WASHINGTON: Tens and thousands of demonstrators rallied and marched in Washington, D. C., on Saturday to demand an end to Israel's deadly military campaign in Gaza, marking almost 100 days since the start of the Israel-Palestinians ians per day. The march, one of the biggest in this capital city, was ian groups who are calling for a permanent cease-fire in Gaza, an end to US funding for the Israeli military, and for Israel to be held accountable for war crimes and calling on the president to secure violations of international law.

Armed clash leaves one dead near Thatta



Innovative solutions a must for early retirement of coal powered plants under CPEC: Experts

ISLAMABAD: Experts at a webinar stressed the need for exploring innovative financing mechanisms in the context of Pakistan's energy sector to facilitate the early retirement of coal power plants under China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC).

The webinar titled, 'Scoping the Feasibility of Early Retirement of Coal Power Plants under CPEC, was organized by the Sustainable Development Policy Institute (SDPI) here. Speaking on the occasion, Dr Khalid Waleed, SDPI Research Fellow, remarked that Pakistan's energy landscape is dominated reliance on indigenous coal a viable solu-

sus to create conducive environment to boost investments in energy sector. He underscored the need to move beyond theory and make a bankable case for retiring the coal power plants in Pakistan, which is acceptable to investors and is financially sustainable.

Shuang Liu, the Senior Associate and China Finance Lead at the World Resources Institute (WRI), emphasized the importance of gaining a clear understanding of investor motivations and the constraints that exist in the early retirement of these plants. She highlighted the need to revisit and renegotiate terms, particularly with the major finanby affordability crisis, which makes the cial institutions such as the China Devel-

opment Bank and EXIM Bank. Haneea Isaad, Energy Finance Mustafa Hyder Sayed, the Executive Analyst at the Institute for Energy Director of Pakistan-China Institute, Economics and Financial Analysis

She called for including social cost of emissions from coal power plants in estimation processes.

Christoph Nedopil Wang, Director of Griffith Asia Institute, cited Egypt as a successful model in executing a debt-forclimate swap, showcasing the potential for innovative financial arrangements to address climate-related challenges, which can resolve the financial challenges faced by Pakistan.

Ubaid ur Rehman Zia, SDPI Senior Research Associate, said that the recent 3rd Belt and Road Forum and COP28 underscored the crucial role of energy transition in tackling climate change. Global trends, coupled with the decreasing costs of renewable energy, have transformed it into both environmentally and economically viable solutions, he added.

We look forward to creating a more just and inclusive society through widespread human rights literacy," said chairperson NCHR Rabiya Javeri Agha. She said, "NCHR recognizes the pivotal role of human rights institutions in contributing to the formulation and execution of human rights education programs." In line with this objective, the Commission has been actively engaged in forging partnerships with esteemed universities and educational institutes across the country." "This partnership, in accordance with its mandate under Section 9(h) of its Act, is crucial to NCHR's program on human rights education, building knowledge about human rights, changing attitudes and behaviors, and promoting a culture of tolerance and peace." An NCHR team, led by Member Balochistan Prof. Farkhanda Aurangzeb, recently engaged in several meetings with key stakeholders in various universities.

The team recently held two meetings at the Higher Education Commission (HEC), with Chairman Dr. Mukhtar Ahmad emphasizing the renewal of an MoU to strengthen collaboration in the realm of human rights education. Notably, fruitful discussions were held with Professor Dr. Tahir Khalily, Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities at Shifa Tameer-e-Millat University, Islamabad, and Vice Chancellor of Fatima Jinnah Women University, Rawalpindi, Dr. Uzaira Rafique. take pride in hailing from my beautiful hometown, Quetta, and my beloved province, Balochistan. It's a unique province with vast barren land but abundant mineral wealth. Despite the absence of permanent rivers, our water needs are met through rain and snow, replenishing aquifers to sustain the entire human and animal population. The province also stands out for its demographic diversity. It's neatly divided into two major ethnicities, with Balochs in the south and Pathans in the north. Quetta, on the other hand, is a melting pot, hosting settlers from various ethnic backgrounds like Punjabi, Kashmiri, Sindhi, Hazara, and more. My own Kashmiri family resides in Quetta, fostering strong bonds with Pashtoon, Baloch, and Hazara friends. Both the Pathan and Baloch ethnicities are deeply rooted in tribal societies, often regarded as some of the most beautiful communities in the world. These societies value honesty, trustworthiness, truthfulness, friendliness, and hospitality. The people prioritize honor and dignity above all else and guard it against any threat. It's important to note that this commitment to honor doesn't imply a hostile posture unless they face denigration, insult, deception, or a trampling of their honor and dignity. Once these communities declare someone as an

enemy, however, they become formida- as Nawabs and Sardars. ble foes. They are known to pursue their enemies relentlessly for generations if necessary. This fierce loyalty and determination are integral aspects of their cultural values.

Now, the significant question arises: why did groups like the Tehrik-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and the Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) emerge from these culturally rich societies? How did they transform into formidable and lethal

entities? Before delving deeper, it's essential to distinguish the Pathan and Baloch communities within the religious context.

The Pathan community is predominantly religious, actively practicing Islam through rituals such as offering prayers, observing fasting, and perform-

ing Hajj. However, in societal conduct, their primary adherence is to the Pashtunwali code of life. They can readily align with movements that claim to uphold Islamic values, as perceived by them, and may fiercely engage in struggles aligned with these principles. On the contrary, the Baloch commu-

nity is not as inherently inclined toward religious practices. While maintaining the distinct identity of each Baloch tribe, they follow a tribal code of conduct rooted in traditions and customs. This code is adhered to not only by the general populace but also by figures of authority such

The lethal, violent, and inhuman activities perpetrated by both the Tehrik-i-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) and the Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA) are in no way aligned with either the Pashtunwali code of the Pathan community or the tribal code followed by the Baloch. These acts of violence, insurgency, terrorism, and extremism are foreign to the inherent values and conduct of both societies. Such streaks of violence starkly contrast

> The seeds of these violent tendencies were planted during a time when both the USA and USSR were actively seeking allies world-


wide, making friends of their enemies' enemies. My first hand experience in college in Quetta during (1978-82) reflects this, where the propaganda arms of both superpowers were actively engaging Pathan and Baloch students. Through offers of free books, cash incentives, scholarships, and all-expenses-paid trips to their respective countries, they sought to sway student leaders to their side. In addition to these inducements, they provided financial support and furnished lethal arms and ammunition. Once student leaders were effectively brought on board, they were strategically pitted against governments they

opposed, serving as vocal proponents of either capitalist or socialist ideologies.

The USA found common ground with Pathans, utilizing religion as a catalyst and supporting them with weapons and financial aid. They manipulated them into denouncing the USSR as Kafir (infidel) during the Cold War, but eventually left them without clear support. India, seizing an opportunity, stepped in and employed a similar strategy—using religion as a foundation, providing financial support and weapons. They redirected their focus toward a new enemy, the state of Pakistan, and encouraged politico-religious parties, assuming their religious nature would align with the Taliban's resistance against the government. Recent attacks on the JUI (Jamiat Ulema-e-Islam) are likely driven by the

same motive. Shifting focus to the Balochistan Liberation Army (BLA), the USA attempted a similar strategy by aligning Baloch interests against the USSR. However, this approach proved less effective with the Balochs. Unlike the Pathans, the Baloch people prioritize their tribal code over other considerations, including religion. Recognizing this distinction, the USSR strategically leveraged nationalism, combined with financial support and weapons. This potent combination resonated well with the Baloch, who passionately began demanding complete control over provincial resources, including minerals, gas, oil, and land.

On August 5, 2019, Prime Minister Narendra Modi's Indian government took a controversial step in revoking Article 370 of the Indian Constitution, causing significant implications for the state. Article 370, integrated into the Indian Constitution in 1949, provided special autonomy to Jammu and Kashmir, allowing it to have its constitution, autonomy over internal administration. and limited legislative powers. The decision aimed to eliminate the special status of the region, integrating it more closely with the rest of India. The government argued that Article 370 had impeded development, hindered national integration, and fostered a sense of isolation with a separate set of laws for Jammu and Kashmir. This move led to the reorganization of Jammu and Kashmir into two separate Union Territories - Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh, marking a significant shift in governance structure. The scrapping of Article 370 also nullified Article 35A, which granted the state legislature the power to define 'permanent residents' and accord them special rights and privileges. The political landscape underwent substantial changes, including the dissolution of the assembly and elections conducted under the new Union Territory framework.

'India Out': Maldives tells India to pull out troops amid tense ties

Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu has issued a deadline for India to withdraw its military personnel from the island nation, emphasising that Indian troops must leave by March 15.

This announcement comes in the wake of Muizzu's recent state visit to China, marking an upgrade in diplomatic ties with Beijing.

Diplomatic tensions between India and Maldives escalated follow $ing\,derogatory\,comments\,made\,by\,Maldivian\,ministers\,against\,Indian$ Prime Minister Narendra Modi, leading to their dismissal. President Muizzu, in response to the criticism, asserted, "We may be small, but no one has the licence to bully us."

Abdulla Nazim Ibrahim, the public policy secretary at the President's Office, stressed, "Indian military personnel cannot stay in the Maldives. This is the policy of President Dr Mohamed Muizzu and that of this administration." Reports indicate the presence of approximately 88 Indian troops in Maldives.

The call for the withdrawal of Indian troops aligns with President Muizzu's election promise and his "India Out" campaign. Both nations have established a high-level core group to negotiate the troop withdrawal, with the group's inaugural meeting held at the Foreign Ministry Headquarters in Male'.

Cost-Push Inflation, Monetary Tightening and Pakistan's Stagnant Economy

he second edition of IMF's World Economic Outlook (2023) forecasted Pakistan's GDP growth rate to 2.5% and raised the country's anticipated inflation rate to 23.6% for FY24. Amid slowly declining global core inflation, the IMF advised central banks to avoid prematurely easing monetary policy. The IMF's recommendation of a tight monetary policy across the globe is a universal prescription, a kind of one-size-fits-all solution, rather than taking into account the local economic situation of different economies. For instance, despite the economic depression that Pakistan is experiencing, IMF recommendations of fiscal austerity and maintaining an incredibly high interest rate would reduce public and private investment hence deepening Pakistan's stagflation. Moreover, monetary contractions have welfare implications (increase poverty, worsen the inequality and unemployment) as highlighted in Social Footprint of Monetary Policy by Javed (2021). He stated that, "In 2018–19, the SBP raised the interest rate from 6% to 13.2% in less than a year in order to manage the growing current account deficit and balance of payment crisis. The GDP growth rate decreased from 4.8% to 1.9% as the economy slowed down, and large-scale manufacturing saw a steep decline. Industries were shut down. Poverty struck millions of people. The balance of payment was settled at the cost of millions losing their jobs and livelihoods. There can be serious repercussions for a society when large distributional and intergenerational issues are ignored in policy decision".

Even though Central banks around

est rate instruments to dampen the inflation, this kind of monetary policy fails to account for supply shock disruptions. The State Bank of Pakistan also raised the policy rate to control inflation, however, since inflation in Pakistan is not demand push but caused by supply side factors particularly food shortages and hike in energy product prices. In the face of supply shocks, which can lead to cost-push inflation, the central bank might choose to look



through and tolerate a temporary deviation from their inflation target. For example, in 2011 the UK saw a few instances of cost-push inflation when it increased above 5%, primarily as a result of a substantial increase in global energy prices and depreciation of the pound. The monetary policy committee of Bank of England, however, did not raise the interest rate, when the shock subsided and the inflation rate returned to the target level of 2%. As mentioned, Pakistan's high and persistent inflation is mainly cost-push, rendering interest rates an ineffective instrument, so advising monetary tightening will entail real economic losses for the society and exacerbate the country's economic problems. In addition, interest rate inflation would raise the cost of borrowing for the formal sector already suffering from low-capacity utilization due to an import crunch. Keeping a record high interest rate makes it difficult for businesses to grow as the cost of the globe have been using demand doing business is rising. Many existing

tainable borrowing costs, which further increase the economic losses in the form unemployment and low output.

As per the Forbes Report (Aug 2023), globally Pakistan is among top ten countries with a very high interest rate. While in the Asian region, Pakistan has the highest interest rate (i.e. 22%) as compared to India (6.5%) and Bangladesh (6.5%). The high credit cost affects the competitiveness of the already struggling export industry in the region. Also, high interest rates is widening the fiscal deficit with significant increase in domestic debt in addition to raising the interest payment manifold (Since now the share of the floating rate debt is higher as compared to fixed rate). So, it is evident that the IMF policy recommendation of an old instrument of stabilization policy in the form of a high interest rate is actually worsening the debt sustainability indicators for the Pakistan economy. IMF analysts also observed that lower average inflation forecasts are linked to more sustainable budgetary positions. However raising interest rates would only increase the cost to the government thus making the fiscal position more unsustainable. So how could this policy guideline of contractionary monetary policy in the form of high interest rate ensure fiscal sustain-

The IMF Report also highlights that fiscal support measures could be useful in reducing inflation or at the very least smoothed out a severe inflationary shock. Nevertheless, the report doesn't discuss the effects of the monetary tightening and fiscal austerity measures that the IMF recommended to developing economies like Pakistan in order to use its funding facility. "It is generally argued that monetary

policy actions transmit their effects on key macroeconomic indicators with a considerable lag and with a high degree of volatility and uncertainty. Empirical evidence reveals that the interest rate influences the rate of inflation with a lag of 12 to 18 months, and the magnitude of this impact is very small while some studies show positive relation. Additionally, empirical data for Pakistan demonstrates that the recent increase in interest rates has not significantly reduced inflation". For instance, despite sacrificing growth, SBP's monetary tightening failed to achieve the target of price stability.

Since the policy of increasing interest rates to reduce inflation has failed, the interest rate should be reduced to boost the business activity. Further, it will also help the government to improve fiscal outlook in the short term. However, monetary policy itself is unable to achieve the targets unless fully supported by fiscal policy, deregulatory measures, and enhancing supply side shift factors like investment, enhance the productive capacity, and competition. Even though fiscal space is very limited at this time, but certain measures (along with reducing policy rate) which includes widening tax base (rather than increasing tax rates), reforming power sector (major source of circular debt), promoting public private partnerships PPP) and coordinated monetary and fiscal policies would help to achieve the growth, employment and price stability targets. As highlighted by PIDE Reform Agenda, "moving to a high and sustainable growth trajectory calls for breaking away from the past, which is possible only if we undertake deep-seated structural reforms in almost all areas influencing growth".

IMF funding good but it cannot speed up growth amidst instability: BMP

ISLAMABAD (INP): The Businessmen Panel (BMP) of Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FPCCI) has warned that a bailout from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) alone was unlikely to speed up economic growth, as the political instability and lack of reforms would further deteriorate the financial situation in the country.

It should be mentioned here that the Executive Board of the IMF has completed the 1st review Standby Arrangement, allowing for disbursement of \$ 700 million, bringing the total disbursements to \$1.9 billion for Pakistan.

In a statement on Sunday, former President FPCCI and BMP Chairman Mian Anjum Nisar observed that amidst continuous of hike in cost of production in the country, what the Pakistan's economy really needs is persistent and sound economic management. He asked the authorities for undertaking economic reforms and improving the regulatory environment to boost foreign investment so that financial stability can be achieved in the long-run.

The BMP chief stressed the need for reducing cost of doing business, besides evolving a new price control mechanism, as huge taxation, rising oil prices and constant jump in electricity and gas tariffs have lifted the inflation to decades high level in 2023.

Mian Anjum Nisar warned the authorities that inflation above 6 percent can hurt economic growth and a careful policy is required to keep it in control. He said that the pace of inflation is skyrocketing at a time when the economic activity is slowing down.

As the oil prices have been increased and power tariff has gone up further the BMP chairman stated that the government has dropped a fuel bomb on the businessmen after it suffered an electric shock to meet the conditions of IMF for the revival of the stalled loan program- a recipe to shake the trade and industry.

The former president FPCCI said that the decision would prove detrimental to the industries due to high cost of doing business and will also open the floodgates of inflation. In addition to making the electricity bills costlier and unaffordable for the consumers, the hike in base tariff would escalate prices of all household goods being widely used in every household, he added.

Railways have no future in Pakistan, should be sold immediately

ISLAMABAD: Former President of the Islamabad Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ICCI), Dr. Shahid Rasheed Butt, said on Friday that there is no future for railways in Pakistan, therefore it should be sold without any delay.

All the efforts to rehabilitate railways have failed; therefore, this sick enterprise should be sold instead of new experiments, which will waste time and money.

Shahid Rasheed Butt said in a statement issued here today that once railways were the most popular and cheapest means of transporting passengers and goods, but now it is a failed enterprise with no hope of revival.

He said that railways could not function in a country where transporters and contractors make important decisions in assemblies.

In such a country, trucks will continue to



replace the railways; billions will be wasted on constructing unnecessary roads, and the railway tracks will be stolen and sold to private

He said that the railway is the backbone of the economy of neighbouring India, but it has

been made a liability in Pakistan, which has caused a loss of Rs977 billion from December 1, 2022, to July 31, 2022.

The business leader informed that until 1960, the railway was very popular; it was a major means of travel, and 75% of commercial goods were transported through it.

Afterwards, this department became a victim of the conspiracies of transporters, contractors, and bureaucracy, and now it is among the most incompetent and corrupt departments.

Now the share of railways handling cargo is not even 25%, it no longer enjoys the confidence of the masses while transporters are thriving at the cost of the masses, he said.

In many nations, it is illegal to use trucks and trailers to transport goods from one province to another because they are expensive, and the public pays for them, but this is not the case

Here, this important department is being destroyed, and its lands are continuously seized.

Shahid Rashid Butt said that the elements who destroyed the railway are against its sale because if the private buyers revive it, their transport business will be affected and there will be a lesser need for new roads.

Policymakers know that an effective railway system facilitates commerce and trade, reduces transportation costs, and promotes rural development and national integration, but it is not given importance in Pakistan for obvious reasons.

He said that lack of attention, poor policies, increasing expenditures, misappropriation of funds, pilferage, nepotism, floods, inadequate technology, and mismanagement have left railways with huge budget deficits running in billions of rupees, which is a question mark on its sustainability.
