GILGIT: At least 18 wedding guests were killed and six injured when a Rawalpindi-bound bus fell into a ravine in Gilgit Baltistan's Astore on Tuesday, rescue officials said.

Bodies of 12 individuals, including four women, have been recovered from the river. A young girl believed to be the bride, was found injured and has been transferred to a hospital. Efforts are under way to locate 10 missing

Footage from the area showed locals and rescue officials on the boat and riverbed on the search and rescue missions. The bus was carrying 25 individuals, according

In response to the incident, healthcare personnel at the nearest hospital and the Civil Hospital in Gilgit's Jaglot subdivision have been put on high alert.

Accidents are a common occurrence in GB and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, attributed to the challenging terrain, inadequate road conditions, overloaded vehicles, and limited traffic enforcement. The risk of accidents is heightened by narrow, winding roads, severe weather, and driver fatigue, making these regions particularly hazardous.

Sanaullah clarifies services chiefs' not given extension

ISLAMABAD: Adviser to the Prime Minister on Political Affairs Rana Sanaullah has clarified that the tenures of army, air force and naval chiefs have been increased and they have not been given extension.

PTI leaders released after brief detention in Rawalpindi for violating Section 144

RAWALPINDI: Several senior Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf(PTI) leaders were taken into custody on Tuesday outside the Adiala Jail in Rawalpindi for violating Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure. They were released shortly after receiving a warning from the police.

Section 144 allows district administrations to prohibit gatherings of four or more individuals in a designated area for a specified duration, typically implemented to prevent disturbances and maintain public

Punjab Police spokesperson Sajjadul Hassan confirmed that PTI workers were detained for breaching this regulation but were subsequently released after a warning. Law enforcement would be upheld in all circum-

stances, he added. Earlier, the PTI condemned the arrest of several of its leaders



outside the jail, where they had gathered to meet their imprisoned leader, Imran Khan. The party labelled the incident as "absolutely shameful."

In a statement posted on X, the PTI expressed outrage, stating, "Omar Ayub Khan, Shibli Faraz, Asad Qaiser, Ahmed Bhachar, and Sahibzada Hamid Raza have been arrested for simply exercising their legal right to meet with Imran Khan."

They added that such actions should "alarm anyone" who values the rule of law, alleging the erosion of basic freedoms.

Among those detained were Punjab Assembly Opposition Leader Malik Ahmed Bhachar and Sunni Ittehad Council member Sahibzad Hamid Raza.



Nuclear technology pivotal for decarbonising cotton industry

lobal leaders, policymakers, and industry experts on Tuesday at COP29 urged immediate support for farmers in resource-poor nations, emphasising technology transfers to bolster climate resilience and sustainability in cotton cultivation.

The pannel remarked during an event titled "Decarbonising and Adapting the Cotton-to-Clothing Value Chain through Multisectoral Partnerships" at the Pakistan Pavilion, to address the role of innovative technologies, including nuclear techniques, in tackling climate impacts on cotton farming. Pakistan's cuisine

Speakers noted that as climate change worsens, cotton farmers, particularly in vulnerable regions like Pakistan, Bangladesh, and Egypt, are facing unprecedented challenges such as severe floods, heatwaves, and droughts.

The event was organised by Pakistan's Ministry of Climate Change & Environmental Coordination in collaboration with the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA), the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO), the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), and the World Trade Organization (WTO).

In his keynote, Parliamentary Secretary Ahmed Atteeq Anwar highlighted cotton's critical role in global textiles, stressing the urgency of climate adaptation for cotton farmers and rural economies. "Without immediate efforts to help farmers adapt, we risk severe disruptions to supply chains and rural livelihoods," he warned.

Rafael Mariano Grossi, Director General of the IAEA, underscored nuclear technology's potential in reducing emissions and enhancing resilience across the cotton sector. Nuclear techniques, he explained, could help lower carbon emissions, improve water efficiency, enable sustainable pest control, and monitor pollution in cotton farming, presenting a powerful solution to the industry's environmental challenges.

WTO Director General Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala added that soil mapping, a WTO initiative, is crucial for understanding soil health and selecting crops suited to climate challenges, which could improve cotton's resilience against extreme

Azerbaijan's Deputy Minister of Agriculture, Sarvan Jafarov shared a successful case study in Azerbaijan, where climate-smart practices and the use of a new cotton variety have doubled crop yields in a project supported by IAEA and

The event brought together a range of voices, including representatives from Burkina Faso, Burkina Faso, and the ARISE group, all reinforcing the critical role of multisectoral partnerships in creating a sustainable, climate-resilient cotton sector worldwide.

The Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement are the documents adopted on the basis of and as a follow-up to this Convention.

Uzbekistan joined the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change on June 20, 1993, ratified the Kyoto Protocol in 1999 and the Paris Agreement in 2017, assuming a number of commitments, including the main quantitative commitment to reduce greenhouse gas emissions per unit of GDP by 35% of the 2010 level

As a party to the UN Framework Convention, Uzbekistan prepares and submits to the Convention Secretariat

regular climate reporting-national communications, biennial reports, and adaptation plans, develops and updates nationally determined contributions

Speaking at the High Level Segment of COP-28 in Dubai on 1 December 2023, President Shavkat Mirziyoyev presented the country's position on climate change, information on measures on decarburization, adaptation to climate change, cooperation on ecosystem conservation and restoration of the Aral Sea ecosystem.

It is worth that noting Uzbekistan actively participates in international environmental initi-

atives aimed at combating climate change and protecting Central Asian ecosystems. One of the key tasks is the restoration of the Aral Sea, the ecosystem of which has been significantly damaged. Uzbekistan initiated the establishment of the UN-sponsored Multi-Partner Trust Fund for the Aral Sea region, which aims to transform this region into a climate-resilient zone.

Uzbekistan seeks to reduce CO2 emissions, develops renewable energy and cooperates with UNESCO's Green Education Program to promote environmental education.

The climate agenda is also being actively promoted within other international formats. In particular, within the framework of the SCO, our head of state stressed the need to strengthen coordination and practical cooperation in decarburization and introduction of "clean" technologies, development of "smart" agriculture and water conservation.

At the summit of the Organization of Turkic States held in Bishkek on November 5-6, Uzbekistan's leader suggested accelerating the establishment of the Turkic Ecological Council at the ministerial level to find solutions to acute environmental problems related to climate change.

All these initiatives reflect Uzbekistan's aspiration to contribute to international efforts in the field of ecology and ensure a more sustainable future for our country, the region and the planet as a whole.

The participation of the President of Uzbekistan in the upcoming event in Baku will once again reaffirm our country's commitment to "green" growth and development, readiness to consolidate efforts to mitigate climate change and fulfill its commitments to achieve the goals of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change, the Kyoto Protocol and the Paris Agreement.

There is no alternative to multilateral climate action

ur world is at a critical juncture. The devastating effects of global warming are increasingly evident and the crisis is deepening. To mitigate it, we must urgently reduce global greenhouse gas emissions. Failing to act now will only increase the human and economic toll.

This month's COP29 climate change conference in Baku, Azerbaijan, presents a unique opportunity for effective collective action. Amid heightened geopolitical tensions and global uncertainty, COP29 will serve as a test of the multilateral system on which humanity's ability to respond to this existential threat depends.

The groundwork for coordinated action was laid in Rio de Janeiro in 1992 with the creation of the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change, which established the annual Conference of the Parties to promote consensus-based solutions. The philosophy was simple: given that climate change is a global issue, addressing it requires a collaborative approach.

The convention fosters cooperation between smaller countries and superpowers, enables civil society organizations to engage directly with governments and facilitates cross-border technology transfers. Perhaps most importantly, it provides a framework for collective action in which each country's efforts encourage others to step up their own.

While the 1997 Kyoto Protocol set binding emission-reduction targets for developed economies, it quickly became clear that more was needed. In response, developed countries pledged in 2009 to mobilize \$100 billion annually by 2020 to support developing countries' climate

turning point, setting the goal of limiting global warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius above pre-industrial levels and ensuring that the increase stays well below 2 C. To monitor progress, the agreement established a system of nationally determined contributions, through which each country outlines its emission-reduction plans. Periodic global audits assess whether countries are on track to fulfill their climate commitments.

Regrettably, the first global audit, released ahead of last year's COP28 in Dubai, showed that we are far from meeting these climate targets. It also offered a comprehensive roadmap, calling on all countries to commit to targets aligned with the 1.5 C goal and establishing clear steps and timelines — including transitioning away from fossil fuels — that could bring the Paris agreement's objectives within reach.

COP29 represents the next step for the multilateral approach, with leaders expected to agree on a significant boost to the \$100 billion climate finance target — the so-called New Collective Quantified Goal. Moreover, each country must submit its updated nationally determined contributions by February 2025.

Transparency is essential to this process. If the Paris agreement's targets are the destination, and the nationally determined contributions are the roadmap, the New Collective Quantified Goal provides the fuel needed to get there. Building trust in countries' commitment to bold climate action and willingness to provide the necessary

financing is key. As COP29 president, Azerbaijan is urging all countries to submit goals aligned with the 1.5 C target as soon as possible. We are also doing everything we can to secure a fair and ambitious new climate finance goal that addresses developing countries' needs and matches the scale and

urgency of the crisis. Falling short would force us to confront tough

the Paris Agreement? And what are the alternatives? One thing is clear: without a viable backup plan, we must do all we can to meet the 1.5 C goal. Sleepwalking into climate catastrophe is not an option.

To be sure, the multilateral system has its flaws. But it remains the best framework to tackle this daunting challenge. Over three decades, it has fostered lasting international cooperation, a shared understanding of the science and a strong consensus concerning global climate goals.

The alternative to multilateralism is a fragmented response, with governments pursuing their own agendas without coordination or cooperation. This approach would mean slower progress, higher costs and less equitable outcomes. Without a unifying goal, any sense of shared purpose would all but vanish.

Consider, for example, COP29's objective of finalizing negotiations on Article 6 of the Paris Agreement, which aims to standardize carbon markets. By channeling resources toward the most effective mitigation projects, this framework could save \$250 billion annually by 2030 — a

substantial boost in an era of limited resources. Given the alternatives, we have no choice but to make the current system work. The COP29 presidency will leave no stone unturned to achieve an international consensus. With an agenda focused on advancing transformative climate action, Azerbaijan could help bridge geopolitical divisions. But our success hinges on countries' willingness to engage constructively and commit to the multilateral process.

This account tells a story of his 1888 expedition to Baltit, which is the first documented passage from Central Asia to Hunza, that time to India, and today to Pakistan.

Since then, the Northern areas have kept fascinating many Polishes explores and mountaineers. They imprinted a lasting mark on Polish imagination, sports and culture. We grew up in Poland learning about achievements of our climbers. Some of them are

depicted in the exhibition presented here this evening. For example, Wanda Rutkiewicz was the first women who claimed K2. Jerzy Kukuczka was only the second climber in the world who scaledall eight-thousanders, including magnificent Pakistani summits. And this year, a team of Polish gliders – led by world champion Sebastian Kawa – was first to fly over K2 and surrounding mountains. You are going to see incredible footage taken during these flights.

These recent achievements followed into footsteps of Polish pilots, who contributed to the creation of the Pakistani Air Forces shortly after Pakistan was born. Interestingly, the wife of the leader of that group - Air Commodore Władysław Turowicz – Zofia Turowicz was a glider instructor herself and trained future Pakistani pilots. These extraordinary people were not only Polish but Pakistani heroes and deserve to be remember and recognized as such. Therefore, we continue to hope that a final decision about giving one of the streets in Islamabad their name will be taken soon.
