.

Meanwhile, PML-N leader Marriyum Aurangzeb said her party would start its election campaign from next week and present his economic agenda before people.

She also stated that the general elections in the country will be held as per schedule whoever may have been behind the resolution.

Pakistan's debt burden mounts to Rs63.399 trillion: report

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan's total debt burden continued to rise and reached a whopping Rs 63,399 trillion, at the end of November in FY2023-24.

According to details, country's total debt increased by over Rs12.430 trillion during the tenure of the PDM and the caretaker government.

Pakistan's overall debt burden surged to Rs63.399 trillion including Rs40.956 trillion domestic loan and Rs22.434 trillion in international loans.

The report further said the country's overall debt stood at Rs50.959 trillion in November 2022. The burden of the loan was recorded at Rs63.390 trillion in November 2023.

Earlier it emerged that Pakistan assured the International Monetary Fund (IMF) of the fresh loan programme.

SC seeks written assurance from govt on 'enforced disappearances'

ISLAMABAD: The Supreme Court (SC) of Pakistan has sought a written assurance from the federal government that henceforth, no one shall be picked up other than in accordance with the law.

The orders were passed as a three-member bench comprising Chief Justice of Pakistan (CJP) Qazi Faez Isa, Justice Muhammad Ali Mazhar and Justice Musarrat Ali Hila-li heard a set of pleas in connection with enforced disappearances case.

"The Federal Government is directed to submit undertaking in writing, signed by senior most officers of the concerned ministries, that henceforth no one shall be picked up other than in accordance with the law," stated a written order of Jan 3 hearing issued today.

The apex court also directed the Commission of Inquiry on Enforced Disappearances to submit 'comprehensive report' on missing persons case, along with the details of all production orders issued.

"The Commission is directed to collate and submit: (a) the names with parentage and addresses of those who went missing, (b) name and relationship of the person who reported the missing person, (c) the date they went missing, (d) those who were in government in the Federation and the concerned province at that time, (e) whether the missing person was recovered or not, and (f) if not recovered the efforts, if any, taken to find out the whereabouts of the missing person. In addition, (g) all those in respect of whom production orders were issued but were not produced, and (h) what was the follow-up by the Commission when its production orders were not complied with," stated the order.

According to the order, the 'comprehensive report' should be submitted to Attorney-General of Pakistan (AGP) within 10 days.

The written order stated that it would be appropriate if the budget, staff and resources of the Commission are disclosed, "as the people's fundamental right, under Article

Elections on Feb 8 even if OIC passes resolution, says Bilawal

LAHORE: Pakistan Peoples Party Chairman Bilawal Bhutto Zardari asserted on Saturday the general elections will take place on Feb 8 even if a resolution was passed by the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC).

"Elections will take place on Feb 8, come what may," the PPP chief said when asked to comment on the Senate resolution calling for a delay in elections over security concerns.

During his media interaction in Lahore, Bilawal recalled Chief Justice of Pakistan Qazi Faez Isa's remark about the election date being 'set in stone' which clarified the misconceptions and apprehensions about a delay in elections.

Former NAB chief, others put on notice in Tayyaba harassment case

ISLAMABAD: Former National Accountability Bureau (NAB) chairman Justice (r) Javed Iqbal and other officials in connection with the Tayyaba Gul harassment case.

According to a private media outlet, the notices were issued by FOSPAH Chairperson Fauzia Viqar on Saturday.

In 2022, Tayyaba Gul filed a case, alleging sexual harassment and rape by the former NAB chief and other officials of the anti-graft watchdog.

Gul, whose controversial video surfaced in 2019, accused Iqbal of sexual harassment during her visit to the anti-graft body's office.

In her complaint, she claimed that her clothes were torn off, and she sustained bruises during a search directed by NAB Director General Shehzad Saleem.



Lahore in grip of severe cold wave, disrupting air, vehicular traffic with dense fog

LAHORE: The provincial capital is currently in the grip of a severe cold wave, intensifying the winter chill as the city's temperature plummeted to 8 degrees Celsius on Saturday, accompanied by dense fog that shrouded Lahore, disrupting both air and vehicular traffic.



According to sources, visibility on the Lahore airport runway dwindled to less than 100 metres.

The adverse weather conditions wreaked havoc on air travel, affecting flights to and from major airports in Lahore, Karachi, Peshawar, Multan, Faisalabad, Sialkot and Islamabad, both domestically and internationally.

More than 25 flights were disrupted, causing inconvenience to countless passengers.

Key transportation routes in and around Lahore, including the Motorway, GT Road, Ring Road and others, were engulfed by thick fog. This dense fog significantly hampered visibility, leading to safety concerns for motorists.

Weather forecasts suggest that the foggy conditions might persist for the next two days, further exacerbating travel challenges.

In response to the adverse weather conditions, the M3 Motorway from Lahore to Samundri was temporarily closed due to intense fog.

The closure was not limited to this route alone, as the M1 Motorway from Peshawar to Burhan was also shut down, citing extremely low visibility caused by the fog.

The Motorway Police, through its spokesperson, requested travellers to refrain from unnecessary travel in the foggy conditions for their safety.

FAISALABAD: Aurangzeb Tanoli, Secretary General of All Pakistan Railways Pensioners' Association strongly demanded the President of Pakistan, Prime Minister, Chief Justice of Pakistan and the officials of the railways that 1 lac 35 thousand retired employees of railways across the country should not pay their pensions. Still the file is lying in the finance ministry. The pension funds have not been released yet. Every month the pensioners are facing such problems as a result of which the patience of the pensioners has been exhausted. If the

problems of the pensioners are not resolved immediately, the responsibility of the protest will fall on the organizers. We will not be responsible for this situation at all.

In an emergency meeting organized by the Secretary General of All Pakistan Railways Pensioners' Association Aurangzeb Tanoli appealed to President Arif Alvi, Caretaker Prime Minister Anwarul HaQ Qakar, Chief Justice of Pakistan Qazi Faiz Isa, Federal Minister for Finance Shahid Ashraf Tarr and Federal Minister for Railways Islamabad and to other officials that even January 6, 2024 has passed, but the

funds have not been released for the payment of pension to the old-age pensioners, widows and orphans retired from the railways. The file for approval of pension funds is on the table of the Finance Secretary from 28 December 2023 but he has not yet approved the funds. Due to which there is serious concern among the retired railway employees. The old railway retired employees are forced to scramble to get their pensions. The retired employees are forced to live a very poor life with domestic problems due to inflation. In such situations, they are unable to pay utility bills, house rent and

children's school fees. All Pakistan Pensioners Association's platform wants to convince the officials that if funds are not released immediately for pension, and in the meantime Due to lack of money for serious diseases, if someone loses his life in case of not getting medicine, or people go out to protest on the streets, then the responsibility of all this bad situation is the responsibility of the finance secretary and others too. It is strongly demanded from the platform of the association that orders be issued to release funds for pensions on an emergency basis so that the shortage of pensioners can be remedied.

Govt's machinery supports private education system

In Pakistan, parents, observing the practical benefits of the English language in daily life, prefer enrolling their children in private schools over public schools. This preference is driven by the desire of both rich and poor parents to see their children become successful individuals, leading them to choose private schools instead of government schools. Instead of embracing the public education standards, the government machinery is seen to illegitimately and unlawfully support private schools.

The school system and network emerged, leading to a simultaneous transformation and disruption of the education system structure. Schools successfully standardized the dual educational standards and the concept of "status race." Education then evolved into a business, attracting owners, traders, and businessmen. Media and NGOs actively create false and negative campaigns for government schools. Politicians and government officials criticized public schools and related institutions, creating confusion in our education system.

People of privileged backgrounds abandoned government schools, considering private schools as the path to their children's success. When a child of a shopkeeper, labourer, or low-income employee walked out of the house with a school bag slung over their shoulder, adorned with a tie, parents felt a sense of pride. Over time, schools became symbols of wealth and prosperity for

owners and their children. English usage increased, and while education improved, there was no institution or mechanism to regulate the curriculum, educational activities, and rules and regulations of these institutions. It is very bad each school became a "one and a half-inch school," with its own identity and approach. I've witnessed teachers working in these schools for as low as one thousand rupees or less without completing their matriculation. They teach for a while, change to another city if there's a better opportunity, or switch to a nearby school. Some teachers marry and move on, and if a girl remains unmarried, she may join a school after completing her education.

According to the United Nations, all countries worldwide should allocate at least four percent of their GDP for education. In Pakistan, this figure has not exceeded two percent for the past eighty years. As per the Pakistan Economic Survey, an average middle-class individual spends 60 percent of their income on their children's education. Despite this, why are we still producing children with substandard education and high dropout rates?

Over time, local schools in neighbourhoods have progressed so much that they have now reached the level of colleges and universities. These private

schools are selling international education standards and, even in the digital age, burdening children with the weight of up to twenty textbooks on their shoulders. It wouldn't be wrong to say that, currently, the most profitable businesses in Pakistan are private educational institutions. Beyond hefty monthly fees, they also charge for uniforms separately.

However, when it comes to the qualifications of teachers and the educational system, these institutions successfully deceive parents by presenting themselves as innocent.

The Punjab government has mandated that all private educational institutions in the province register their buildings as commercial buildings, which seems nearly impossible. The clear reason behind this is to reduce the profits of these educational institutions. Currently, in Punjab, rules and regulations for school registration are being relaxed, and certificates of registration are being issued to schools located in small rooms and shops. These schools lack facilities such as qualified teachers, playgrounds, libraries, and science labs.

Pakistan is lagging behind in the education system compared to countries like India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, and even Nigeria. Unfortunately, education has never been a priority for any government. The United Nations and various international organizations are actively

working on education-related projects and investments in Pakistan. However, expecting better results is impossible until the government includes education in its priorities.

Pakistan's gradually deteriorating economic situation is continuously increasing the burden of essential life necessities on the public. In this scenario, basic education, which is the responsibility of the state under Article 21 of the Constitution of Pakistan, is becoming a burden instead of serving as a fundamental need. The primary reason for this is the profit-oriented business model of private educational institutions.

In government schools, children enter in the first grade, while in private schools, their entry is in nursery and playgroups, which is considered a necessary stage according to people's perception. There is a need to eliminate these discrepancies near us. Starting admission in government schools from the nursery class could bring improvement in the enrollment process.

It's essential to establish an effective body for private schools that can audit their infrastructure, staff, teachers, curriculum, fees, basic rights, and security. We need something that can inquire, inform, and advise them. The government must address this urgently; otherwise, the education provided by private school owners is sinking in profit, leading to ruin; it's a downward spiral. But "I have no idea what my writing is going to be about. I'll put on my thinking cap and get back to you about it."


Digital messages urging UN to resolve Kashmir dispute

A noted Kashmir advocacy organization rented mobile digital advertising trucks displaying sharp messages around New York City that exhorted the United Nations to implement its decades-old resolutions pledging to the people of Kashmir their right to self-determination as they drove around the landmarks of Manhattan. The electronic screens on the trucks carried messages such as "From Kashmir to Palestine: Occupation is Crime"; "(Indian) Supreme Court Decision is a Delusion: Kashmir Needs a Resolution"; "Indian Forces on Killing Spree: Kashmir Needs to be Set Free"; "Kashmiris Reject Indian Occupation: UN Resolution Only Solution"; "Indian Brutality in Kashmir Galore: World Community Cannot Ignore"; "Kashmir Facing Existential Threat: United States Needs to Act"; "Settler Colonialism and Demographic Alterations: India Shreds UN Resolutions"; and "Indian Judiciary a False Glitter: Manipulated by Hindutva Litter".

Dr Ghulam Nabi Fai, secretary general of the Washington-based World Kashmir Awareness Forum (WKAFF), which rented the trucks, called the move an effective way to spread a message as the brightly lit words on the screens catch the attention of the people walking on the streets and those coming in and out of government and commercial buildings. The digital trucks were operational all day on Friday, passing by the UN headquarters,

Times Square, Freedom Tower, Battery Park, Central Park, Indian Mission, and Indian Consulate while crisscrossing several city streets and avenues as part of observance of Right of Self-Determination Day. On Jan. 5, 1949, the UN Security Council passed a resolution supporting the Kashmiris' right to decide their future by themselves through a UN-supervised plebiscite. In a statement issued on August 8, 2019, UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres, while commenting on the deteriorating situation in Indian-occupied Kashmir following New Delhi's annexation of the disputed territory, said,

The position of the United Nations in this region is governed by the e UN Charter a applicable Security Council I resolutions." Speaking at the event, Dr. Fai emphasized that the unresolved conflict over Kashmir threatens the international peace and security of the world. "It is far past time for the UN to take forceful action to restore the faith of common people that it is an agency that can live up to its bold charter and mission of bringing peace and stability to the world," he said.

Import and export cargo throughput handled by the port totaled 4.08 million tonnes, an increase of 34.5 percent year on year. The port handled 375,000 TEUs (twenty-foot equivalent units) of goods during the year, an increase of 39.4 percent.

Erenhot Port is the largest land port between China and Mongo-



lia, and the only port of entry and exit on the middle corridor of the China-Europe freight train service.

Goods transported by China-Europe freight trains pass-

ing through Erenhot Port include footwear and apparel, mechanical and electrical products, vehicles and car parts, among some 1,000 categories of commodities.

World food price index falls in December

UNITED NATIONS: The United Nations Food Agency's World Price Index ended last year about 10% below its 2022, with values in December also down from the previous month, helping further ease concerns over global food price inflation.

The Rome-based Food and Agriculture Organization's (FAO) price index, which tracks the most globally traded food commodities, averaged 118.5 points in December, down 1.5% from November and 10.1% below December 2022 levels. For 2023 as a whole, the index averaged 13.7% below year-earlier levels, with only sugar prices higher over the period. The FAO's sugar price index did, however, decline 16.6% in

December from November.

The FAO Cereal Price Index increased 1.5 per cent from November, as wheat, maize, rice, and barley prices all rose, partly reflecting logistical disruptions that hindered shipments from major exporting countries.

For the year as a whole, the index was 15.4 per cent below the 2022 average, reflecting well-supplied global markets, although FAO's All Rice Price Index (part of the FAO Cereal Price Index) registered a 21 per cent increase, largely owing to concerns about the impact of El Niño on rice production and in the aftermath of export restrictions imposed by India.

The FAO Vegetable Oil Price Index by contrast, declined by 1.4 per cent from November, reflect-

ing subdued purchases of palm, soy, rapeseed, and sunflower seed oil, with soy oil in particular impacted by a slowdown in demand from the biodiesel sector as well as improving weather conditions in major growing areas of Brazil. For 2023 as a whole, this index was 32.7 per cent below the previous year's level.

The FAO Sugar Price Index declined 16.6 per cent from November, hitting a nine-month low although still up 14.9 per cent from December 2022.

The plunge in sugar quotations was mainly driven by the strong pace of production in Brazil, along with the reduced use of sugarcane for ethanol production in India.

The FAO Meat Price Index dipped 1.0 per cent from November, reaching a level 1.8 per cent

below that of December 2022, impacted by persistent weak import demand from Asia for pig meat. Regional buying interest also slowed for bovine and poultry meat despite ample exportable supplies in large producing regions.

Ovine meat prices by contrast rose ahead of holidays. Bucking the trend, the FAO Dairy Price Index increased by 1.6 per cent from November, although still standing 16.1 per cent below its December 2022 value. The monthly increase was led by higher price quotations for butter and cheese, underpinned by strong internal sales in Western Europe ahead of the holiday season. At the same time, strong global import demand led international whole milk powders to rise.

Heidi Green, a psychology student at King Saud University, says coming to Saudi Arabia 'was the right thing'

JEDDAH: Heidi Green is loving her new life in Saudi Arabia, far away from her American roots. Effortlessly conversing in fluent Arabic, she seems to be adapting quite well in Riyadh.

Green has been living in Riyadh for almost two years. Since arriving, she has always been complimentary about her experiences in the Kingdom.


The move from the US to Riyadh was not an instant decision. She had been applying for jobs in Saudi Arabia since 2014 and had no idea about Saudi Vision 2030.

Heidi Green came to the Kingdom not only to discover a new culture but also to pursue a master's degree in psychology from King Saud University.

She told Arab News: "I feel lucky I was guided here." She also believes that her life has turned around and she is enjoying every minute of it.

"I was born in Utah, grew up in Las Vegas, and lived most of my adult life in Hawaii and the Washington D. C. area, and now am achieving my long-time goal by living in Riyadh," she added.

Speaking in high spirits from her home in Riyadh about how her journey began, she said: "Americans live here but don't often assimilate to the culture. My journey started by learning Arabic and making Saudi friends in the US. I went to cultural events and sometimes interpreted into Sign Language for deaf students. My love for Saudi



Arabia grew during that time."

Living in Saudi Arabia, Green is open to new experiences and exploring the country through the people. (Supplied)

Green is an American Sign Language interpreter who interprets between English and ASL, as well as Arabic and ASL. She is also proficient in Saudi Sign Language.

When Green told her family she was moving to Saudi Arabia, they were not shocked, but worried that she was going to a country considered by Americans to be deeply conservative.

"I (had) talked about Saudi Arabia for years, so it was not a surprise for them, but they expressed their fear. The unknown always has an element of fear. Some tried to convince me against it. I told them I would either go to Saudi Arabia or die trying, so they knew I was determined. I felt strongly it was the right thing for me," she said.

I always show people the positive aspects of Saudi Arabia, although there's no need to prove anything because people will learn and see for themselves what Saudi Arabia is all about as it continues to make a global impact.

"I studied psychology in America and Britain, but I want to see psychology in Saudi Arabia because I see that society is healthy and beautiful here."

Explaining the significance of pursuing further education in the Kingdom's cultural context, she said: "The field of psychology uses methods historically rooted from one culture. As a result, our understanding of 'disorders' and how they are categorized is flawed, and misdiagnoses is a problem. Improvement will come from multicultural perspectives."

"I wanted to understand psychology from a collectivist culture. I was fascinated by Saudi


families and the psychological impacts of societal values. Also, through my career I research psychological well-being at work. Saudi Arabia is a great place to explore that topic because of transformation."

Going to a foreign country may be challenging mainly due to the cultural differences, but for Green, getting to know Saudi culture has opened doors to a new and exciting experience. She said that she "was eager to show respect for the culture," as she "didn't want to assume my way was right, I wanted to hear other perspectives."

"As I became part of the community, I was thinking about things I never considered before, like, should I cover my hair at work? How much should I socialize with men? Is it OK to show my face on social media?"

Explaining the impact this cultural exchange had on her, she said: "I learned a lot that way. It transformed me positively. Assimilation into a new society with new rules helps you learn about yourself. You must analyze and understand values deeply, and bargain with yourself how much you will or will not change, as a result of learning. In that process I became stronger and found that I could be myself here and was accepted."

Settling into Saudi society and adapting to her new life was aided by her ability to speak almost fluently in Arabic, which she learned through watching Saudi shows before coming to the Kingdom. She watched



"Khawatir" and read the book "40" by the documentary show's host Ahmed Al-Shugairi. To learn Najdi dialect, she watched "Masameer County" and Telfaz11 comedies.

"Comedy is a great language learning tool," Green said. "It exaggerates things, so you see nuances and culturally shared experiences. I grew to love the culture from these shows. I am inspired by their creators who paved the way for the film industry emerging in Saudi Arabia

now. As it grows, there will likely be more people like me who love Saudi Arabia and want to learn Arabic because storytelling is powerful."

Living in the Kingdom, Green is open to new experiences and exploring the country through the people. "I've talked to random people from Makkah to Qassim to Hafir Al-Batin. Once a driver took me to his camel farm and I met his family. Other times I've met sheikhs, CEOs, and actors. I have also sat in the

homes of many Saudi families, and families from nearby countries. I love learning about tribe histories and traditions. I find many opportunities by simply talking to people with genuine interest. Knowing Arabic helps, too," she said.

Green is often asked whether she feels safe in Saudi Arabia. "Safety is something I value. When I travel, I miss Saudi Arabia, and when I'm back, it feels like coming home because it's safe. I feel if I had an emergency, the people, neighbors, and systems around me would help," she said.

Commenting on how Saudis are building on Vision 2030, she said: "I admire Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman for delivering on promises, supporting women, and making Saudi dreams happen. Saudi Arabia has improved life for its citizens and shown social responsibility to the world through green initiatives, international aid, and diplomacy efforts."

After having lived in Riyadh for several years, Green realizes that many assumptions people make about Saudi Arabia are wrong.

"Most misconceptions are dissolving, which is great. I always show people the positive aspects of Saudi Arabia, although there's no need to prove anything because people will learn and see for themselves what Saudi Arabia is all about as it continues to make a global impact."

Nauman Khalid said that CDA would give possession of auctioned plots on payment of 75% of the premium while a 10% rebate would be given on payment of the lumpsum amount. He also briefed the business community about various development initiatives of CDA including the development of a cycling lane in Islamabad to reduce traffic congestion, the introduction of more bus routes, digitization of land records, automation of approval of building



plans and automated parking, etc.

Ahsan Zafar Bakhtawari, President, Islamabad Chamber of Commerce & Industry said that CDA should ensure the provision of all required infrastructure and civic amenities for the plots being auctioned to save the investors from unnecessary problems.

FBR restructuring on agenda to improve governance, efficiency, effectiveness

ISLAMABAD: The Finance Ministry said here on Saturday that restructuring of the Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) was on the government's agenda to improve its governance, efficiency and effectiveness.

The ministry in a press statement said, certain proposals have been prepared in line with international best practices to rationalize and streamline the functions of the FBR, strengthen the FBR policy board, and overall governance, integrity and performance of the revenue agency based on a creative oversight structure that would enhance its accountability to the state and clients.

The creation of specialized administrative structures will be accompanied by

better delegation & accountability of administration, it added.

According to the statement, an institutional mechanism is being considered to establish a Tax policy group with the right expertise and analytical capability to facilitate rationalization of the tax regime emphasizing fairness and equity in the tax regime. These proposals have been prepared by the government after months of deliberation and consultation with experts, academics, and senior leadership of FBR and its members.

However, these proposals do not include any item relating to the downsizing of the workforce or any outside interference in the administrative matters of Customs or Inland Revenue service by any other agency and ministry, the ministry clarified.

Cut in key policy rate vital to ensure Ease of Doing Business: APBF

ISLAMABAD: As the central bank is likely to announce the new monetary policy in the next meeting this month, the All Pakistan Business Forum (APBF) has called for a cut in the monetary policy rate to attain the high position in Ease of Doing Business ranking, amidst record high markup rate, hyperinflation and rising energy prices.

The APBF President Syed Maaz Mahmood said that already unprecedented inflation and high markup rate have drastically reduced private sector borrowings during the outgoing fiscal year, besides the country has been far behind in the ease of

doing business ranking. So, further hike in discount rate will deteriorate the economic conditions, he added.

Maaz Mahmood said that the central bank raised its key interest rate to 22 percent, exceeding investor expectations, as the cash-strapped country attempts to encourage the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to release critical funding. The key rate of the State Bank of Pakistan now stands at 22 percent, its highest level since October 1996.

Now, there are reports that the SBP would raise the interest rate by another 1 percent at the upcoming meeting of the Monetary Policy Committee (MPC) to please IMF.

Chinese company exports 160 high-end electric buses to Pakistan

BEIJING: A Chinese company handed over 160 high-end pure electric buses to Pakistan at a ceremony held in Suzhou Industrial Park, China. The officials from Pakistan, including General Manager Suzhou Higer, Qiu Yuanhong, Deputy General Manager Xie Jianghong, Customer Service Director Jiang Haifeng, and General Manager of Overseas Sales, attended the ceremony.

The value of the order exceeds RMB 150 million, which is the first time that Pakistan has introduced

pure electric buses in large quantities, China Economic Net (CEN) reported. The officials from Pakistan delivered speeches, respectively, expressing high recognition for this batch of buses. The day before the ceremony, the Pakistani side tested these buses, which performed perfectly in appearance, performance, and all other aspects. Currently, Higer's new energy buses have occupied the largest market share in Pakistan, contributing to Pakistan's green and low-carbon travel. Since entering the Pakistani market in 2006, in response to the local dusty and congested

road traffic characteristics, Higer has continued to carry out technological innovation and customize high-quality buses for Pakistan that can calmly cope with the local climate environment and complex road conditions. The batch of pure electric buses exported this time has the advantages of zero emissions, low operating costs, and low noise pollution, which will greatly improve the efficiency of public transportation operations and the quality of residents' travel. In addition, the cruising range of the buses exceeds 250 kilometers, and the entire vehicle uses



the most advanced cathodic electroplating technology, which has an anti-corrosion period of more than ten years.

In terms of software intelligence, 160 pure electric buses are equipped with the intelligent operation system T-BOX, which can monitor driver behavior and vehicle operation data in real time to ensure operational safety and protect passenger

travel. As an important part of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor and the Belt and Road Initiative, the transportation field will continue to usher in more efficient and green reforms in the future.

The arrival of 160 e-buses to Pakistan is a new starting point, promoting the high-quality development of CPEC and BRI in the field of public transportation.

LONDON: The England cricket team will carry Manchester United chef Omar Meziane on their Test tour to India, English media outlet The Telegraph reported Saturday.

According to the details, the decision to carry their own chef was taken in a bid to try and avoid players from getting ill during their seven-week-long trip to India.

"England will take their own chef on tour to India later this month to try and avoid players falling ill during the seven-week trip. The chef will join the squad in Hyderabad before the first Test on January 25 in an attempt to keep on top of the players' nutrition," The Telegraph reported.

Notably, this is not the first time that the England team would carry their own



chef on a tour to a sub-continent nation.

Omar Meziane also accompanied England on their historic tour to Pakistan in December 2021.

England, however, insisted that the measure did not mean to undermine the local hotels but to ensure players' safeguard, especially those who are reluctant

to eat spicy food.

"England insist it has nothing to do with not trusting hotels to provide clean facilities and is instead about ensuring players, especially those who refuse to eat spicy food, are eating nutritious meals rather than filling up on energy bars and pizzas," the publication reported.

It is worth mentioning here that England will tour India for a five-match Test series, scheduled to run from January 25 to March 7.

England last won a Test series in India in 2012 and have been hammered in the nation since then.

But with an aggressive approach — casually called BazBall — adopted after the appointment of Ben Stokes and Brendon McCullum as England's Test captain and head coach respectively, the side will be hoping for a better outcome from their tour of India.

Babar Azam hard worker, but needs 'big innings': Mohammad Hafeez

SYDNEY: Pakistan Cricket team's Director Mohammad Hafeez Saturday said former captain Babar Azam is a hard worker and trains hard in practice sessions, but needs a "big" innings to restore his confidence.

The veteran cricketer's statement during a post-match presser in Australia after the Green Shirts lost their third and final match in the Test series against the Aussies, keeping the score 3-0.

"A big innings will restore his confidence. Red ball cricket brings sophistication to the game. A red-ball cricketer can play all formats," Hafeez said, adding that red-ball cricket polishes the skills of cricketers.

The team director appreciated the former skipper for playing well in matches but also hinted at letting Babar rest. He said it is important to consider what the former skipper himself wishes. He

Hafeez maintained that the management is there for Babar if it requires any help. "Not necessarily to rest, [he] can talk about improving any technique."

Speaking about Shaheen Shah Afridi, the veteran cricketer said the pacer himself sought rest ahead of the third Test. "[We] rested Shaheen Afridi due to workload. We didn't want him to suffer any injuries due to the workload. Shaheen's return after injury put a lot of load on him," he said, adding that the management doesn't want to ruin anyone's career due to workload.

"The impression that Shaheen was rested because of the T20 series is wrong," he added.

Meanwhile, the veteran batter acknowledged pacer Naseem Shah's talent but said he was replaced by Aamer Jamal, as he is suffering from injury.

"It is not like the team can't function without him or his injury is causing immense damage to the team," he added.

The fast bowler has been reeling from an injury he endured during an Asia Cup game last year in September. According to an update shared by the Pakistan Cricket Board, Shah started the final stage of his rehabilitation at the National Cricket Academy (NCA) in Lahore in December 2023.

Hafeez, when commenting on the performance of the team in the Test series, said Pakistan played good cricket during the tour of Australia.

"There were moments that the team could not capitalise on immediately. The Melbourne Test was defeated due to dropped catches," said Hafeez.

He added that the mistakes made on the tour also need to be corrected. Australia beat Pakistan by eight wickets in the third and last Test match, drawing a curtain to the Green Shirts' hopes to conclude a run of 16 successive losses in the host nation since 1995.

Pakistan could add only 47 runs to their overnight tally at the cost of the last three wickets, to be dismissed for 115 an hour before lunch.

Commenting on the matter of match fee, Hafeez said he would share a proposal with the International Cricket Council (ICC) regarding Test cricket remuneration.

Australia defeat Pakistan by eight wickets in third Test

ISLAMABAD: David Warner enjoyed a fairytale finish to his Test career as his half-century spearheaded Australia's comfortable chase of the 130-run target on day four of the SCG Test against Pakistan. Australia's eight-wicket win, following victories in Perth and Melbourne, sees them claim a series sweep over Pakistan.

The day began with solid resistance offered by Mohammad Rizwan and Aamir Jamal over the course of the first hour, according to information made available here by the Pakistan Cricket Board.

The two nudged the ball around to help Pakistan cross the 100-run mark before Rizwan (28, 57b, 1x4) eventually fell to Nathan Lyon. The

wicketkeeper-batter, who ends the series as Pakistan's leading scorer with 193 runs in four innings, inside-edged the Lyon delivery to Warner at first slip.

Pakistan's woes worsened when Aamir (18, 47b, 2x4s) was caught by Travis Head at deep square leg while attempting to whack one out of the park off the bowling of Pat Cummins. Lyon did the honors of taking the last Pakistan wicket to fall when he dismissed Hasan Ali as the visitors were all out for 115.

Australia's pursuit of the modest target of 130 was disrupted early with the wicket of Usman Khawaja in the first over. Khawaja, dismissed for naught, was beaten by a Sajid Khan delivery to hit his pads and was adjudged LBW.

The first-over wicket did little to deter Australia's charge

as Warner unleashed an array of attacking strokes to put his team in the ascendancy. He employed some adventurous strokeplay, marked by the use of switch-hits and reverse sweeps, to bring up the 37th and final fifty of his Test career.

Australia went to lunch needing only 39 runs more for victory, with Marnus Labuschagne also growing in confidence. With Australia 11 runs short of the target, Sajid removed Warner (57, 75b, 7x4s) following a successful review of an LBW shout turned down by the on-field umpire.

Labuschagne knocked off the winning run, finishing the chase unbeaten on 62 off 73 balls with nine fours.

Aamir was declared player of the match for his stellar 82 in the first inning, followed by

a brilliant six-fer with the ball. Meanwhile, Australia captain Cummins was named player of the series for his series-topping tally of 19 wickets.

The post-match presentation ceremony, highlighted by heartwarming tributes for Warner, also saw Pakistan skipper Shan Masood present a signed Babar Azam jersey as a parting gift to the retiring opener.

President orders restoration of WAPDA welfare grant to special person

ISLAMABAD: President Dr Arif Alvi has directed WAPDA to immediately pay/restore the welfare grant to a retired employee's special child from the date of its discontinuation. He also ordered WAPDA to initiate disciplinary proceedings against delinquent officials who decided to stop the welfare grant despite the fact that the grant had been issued for life after fulfilling the required criteria.

While accepting a representation of Syed Noor

Ali Zaidi (the complainant) against Wafaqi Mohtasib's decision, the President said that the delinquent officials caused an embarrassing situation, not only for the family of a retired employee but also for WAPDA by unjustly stopping the welfare grant to a person with disability (PWD) who had been declared unemployable for life and was totally dependent on his parents. He added that WAPDA should contact the Ministry of Human Rights, which had a definite program to teach more than 50 skill sets

to PWDs and later link them to possible employers. He stressed that on such issues, it was the responsibility of institutions like WAPDA to guide PWDs, take social responsibility, and ensure that they become employable.

The President in his decision observed that a few key facts had escaped the notice of the Wafaqi Mohtasib, which established that the complainant was entitled to the welfare grant. He pointed out that the complainant had been declared by WAPDA's own Medical Board as "Deaf and

Dumb since birth", "unemployable for life" and "totally dependent on his parents" in 1996. He further observed that the Managing Committee of WWF had sanctioned a welfare grant for life for the complainant in 1996. He also referred to WWF Rules which provided for the provision of welfare grants to special children of WAPDA employees subject to the provision of medical certificates. He added that NADRA had also issued a CNIC to the complainant depicting him as a "person with disability for life".

The President concluded that the welfare grant was issued to the complainant as per rules and the question that who decided to stop the welfare grant and why needed to be investigated. He rejected the order of Wafaqi Mohtasib and directed WAPDA to immediately pay the welfare grant to the complainant from the date of discontinuation. He also asked WAPDA to initiate disciplinary proceedings against delinquent officials and report compliance within 30 days to the Mohtasib.

Dr. Al-Maliki receives a phone call from his French counterpart

ISLAMABAD: Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates, Dr. Riyadh Al-Maliki, received a phone call from French Foreign Minister Catherine Corona, in which she affirmed her country's condemnation of the disgraceful statements issued by several Israeli officials, led by Ministers Ben Gvir and Smotrich, which incite the displacement of Palestinian citizens from the Gaza Strip. She also reiterated her country's commitment to provide all forms of humanitarian support and urgent aid to the residents of the Gaza Strip to alleviate the suffering they have been facing since the declaration of war on the Gaza Strip three months ago, and the last of that aid was sending two ships loaded with hundreds of tons of aid to alleviate the extent of that suffering. She also stressed that her country rejects all forms of Israel-



li interference in the future of the Gaza Strip, which along with the West Bank forms a single geographical unit, and that the future of the occupied Palestinian territory is determined by its citizens, and her country's commitment to providing support to the Palestinian Authority to carry out its duties to the fullest extent as a legitimate authority over all of the Palestinian land.

For his part, Minister Al-Maliki thanked France for the assistance it provided

and is providing to alleviate the amount of suffering that came as a result of the war declared unilaterally by Israel, which aims to complete genocide against our people in the Gaza Strip and destroy all elements of life there. Minister Al-Maliki focused on the need to pay attention to restoring the health sector. Because of its importance in providing treatment for this large number of wounded who no longer have any opportunity for treatment within the

Gaza Strip after the occupying state completely destroyed the health sector, he called on France to establish field hospitals in many areas within the Gaza Strip to alleviate the burden of the health situation and provide the minimum amount of treatment for the wounded. And the sick. He also drew the minister's attention to the occupation army's bombing of aid trucks entering the Gaza Strip despite prior coordination with them for the movement of those trucks, or the bombing of citizens who adhere to the instructions of the occupation army to leave their areas and head to the so-called safe roads or safe areas, but they are not safe from conspiracy. The occupation army opened fire on them and bombed them with tanks and planes. Minister Al-Maliki also expressed to his French counterpart his country's rejection of all the impractical proposals issued by some Israeli officials regard-

ing their vision for the day following the end of the war, and rejected any presence of the Israeli army on the land of the Gaza Strip under any name of occupation, security, military intervention, iron control, or surveillance. On the entry of goods and aid or any other capacity, he also affirmed his refusal to appoint new village associations in the Gaza Strip, or to appoint local committees that follow the orders of the occupation army, stressing that the Palestinian National Authority is the only body authorized to administer the Gaza Strip just as it administers the West Bank, and it is the only legitimate decision-maker.

The two ministers agreed to continue communications between them due to the importance of reviewing and following up on all issues raised or new developments, and the necessary coordination to serve the common goals between the two countries.

PTI Spokesperson castigates PML-N for awarding tickets to conscience sellers

DROs are set to declare their decisions on these objections or suggestions from January 12 to 17, with the final list of polling stations to be revealed 15 days before the elections.

FBR to be restructured to streamline, improve accountability: reports

ISLAMABAD: The restructuring of FBR is on the agenda of the Government, to improve its governance, efficiency and effectiveness. Certain proposals have been prepared in line with international best practices to rationalize and streamline the functions of the FBR, strengthen the FBR policy board, and overall governance, integrity and performance of the revenue agency based on a creative oversight structure that would enhance its accountability to the state and clients. The creation of specialized administrative structures will be accompanied by better delegation & accountability of administration. An institutional mechanism is being considered to establish a Tax Policy group with the right expertise and analytical capability to facilitate rationalization of tax regime emphasizing fairness and equity in tax regime.

These proposals have been



prepared by the government after months of deliberation and consultation with experts, academics, and senior leadership of FBR and its members. However, these proposals do not include any item relating to the downsizing of workforce or any outside interference in the administrative matters of Customs or Inland Revenue service by any other agency and ministry.

Reports carried by digital media on the restructuring of the Federal Board of Revenue misrepresent the objective and scope of reforms that are much needed to lift the tax/GDP ratio, while ensuring level playing in burden sharing and allowing for tax and investment facilities.

Fazlur Rehman says TTP on agenda during upcoming Afghanistan visit

ISLAMABAD: Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam-Fazl (JUI-F) chief Maulana Fazlur Rehman has stated that the issue of the banned Tehreek-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) is set to be discussed during his upcoming visit to Afghanistan, a private media outlet has reported.

The JUI-F chief was interacting with a group of reporters at his Islamabad residence on Saturday.

Fazlur Rehman was extended an invitation by the interim Afghan government last month, marking his first visit to Afghanistan since the Taliban assumed control in 2021.

His previous visit to Afghanistan took place in 2013, when he met with Hamid Karzai, the then-president.

Fazl confirmed receiving an invitation with the approval of the Taliban supreme leader, and he expressed his intention to meet with Sheikh Haibatullah Akhundzada, the rare-



ly accessible supreme leader of the Taliban, during his trip to Kandahar.

Responding to inquiries about addressing the TTP issue with the Afghan authorities, Fazl acknowledged the possibility, emphasising the use of his diplomatic ties for positive outcomes.

Regarding his representation of the government, the JUI-F chief clarified that although his party organised the visit, he had been in contact with the Foreign Office and relevant government officials. He asserted that the visit would consider the interests of both Pakistan and Afghanistan.

Parvez Elahi once again hospitalised with chest infection

RAWALPINDI: Former Punjab chief minister Chaudhry Parvez Elahi has once again been shifted to hospital from Adiala Jail due to chest pain.

Doctors diagnosed chest infection after Parvez Elahi's thallium scan was done at the Rawalpindi Institute of Cardiology (RIC) last

week.

Jail sources say detailed medical examination of Elahi will be done. His medical examination was also conducted in the jail's hospital as usual.

Elahi was detained in Adiala Jail for his alleged involvement in various cases including money laundering and illegal appointments in the Punjab Assembly.
