WASHINGTON: Donald Trump was elected the 47th president of the United States on Wednesday, an extraordinary comeback for a former president who refused to accept defeat four years ago, sparked a violent insurrection at the US Capitol, was convicted of felony charges and survived two assassination attempts.

This high-level meeting, attended by officials from ICT departments, aimed at establishing clear targets and action plans to address the pressing





Govt of Japan provides grant assistance to NGOs for development projects

 $ISLAMABAD: The \ Government \ of \ Japan \ has \ decided \ to \ provide \ grant$ assistance up to USD 194,493 (equivalent to around PKR 54 million) in total to three local NGOs for development projects in Pakistan.

The grant contracts were signed between His Excellency, Mr. WADA Mitsuhiro, Ambassador of Japan to the Islamic Republic of Pakistan and representatives of the three NGOs at the Embassy of Japan in Islamabad on November 6, 2024. The three NGOs that will implement the projects are (1) Friends Welfare Association (2) Al Khidmat Foundation Pakistan and (3) Al Meezan Islamic Model Secondary School.

Friends Welfare Association will receive a USD 59,764 grant (equivalent to around PKR 16.64 million) to build a new water scheme in one of the most underdeveloped areas of Mansehra District. The project will benefit 6,000 people or around 895 households of the area. The project is related to the provision of clean drinking water to the people of that area by constructing water tanks and establishing water supply lines. This is expected to free women and children from the labor of

Al Meezan Islamic Model Secondary School will receive a USD 64,528 grant (equivalent to around PKR 17.87 million) to build a road with its supporting bridges over a big water channel which will provide a safe way for the school children to reach their schools. The project will benefit 2,540 people or around 300 households of the area by providing them safe access to travel to the main city, markets and hospitals.

Al Khidmat Foundation Pakistan will receive a USD 70,201 grant (equivalent to around PKR 19.5 million) to implement a project related to the provision of clean drinking water to the people of an industrial area, Faisalabad. Seven water filtration plants will be installed in Faisalabad city and Okara city to provide filtered water to about 2,870 people in

the vicinity of the plants and protect residents from waterborne diseases. At the signing ceremony, His Excellency, Mr. WADA Mitsuhiro expressed his expectation that these development projects in cooperation with local communities would have a positive impact on uplifting

the living standards of Pakistani people at the grassroots level. The Government of Japan will provide further flexible and timely support to local NGOs through grant assistance to improve the social wellbeing of the people of Pakistan at the grassroots level.

Pakistan slams fake news drives by occupying States in Kashmir & Palestine

akistan has deplored the use of disinformation by occupying States to suppress the people's voices in Kashmir and Palestine, underscoring the need for stepped up efforts to combat that pervasive threat.

"The harmful impact of fake news and disinformation is magnified when states employ these tactics in situations of foreign occupation to suppress the voices of people, denied basic freedoms, including the UN-sanctioned right to self-determination," Pakistani delegate Amanat Ali told the UN General Assembly's Fourth Committee, which deals with special political and decolonization matters.

Speaking in a debate on 'Questions Relating to Information', he said that Indian Occupied Jammu and Kashmir and Occupied Palestinian Territory "are a case in point."

"Central to this manipulation are internet blackouts, censorship, and restrictive media laws enforced by occupying authorities," Amanat Ali, press counsellor at the Pakistan Mission to he UN, the Pakistani delegate said, adding, "These actions are intended to delegitimize freedom movements and create an environment of fear, intimidation, and violence.'

Noting that fake news and misinformation undermine trust in the United Nations, especially in the context of rising geopolitical tensions, ongoing genocidal war in Gaza and climate threats, he called for a "sustained communications campaign" by the Department of Global Communications (GDC), in collaboration with Member States, to highlight the UN's achievements

Highlighting the need for collaboration with tech companies, like Facebook and Google, the Pakistani delegate warned that their "profit motives" might conflict with the cooperation needed to curb disinformation. Therefore, he suggested that the Global Principles for Information Integrity should address the role of individuals in spreading misinformation, as well as "empowering users through media literacy".

Referring to the growing use of digital media platforms to target minority communities, Amanat Ali said that such practices severely undermine the political freedoms and human rights of these populations. "We must take strong, coordinated action to combat Islamophobia, along with other forms of racism, racial discrimination, xenophobia, negative stereotyping, and stigmatization in the digital space," he said.

"Promoting messages of tolerance, peaceful coexistence, and interfaith and intercultural harmony is essential to fostering unity among all peoples," the Pakistani delegate emphasized, urging the DGC to take a lead role in this regard.

Counselor Amanat Ali's pointed words on Kashmir drew a response from the Indian delegate, Rajiv Shukla, an MP, who accused him of misusing the UN forum. He also claimed that Jammu and Kashmir was an integral part of India, saying that Pakistan was in occupation of a part of that state. The Pakistani delegate hit back at the Indian claims immediately.

ization deployed a force of 400 trained canvassers over a month, traveling in more than 60 vans with seven canvassers per vehicle, going door-todoor to campaign for Kamala Harris in the entire Michigan. Despite this substantial investment and effort, the results fell short of expectations, with Trump leading significantly in Michigan, capturing 51.9% of the vote compared to Harris's 46.3%. The likely victory by Trump also contradicted many national surveys that had consistently projected Harris as the front-

This trend extended beyond Michigan, as Republicans were enjoying a comfortable lead across much of the country, leaving Democrats anxious as the midnight hour approached. The unexpected shift also sent shockwaves to Democratic supporters and international allies in Europe and beyond.

As of now, Harris has secured 194 electoral votes, trailing Trump's 246, leaving him only 24 votes shy of the 270 needed to win the White House as the clock passes midnight in the U.S.

This created an atmosphere of global uncertainty and concern. While absentee and mail-in ballots are still being counted, a reversal appears almost impossible. Importantly, the election process has been deemed fair by 83% of surveyed voters, minimizing any doubts about potential manipulation.

Trump was successful in swaying male voters, securing 54% of their support by focusing on issues like abortion rights, economic challenges, inflation, and job losses. In contrast, Harris garnered 44% of the male vote. Among new and younger voters, many of whom recently entered the iob market, discontent with the Democrats' economic performance led to a shift toward Trump, with 55% favoring him

White voters heavily supported Trump, with 72% aligning with him on issues related to immigration, white identity concerns, and opposition to legalized abortion. Although Harris won 66% of the female vote—driven by strong support for abortion rights—this was insufficient to swing the election in her favor.

There was a notable alignment among white men aiming to prevent a Black and South Asian woman from ascending to the presidency and becoming the commander-in-chief of the U.S. Armed Forces, one of the world's most powerful positions.

Confidence in Trump's crisis-management abilities was also higher, with 50% of voters believing he could handle crises better than Harris, who received 48% in this regard.

In Washington, D. C., a large crowd of Democratic supporters had gathered outside the party's headquarters, hoping for a decisive win. However, as the night wore on, disappointment set in as they watched the election slip away. Meanwhile, a jubilant crowd at the Republican headquarters in New York celebrated noisily, ready to welcome Trump's expected victory. Disappointed, Harris postponed her planned address to supporters. In contrast, Trump prepared to give a victory speech, laying out his vision for the next four years for one of the world's most powerful nations.

Trump skillfully dismantled the Democrats' election agenda, which had centered on promises to reduce food prices, support working families, provide \$25,000 to first-time homebuyers, and cut tax rates for middle-class households. However, public sentiment leaned heavily toward

skepticism. Many questioned how the involvement in new conflicts. Biden administration, with Kamala Harris as Vice President, could fulfill these promises now when they had struggled to deliver on similar commitments while in power. This perception further strengthened Trump's position, as voters viewed the Democrats' pledges as hollow, given their track record over the past term. The post-midnight results stunned

Democrats. In Arizona, Trump led Harris narrowly at 49.7% to 49.5%, with abortion rights proving pivotal. Harris won her home state of California with a strong 61.2%, securing 59 electoral votes. However, Trump

claimed Florida with 56.2% over Harris's 42.9% and took Georgia (50.7%) and Iowa (55.1%) due to strong rural support. In Idaho, Trump led with 59.1%, while North Carolina also went to him with 50.7% over Harris's 47.8%. Harris won Oregon comfortably at 59.2%, yet underperformed in Pennsylvania, a critical swing state, where Trump led 50.8%. Trump also led in Wisconsin, 51% to 47.3%, cementing his edge in key battlegrounds.

Now it is not rocket science that Donald Trump has won the 2024 U.S. presidential election and the situation is not going to change even if all votes are counted, which might take a few more days.

With Trump the world is now unscrambling itself to face sweeping changes in the USA's approach to the Middle East, the Russia-Ukraine war, NATO, and China could significantly.

Trump has traditionally favored a peace through strength" doctrine, potentially leading to an assertive stance in supporting Israel while promoting diplomatic engagements to avoid direct U.S.

Trump's previous skepticism of NATO could resurface, with calls for greater burden-sharing among member countries, potentially affecting NATO's united front against Russia. In the case of Russia-Ukraine, Trump has shown interest in swiftly negotiating an end to the conflict, which may lead to a pressured peace deal that could favor Russia or at least reduce U.S. military aid, drawing criticism domestically and internationally.

On the domestic front, Trump's economic policies have historically included tax cuts, deregulation, and tariffs-especially against China, which he views as a critical economic rival. A more protectionist stance on China could lead to heightened trade tensions, potentially impacting global supply chains and increasing U.S. manufacturing costs, though it may boost certain U. S.-based industries.

Trump's past emphasis on limiting immigration to protect American jobs could lead to stricter immigration policies, which may face opposition from businesses reliant on immigrant labor, particularly in tech and agriculture.

Economically, Trump is likely to prioritize policies aimed at GDP growth, possibly including tax cuts and reducing regulations on fossil fuels to spur energy independence. However, these moves could risk higher inflation if not carefully balanced with monetary policy.

The overall impact on inflation, jobs, and GDP growth would depend heavily on his administration's ability to navigate international uncertainties while managing domestic economic pressures effectively.

In an interview on the news program "News Insight with Amir Zia," Syed lauded Trump's potential to bring about positive changes in global affairs.

Syed argued that Trump's presidency could lead to the end of the Ukraine war, curb the influence of figures like Netanyahu, foster greater economic cooperation, and prevent the expansion of NATO. He described Trump as a "candidate of peace" and an unconventional president, contrasting him with Biden's perceived interventionist foreign policy.

Syed was highly critical of the Biden-Harris administration, referring to Kamala Harris as a "total fraud" and a product of the Indian lobby. He alleged a "soft coup" against Biden, orchestrated by the Clintons, Obamas, and Nancy Pelosi, to replace him with Harris.



PSB raises serious concerns over POA's governance, electoral transparency

ISLAMABAD: Pakistan Sports Board (PSB) has voiced serious concerns over Pakistan Olympic Association's (POA) upcoming electoral process.

In a letter, addressed to POA President Syed Muhammad Abid Qadri Gillani, the PSB cited multiple governance issues and highlighted non-compliance with the International Olympic Committee (IOC) standards, questioning whether the POA's procedures align with international expectations for fairness and transparency.

Among the primary concerns raised are alleged secrecy surrounding constitutional amendments, withheld records of General Council meeting minutes, lack of transparency in the composition of the Electoral College, and the absence of clarity on whether POA's election rules have received IOC December 2023 and July 2024-

The PSB underscored the potential impact of these practices on the democratic integrity of the POA. "The the transparency and legitimacy of the absence of essential documentation like the amended Constitution and Electoral College, combined with procedural irregularities, calls into question the legality of the upcoming elections," the letter stated.

One of the PSB's main concerns is the POA's failure to publish its updated constitution. The POA website currently only hosts the 2019 version with 13 Articles, despite recent references to Articles not found in that version.

This discrepancy suggests that significant amendments were made without transparency, violating IOC's Good Governance Principles.

Further aggravating the situation, the PSB noted that minutes from the POA's General Council meetings in

where these amendments were report- Army, PAF, Navy, WAPDA, HEC, and approved by the POA General Council edly discussed and ratified—have not been disclosed.

"This failure to provide key documentation raises questions about the legitimacy of the amendments and whether they were made in compliance with the procedural requirements of both the POA Constitution and the IOC's governance standards," the PSB said.

Another contentious issue highlighted by the PSB is the non-disclosure of the Electoral College for the POA's upcoming elections. "The POA has not shared the details of the Electoral College for the upcoming elections, further undermining the transparency of the electoral process.

The lack of clarity on who constitutes the Electoral College and how these members were selected or nominated, particularly in light of the alleged amendments that seem to deprive departments such as the Railways of their rightful participation, is deeply concerning.

The PSB also noted that it was unclear whether the Election Rules

on 6th July 2024 have received the required approval from the IOC; these "Moreover, the discretion given to rules, should not be enforced until such approval is confirmed. "Moreover, these rules should be published on the POA's website, in accordance with the IOC's standards of transparency and governance."

The IOC Charter mandates that National Olympic Committees, like the POA, must represent all sports federations, recognized by international federations (IFs) participating in the Olympic Games. However, the PSB pointed out that the Pakistan Cycling Federation, despite being recognized internationally is notably absent from the POA's list of affiliated federations—a clear violation of the Olympic Charter.

The PSB urged the POA to address these governance issues within three days, emphasizing that failure to do so could cast doubts on the legal standing

of the POA's current office-bearers. "The absence of key documents,

such as the amended Constitution the Electoral College, and the non-compliance with IOC governance standards suggest that the POA may no longer be operating within the bounds of its own Constitution or the IOC Charter," the PSB warned.

The PSB's letter was copied to highlevel stakeholders, including the IOC Director General Christophe De Kepper, national sports federations and prominent departments within Pakistan's sports sector.

When contacted, POA President confirmed that the Association had received the PSB letter. "We have called an emergency meeting of our officebearers on this issue. "The points raised in this letter will be answered in this meeting," he said. According to Gillani, all the affairs of the Association are being run according to the POA constitution.


