

TEHRAN: Unidentified gummen on Saturday in south-castern Iran near the Paki-stan border killed nine foreign nationals, said to be Pakistanis, more than a week after the neighbours exchanged deady cross-border fire.

Wittnesses said this morning unknown gummen killed nine non-tranians in a house in the Sirkan neighbourhood of Saravancity. To Statan-Baluchistan province, the Iranian news agency reported.

On Friday, the court asked Israel must do everything it can to prevent the commission of all acts within the scope of the Genocide Convention. The court said Israel must take all measures within its power to prevent and punish the direct and public incitement to commit genocide. It also said that Israel must take immediate and effective measures to enable the expression of "preperty needed basic services and humanitarian." el must take immediate and effective measures to enable the provision of urgently needed basic services and humanitarian assistance to address the adverse conditions of life faced by Palestinians. Additionally, the court ruled that Israel must try to limit death and damage in Gaza. Highlighting that the ICJ was acutely aware of the extent of the human tragedy unfolding in the region since war crupted in Gaza, Judge Joan Donoghue, the court's president, said that the court remained deeply concerned about the continuing loss of life and human suffering Meanwhile. Provisional measures are a type of itemporary injunction ahead of a final decision on the dispute. It is likely to take years before a judgement is reached. 

Djokovic lost at Melbourne Park for the first time in six years and the Serb called his match against Sinner his 'worst ever display in Grand Slams' as the 36-year-old failed to make one break point in the entire game.

The gutted Serbian may not return to the court till March, when Indian Wells Masters start, as per his website. Djokovic will skip the Dubat Championships in February, which he has been playing for the last two years.
