# Development can revolutionize the country's economy: Dr. Shahid Rasheed

ISLAMABAD: Former President of the Islamabad Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ICCI), Dr. Shahid Rasheed Butt, said on Sunday that the performance of the export sector is disappointing.

Exporters take many benefits from the government, but their performance remains deplorable due to too much focus on profits, he said.

The whole focus of the export sector is on profit and packages, while there is no interest in increasing production and quality, competitiveness, innovation, or research and development, he added.

Shahid Rasheed Butt said in a statement today that Pakistan's cotton production falls short of demand, costing the country

billions of dollars in annual import losses. On the other hand, he said, the world is

reducing cotton production to provide food for the expanding population.

He noted that Pakistan's powerful import lobby has been influencing important policies in its favor for decades, which has shaken the foundations of the economy.

On the other hand, the export lobby is addicted to bailout packages, tax breaks, and devaluation of the rupee, which affects 250 million people. Currently, Pakistani exports exceed

Bangladesh's volume, but the superior quality of their export earnings makes them significantly higher than Pakistan's.

Shahid Rashid Butt further stated that a team from National Textile University,



backed by a Hyderabad-based investor, has successfully extracted fiber from banana peel and bark and made it usable for the textile industry, which has opened up new possibilities for Pakistan's troubled textile

This development has the potential to revolutionize the textile sector and bolster the struggling economy, as it transforms the fruit waste into raw materials for the production of textile fibers.

Consumers' growing awareness of ethical fashion has led to an ever-increasing demand for the use of natural fibers in not just garments but the whole textile industry, he said.

He added that this invention will not only save billions of dollars in foreign exchange but also reduce environmental pollution by extracting one million tons of fiber from banana stems and turning them into varn.

Farmers' lives will change as a result of using 90% of the leftover banana crop waste to produce fertilizer and electricity.

Shahid Rasheed Butt said that sugarcane production in Pakistan is in surplus, which can generate similar benefits. The fruit's cane stalk, also known as bagasse, vields sugarcane fiber.

In some countries, the garment industry uses bagasse, a waste product, to make textile fibers. It also has immense potential application in the medical field.

The tenacity, softness, and biodegradability of the sugarcane fibers make them the perfect raw material for making disposable medical and commercial textiles. Manufacturers also use sugarcane fibers to manufacture denim pants and jackets.

In this regard, he demanded full cooperation from the concerned authorities to ensure the country fully benefits from the new development.

## NAB rescues KP from \$31.5 billion in BRT scam

ISLAMABAD: NAB KP successfully rescued the Government of KP from the contractor's claim of 31.5 billion rupees in the International Court of Arbitration (ICA).

In 2018, NAB initiated an inquiry into the allegations of illegal award of contract, misappropriation of government funds and submission of bogus performance guarantees by the contractors in Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Project Peshawar. Progress in the case remained stationary for few years; however, the investigation was paced up under the command of the present DG and saved Rs. 168.5 billion through effective and efficient conclusion of investigation into a large scam of corruption. Sources claim that this huge not only played their part in cheating success could have been possible due to a government agency (PDA) but also active collaboration of NAB with the Provincial Cabinet, Provincial Administration and the PDA and their positive role throughout the process of settlement agreement.

NAB investigation revealed that 6 Ventures (JVs), consisting of 2 Pakistani firms and 3 international firms for 3 contracts of Roads (Reach-I to Reach-III) and 3 contracts of Buildings (Lot 1 to Lot 3).

tional firms had 60 to 70 percent shares in the 04x JVs. However, NAB investigation revealed that the JVs between local and international firms were merely on paper, in order to grab the mega contract illegally and fraudulently by the local contractors through leveraging the goodwill and financial capacity of the international firms.

After winning these contracts illegally, the local and international firms made supplementary contract agreements, according to which the actual work was carried out by the local firms while the international firms were paid 2% of the total tender value in return for leveraging their names and financial capabilities. In this way, these 3 foreign firms received about one billion rupees without doing any work.

The investigation also revealed that the contractor had submitted 02x bogus local bank guarantees worth Rs. 2 billion to PDA. In addition to the above, 08x foreign bank guarantees amounting to Rs 6.5 billion were also submitted in violation of the agreement. The local contractors had also submitted audit reports which were proved bogus by NAB through SECP and the Chartered Accountant of these firms.

It was also proved that the staff of the international firms claiming to work on the project, had visited Pakistan for eight to ten days only in the last five years.

The respective Embassies of the international firms fully cooperated with NAB in calling up these firms. This Bureau in collaboration with their anti-corruption agency forced the foreign firms to cooperate in the investigation

#### **PM Pakistan to** address world leaders at UN

akistan's Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif will join world leaders at the United Nations next week to deliberate on key international issues, as wars in the Middle East and Europe threaten to spread with no end in sight and to address Global South's concerns over increasing poverty, inflation and debt burden, while impacts of climate change worsen.

More than 130 heads of state/government will attend the high-level segment of the UN General Assembly's 79th session beginning on Tuesday, Sept 24.

"We see out-of-control geopolitical divisions and runaway conflicts - not least in Ukraine, Gaza, Sudan and beyond," U. N. Secretary-General Antonio Guterres told reporters at a news conference ahead of the annual debate.

Those three wars are set to dominate the agenda — both in world leaders' speeches before the assembly and at numerous side meetings

Getting to a cease-fire in Gaza is even more urgent now that Israel has turned its guns towards its northern border with Lebanon in pursuit of its object to destroy Hezbollah. Earlier this week, Israel's detonations of hand-held devices by Hezbollah members left 37 dead and a hundred more injured that outraged most of the world.

Meanwhile, hundreds of New York Police Department (NYPD) personnel on Sunday began erecting roadblocks and checkpoints around UN Headquarters in Manhattan to turn the area into a high-security zone to protect the visiting world leaders.

PM Shehbaz Sharif is scheduled to arrive in New York tomorrow at the head of the Pakistan delegation to UNGA. He will address the Assembly on September 27.

In his address, the prime minister will highlight Pakistan's perspective on a range of international and regional issues of concern, including the Jammu and Kashmir dispute.

Before leaving Islamabad for London on his way to New York, PM Shehbaz Sharif posted on social media platform X (formerly Twitter), stating that he anticipates a "busy week full of engagements".

"During our interactions, we will address global issues, promoting peace, development and climate action. I will represent Pakistan's perspective to the world, advocate our interests and strengthen international partnerships," he added.

On the sidelines of the UNGA session, the prime minister is scheduled to attend several high-level meetings, including discussions on existential threats posed by sea level rise and the UN Security Council's Open Debate on Leadership

He will also have several bilateral meetings with world leaders and a call on the UN chief.

One of his most watched bilateral meetings will be with Dr. Muhammad Yunus, head of Bangladesh's new caretaker government, amid dramatic improvement in Islamabad-Dhaka ties following the ouster of PM Sheikh Hasina that has sent shock waves across India.

# Micromanagement of Judiciary...

parliament are three distinct, exclusive, and mutually independent pillars of the state. The independence of each pillar from the influence and jurisdiction of the others, as defined in the Constitution, is the hallmark of any democratic system. It is not only the duty of each pillar to protect itself from encroachment by another but also the duty of civil society and the public at large to resist any attempt by any pillar to interfere in the workings of the others.

The most damaging, however, was the encroachment of Parliament into the exclusive domain of the judiciary, which is a fundamental component of a functioning democratic system. The Parliament first enacted the Supreme Court (Practice and Procedure) Act, 2023. A close scrutiny of the provisions of SCPPA 2023 reveals it as a clear example of blatant micromanagement of the judiciary.

The SCPPA 2023 was initially struck down by the Supreme Court under the tenure of former Chief Justice Umar Ata Bandial. However, under the leadership of Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa, a 15-member full court later upheld the Act. Unfortunately, Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa's decision effectively opened the doors of the superior judiciary to parliamentary micromanagement. The logic offered by Chief Justice Isa—that Parliament is supreme and has the right to make laws, even those that impact the independence of the judiciary was not only flawed but also lacked solid constitutional grounding, as it threatened the principle of judicial independence.

When the Supreme Court (Practice and Procedure) Act, 2023 (SCPPA), was introduced for the first time, it micromanaged the judiciary primarily by altering how the Chief Justice's powers were exercised. The

most senior judges to decide on the formation of benches and the initiation of suo motu action.

This change meant that the Chief Justice no longer had the sole authority to form benches or take suo motu notices, which had previously been an essen-

tial aspect of the Chief Justice's autonomy. This redistribution of power effectively regulated and limited the Chief Justice's role, thereby introducing a level of micromanagement into the Supreme Court's internal processes. The door to the micromanagement of the

judiciary, which was left wide open due to the shortsightedness of Chief Justice Qazi Faez Isa, is now being forcefully pushed against the judiciary's independence. Not content with the initial attempt to micromanage and bring the judiciary under the influence of the executive, Parliament has once again been used to further exert control over the superior judiciary.

While the original act mandated a three-member committee to decide on the formation of benches, the 2024 amendment provided the Chief Justice with more power by allowing him to nominate the third member of this committee. This gave the Chief Justice greater influence in constituting benches and influencing the outcome of the decisions.

The amendment imposed a "first in, first out" approach, to bind the supreme court to hear the cases in the order they were filed unless there were clear criteria or legal stipulations for urgency. Any deviation from this sequence required justification, which reduced the flexibility of the judiciary to act established a three-member committee prioritize cases based on perceived impor-

The amendment required that any suo motu action must be accompanied by a 'reasoned and speaking order," detailing the public importance and fundamental rights involved. This provision imposed additional checks on the use of suo motu powers.

A significant transparency measure introduced was the

requirement that all proceedings of the superior courts be transcribed and made publicly available. This ensured that the public could access and review the judicial process, imposing a form of micromanagement over the court's opera-

The Supreme Court (Practice and Procedure) Act, 2023, and its 2024 amendment have several provisions that contradict the constitutional principles guaranteeing the independence of the judiciary and the separation of powers as defined in the Constitution of Pakistan.


Article 175 enshrines the separation of powers between the judiciary, executive, and legislature. It states that the judiciary is to be independent and free from interference by the other branches of government. Article 191 empowers the Supreme Court to make its own rules regarding its practice and procedures. The Article 184(3) authorizes the Supreme Court to exercise suo motu jurisdiction, which is a constitutional power allowing the court to act in matters of public interest and fundamental rights.

In well-established democracies such as the United States, United Kingdom, Germany, and India, the principle of iudicial independence is respected, and Parliament avoids micromanaging the

refrains from interfering in the judiciary's procedures, allowing the courts to interpret laws independently. Similarly, the UK's judiciary, protected under the Constitutional Reform Act 2005, operates without parliamentary interference, ensuring that judicial functions are separate from the legislative branch. In Germany, the Basic Law (Grundgesetz) guarantees judicial independence, with the Federal Constitutional Court operating autonomously to review laws in line with the constitution. India also upholds this separation, as seen in the landmark Kesavananda Bharati case, where the judiciary established that Parliament cannot alter the "basic structure" of the Constitution, including judicial independence.

The Supreme Court's autonomy in managing its own affairs is fundamental to maintaining an independent judiciary. The imposition of external controls through the SCPPA 2023 and its 2024 amendment not only blurs the separation between the pillars of the state but also threatens the constitutional safeguards designed to protect judicial independence. This micromanagement of the judiciary is detrimental to good governance, as it undermines the checks and balances essential for ensuring accountability, fairness, and impartiality in a democratic system. To ensure the progress and prosperity of the nation, it is crucial to preserve the judiciary's independence and prevent any interference that jeopardizes the effective functioning of the justice system, as it plays a vital role in upholding the rule of law and fostering a stable environment for national development.

Dissanayake had said he would renegotiate the IMF deal to make austerity measures more bearable. Wickremesinghe had warned that any move to alter the basics of the agreement could delay the release of a fourth tranche of nearly \$3 billion that is crucial to maintaining stability.

Neither candidate received more than 50% of the vote. Under the Sri Lankan election system that allows voters to select three candidates in the order of their preference, the top two are retained and the ballots of the eliminated candidates are checked for preferences given to either of the top two vote-getters. The one with the highest number of votes is declared the winner.

## UN holds Summit of the Future' to tackle global crises

Global leaders are gathering in New York on Sunday for a "Summit of the Future" aimed at addressing 21st-century challenges ranging from conflict to climate, amid scepticism over whether the final pact will meet

United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres first proposed the meeting in 2021, billing it as a "once-in-a-generation opportunity" to reshape human history by rekindling international cooperation.

As an opening act for the annual high-level week of the UN General Assembly, which begins Tuesday, dozens of heads of state and government are expected to adopt a "Pact for the Future" on Sunday.

But after intense last-minute negotiations, Guterres expressed some frustration, urging nations to show "vision" and "courage," and calling for "maximum ambition" to strengthen international institutions that struggle to respond effectively to today's threats.

LAHORE: The ongoing Walton Road Upgradation project by CBD Punjab has achieved a major milestone, with 70% of asphalt work completed on the carriageway from Defence Mor to Qainchi. According to CBD Punjab, approximately 500-600

tons of asphalt is being laid in each shift. CEO CBD Punjab, Imran Amin, stated that the scope of the Walton Road Upgradation project is extensive, involving significant road works and sewerage tasks. CBD Punjab, NLC, and contractors are working tirelessly to complete the project ahead of the contract deadline. The main sewer conduit and ADA drain relocation have been successfully completed.

As per the directives of Chief Minister Punjab, Maryam Nawaz, one carriageway will be fully operational for traffic by the end of September, while the second carriageway is expected to be completed by the end of October. Following the successful relocation of the ADA drain, CBD Punjab has begun demolishing the old drain walls, and side road construction is also underway. Additionally, asphalt work on Major Ishaq Shaheed Flyover will commence soon.

Once the carriageways are operational, the remaining work on the project will continue concurrently to ensure timely completion.

## All-round Ashwin powers India to big Test win over Bangladesh

Ravichandran Ashwin claimed six wickets after a first-innings century with the bat to inspire India to a 280-run thrashing of Bangladesh in the first Test on Sunday.

The visitors arrived in Chennai in a confident mood following a historic victory in Pakistan but they were no match for an Indian team for whom Rishabh Pant celebrated a triumphant return from a serious car crash.

Bangladesh have still never beaten India in Tests in 14

Bangladesh were bowled out for 234 in the first session of an overcast day four while chasing a victory target of 515.

Skipper Najmul Hossain Shanto top-scored with 82 after he and overnight partner Shakib Al Hasan resisted in a 48-run partnership, Bangladesh having resumed the day on 158-4.

The hosts took an emphatic 1-0 lead in the two-match series as they look to extend their advantage at the top of the World Test Championship rankings.

"It was a great result looking at what lies ahead," skipper Rohit Sharma said after India made an ominous start to a fresh Test season of 10 matches.

Hometown hero Ashwin struck first to end a stubborn overnight stand by getting Shakib caught at short-leg for 25.

The spinner, who took three wickets on day three, then dismissed Mehidy Hasan Miraz for one to bag his 37th five-wicket haul, equalling the late Shane

Muttiah Muralitharan remains well out in front with 67.

The feat added to Ashwin's heroics after his 113 guided the hosts to 376 in the first innings. "He's always there for us over

the years," Rohit said of the 38-year-old. "I don't know if I speak here (that) it'll be enough to cover what he does for the team. He looks like he's never out of the game." Shakib put on 48 runs with Najmul after the pair started cautiously. Left-arm spinner Ravindra Jadeja removed Litton Das for one after the wicketkeeper-batsman edged the ball to Rohit at first slip. Jadeja ended Najmul's valiant stand and took three wickets for the innings.

'Little bit emotional'

Spin twins Ashwin and Jadeja had played a key batting role in the first innings when their 199-run seventh-wicket stand lifted India from a precarious 144-6 to a chal-

lenging total on the first day.

India declared their second innings at 287-4 on day three after centuries from Shubman Gill, who hit an unbeaten 119, and the returning Pant, who made 109, flattened the opposition.

Gill and the left-handed Pant, who was playing his first Test since a serious car crash in December 2022, put on 167 runs for the fourth wicket.

"I just enjoyed batting and got a little bit emotional," Pant said of his celebration after his sixth Test ton. "But at the end of the day, being in the field gives me more pleasure

than anything else." The Test was Virat Kohli's first since the birth of his second child made him miss India's 4-1 victory over England at home earlier this

year. Kohli scored just six and 17. The home bowlers led by Jasprit Bumrah handed India an early advantage after they bundled out Bangladesh for 149 in their first
