


CM Maryam Nawaz orders urgent completion of Apni Chhat Apna Ghar Programme

Huge Financial Loss to AJK Public Property Highlights Urgent Need for Insurance

MIRPUR: An accident on November 21, 2024, in Kotli, a district of Mirpur Division in Azad Jammu & Kashmir (AJ&K), resulted in significant damage to public property.

The District Magistrate of Kotli reported that the fire destroyed a police prison van, a Rescue 1122 pickup truck, a parked motorbike.

and a vehicle belonging to an NGO. In addition to this incident, numerous state-owned vehicles have been damaged in previous road accidents and similar events, causing a cumulative financial burden.

These recurring incidents have reignited critical discussions about the need for insurance of "public property" to mitigate such financial losses. Experts emphasize that the lack of adequate insurance coverage for state-owned

property leaves local governments ill-prepared for unforeseen events, compounding the strain on limited public resources. Addressing this issue is imperative, as it concerns the welfare of the public at large.

Global frameworks, such as the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), advocate for public asset insurance as a cornerstone of disaster risk reduction and financial resilience. Such measures align with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly Goal 9 (Industry, Innovation, and Infrastructure) and Goal 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities), which emphasize protecting critical infrastructure and ensuring sustainability. Despite clear statutory requirements of the Insurance Ordinance, 2000, and the AJK Insurance Act, 2007, mandating the insurance of public property, compliance has remained inconsistent. This negligence continues to expose public assets to unnecessary risks, underscoring the urgency of action in this regard.

Coastal communities in crisis, Sujawal fishermen narrate their plight

SUJAWAL: The fishing communities along the coastline of Sujawal, Thatta, and Badin districts are facing numerous challenges, despite claims of development in the region. Fishermen from various villages in Taluka Jati, Sujawal, expressed frustration over the indifferent attitude of government authorities and civil society towards their plight.

They pointed out that substantial aid and funding for fishermen emphasized that these efforts alone communities are being received by government departments and NGOs, but none of these organizations have taken concrete steps to improve the lives of fisher folk.

The coastal areas of Sujawal and Thatta have suffered significantly

the 1999 cvclone, 2003 heavy rains, and 2010 flash floods. The region continues to bear the harsh consequences of climate change, with no meaningful rehabilitation efforts by the government.

While acknowledging the efforts of the Pakistan Fisher Folk Forum and itsfounder, the late Sved Muhammad Ali Shah, in raising awareness among fishermen, the coastal inhabitants are insufficient to bring about meaningful change for the marginalized community.

Wali Muhammad Temro, a local activist, said that several lakes of fresh water had been destroyed in the wake of persistent natural disasters, mainly

due to natural disasters, including heavy rains and water scarcity that led to shrinking livelihood opportunities for the fishermen.

The famous natural lakes of the past - Chaubhati, Til, Chann Bhelo, Karr, Kalkaan Channi and many others-vanished in the sea and today there is no sign of their existence"; He said and added that the coastal areas posses a large number of expert fisherwomen who spent majority of their time fishing in high seas.

Pir Muhammasd Malah believed that overfishing and destruction of fish species had been a long standing challenge for fishermen during the past two decades.

Nawaz Sheikh, a senior columnist and researcher, said that water scarcity in the Indus River and sea intrusion

compelled thousands of fishermen families in Keti Bunder, Jati Shah Bunder and Kharochan to abandon their ancestral job of fishing and resort to some other work to make ends meet.

Haji Zahid Ishaque Somro a social activist and writer deplored the scheme of six canals and called it a devastating Plan for the fisher folk of Sindh. He further said that the scheme of 6 canals would exacerbate water shortage in the coastal region.

Noor Muhammad Themore, Ghani Malah and Ibrahim Dandal said that the ecology of the coastal areas was also at stake and the government as well as civil society should take measures for the preservation and rehabilitation of coastal ecology.

In Attock, protest rally condemns 'barbaric' attack on Parachinar passengers

ATTOCK: In a heinous act of terrorism, passengers traveling from Parachinar to Peshawar in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa's Kurram Agency were brutally attacked by terrorists. This tragic incident resulted in the martyrdom of 42 individuals, including women and innocent children, and left 25 others injured. This act of barbarity and savagery has written a new chapter in the history of cruelty. The peaceful protests of a peace-loving nation should not be mistaken for weakness.

These views were expressed during a protest rally organized by Majlis Wahdat-e-Muslimeen, the Shia Ulema Council, and Tehreeke-Nafaz-e-Fiqh-e-Jafaria. The rally took place after Friday prayers, beginning at Jamia Masjid Sadat in Kamalpur Syedan, Attock Cantt, and concluded at Kacheri Chowk, Attock.

On the occasion Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf's Member of Punjab Assembly Syed Ejaz Hussain Bukhari Advocate, Maulana Niaz Hussain, Maulana Imran Naqi, Asad Abbas Alvi, Niaz Bukhari, Cantonment Board Member Syed Mehdi Naqvi, Syed Mustajab Naqvi, Syed Waqar Naqvi, Agha Zafar Zafri, Maulana Niaz Amin Madbari, and Maulana Zafar Zafri were also present.

The speakers strongly condemned the tragic incident in Parachinar and expressed discontent with the government for delaying the news of the martyrs' tragedy, which was only broadcast on electronic and print media a day later. They emphasized that the teachings of the Imams prohibit shedding the blood of any innocent person, regardless of their religion or sect. However, the lack of accountability has emboldened terrorists

They further stated that mere words of patience and traditional condolences cannot heal the wounds inflicted by this tragedy. Federal and provincial governments must take concrete action.

The speakers also expressed their grief, stating that every conscientious individual is shedding tears of blood over the Parachinar tragedy.

They criticized the authorities for consistently shelving investigations into such atrocities. The speakers reaffirmed that the lesson of martyrdom learned from Karbala is part of their heritage.

Finally, they called upon their allied political party to conduct a thorough investigation into the Parachinar incident and bring the truth to light immediately.

ISSI hosts Roundtable on 'Pakistan-U.S. Relations' with CSIS delegation

ISLAMABAD: The Centre for Strategic Perspectives at the Institute of Strategic Studies Islamabad (ISSI) hosted a Roundtable Discussion on "Pakistan-U. S. Relations," with delegation from Centre for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), comprising Senior Vice President Daniel Runde and Senior Associate Ambassador Robin Raphel. The event was attended by practitioners, academics, think-tank experts, and researchers. In his welcome remarks, DG ISSI Ambassador Sohail Mahmood emphasized the significance of CSIS as a renowned U.S. think-tank, particularly in shaping the discourse and influencing U.S. policy. He noted that the timing of the visit was crucial, as it coincided with the conclusion of the U.S. Presidential and Congressional elections and the time of Cabinet formation before the new Administration takes office in January 2025.

With global attention focussed on what Trump 2.0 would mean for America and the rest of the world, Ambassador Sohail Mahmood dilated on the historically cyclical pattern of Pakistan-U.S. relations alternating between engagement and estrangement. PHOs, PYCA, PIPS lead high-level parliamentary roundtable on industrial trans fats

ISLAMABAD: A high-level Parliamentary Roundtable on "Industrially Produced Trans-Fatty Acids (iTFAs), Partially Hydrogenated Oils (PHOs), and Human Health" was held at the Pakistan Institute for Parliamentary Services (PIPS). The event, organized collaboratively by Pakistan Youth Change Advocates (PYCA), Center for Peace and Development Initiatives (CPDI), and PIPS under the TRANSFORM Pakistan campaign, brought together parliamentarians, health experts, civil society representatives, and regulatory authorities to discuss urgent measures for protecting public health through robust regu-

lation of iTFAs and a legislative ban on the production and distribution of PHOs.

The session commenced with welcome remarks from Mr. Muhammad Rashid Mafzool Zaka, Executive Director of PIPS, who emphasized the institute's commitment to bridging civil society and parliamentarians for meaningful discourse.

PYCA's Executive Director Ms. Areebah Shahid set the agenda, highlighting the alarming health risks associated with industrial trans fats and the critical need for regulatory and legislative action.

Mr. Munawar Hussain, In-country Coordinator for the Global Health Advocacy Incubator (GHAI), who

presented international best practices. "63 countries have already adopted the best practice policy to curb iTFAs in food supply through regulatory or legislative measures. Pakistan remains in WHO's less restrictive list, which means some progress has been made but still need to ensure significant measures to eliminate iTFAs from all foods.

At the end of the first session, Dr. Shazia Sobia Aslam Soomro, Member of the National Assembly, acknowledged the issue and pledged her support.

The second session shifted focus to strengthening Pakistan's regulatory framework. Civil society leaders, including Mr. Mukhtar Ahmed, Executive Director of the Center

for Peace and Development Initiatives, highlighted the need for strategic partnerships. Dr. Saba Amjad, CEO of Heartfile, pointed out the disparities in industrial practices. "Many industries already have the technology to produce trans fat-free foods and they are producing them for export. However, the items they sell inside Pakistan are laden with industrial trans fats," she stated.

Draft deal at U.N. climate talks calls for rich nations to give \$250 billion by 2035

new draft deal delivered to fatigued negotiators in Baku Friday — the final day for the United Nations climate talks that have been under way for the past two weeks - proposes rich countries commit \$250 billion a year to help vulnerable nations cope with the warming planet and to accelerate the global switch to renewable energy, according to the U.N.

The new draft outcome text, which will surely push this round of talks into the weekend, called for the overall climate financing goal to reach "at least \$1.3 trillion by 2035", but left out specifics grants, loans, or from the private sector – on how these funds will be raised

Civil society climate and environment advocates were quick to react to this latest draft, according to a statement issued at UN Headquarters in New York

"I can say it is disappointing to [at] the very least", said Namrata Chowdhary from the 350.org, an international environmental organization addressing the climate crisis.

"It is a slap. It is insult. It is shocking that we are at this state now. The rich countries are basically gambling with the lives of people in the developing nations and small islands," she said.

Lidy Nacpil from Asian Peoples' Movement on Debt and Development also expressed her disappointment. She also pointed out, that "climate finance should not come in the form of loans because this is adding to the debt burden".

"One of the issues that is preventing the Global South from undertaking urgent climate actions and from also providing our people with essential services that we need is the debt burden," she told UN News.

Jacobo Ocharan of Climate Action Network International said: "We urge all developing countries to have the courage in the negotiations to keep pushing, because this deal is terrible. We keep pushing on the idea that no deal is better than a bad deal."

COP29, formally the 29th Conference of Parties to the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC), has been dubbed, the 'climate finance COP' because parties are expected to establish a new global climate finance target.

This target, or new collective quantified goal (NCQG), is seen as one of the summit's main deliverables. It will replace the existing \$100 billion goal that is due to expire in 2025.

Reforms and innovations create a solid foundation for sustainable development of agriculture

t is difficult to imagine economic development in any country without a strong focus on agriculture. The well-being of citizens in every nation is directly linked to the progress of its agricultural sector. By advancing this sector, countries ensure the production of essential and health-beneficial products for their population and foster the development in Treatment", have of processing systems. In Uzbekistan, significant attention is being paid to the development of agriculture under the leadership of the scientific fields today, President. The sector benefits from the integration of advanced international practices, science, and innovative technologies.

For instance, the Presidential Decree on October 23, 2019, approved the "Strategy for the Development of Agriculture in the Republic of Uzbekistan for 2020–2030" which outlined nine key priority areas for agricultural development.

Due to consistent reforms in the agricultural sector, 200,000-250,000 hectares of open fields designated for grain cultivation were sown using modern resource-saving seeders. Additionally, 50,000-60,000 hectares were leveled using laser technology.

Recognizing this potential, the agricultural sector has placed special emphasis on cultivating medicinal plants, ensuring their preservation, promoting rational use of natural resources, establishing cultivated plantations, and processing raw materials. These efforts have led to significant achievements in these areas.

The introduction of CRISPR technology enabled precise genome editing in plants, leading to the creation of biotechnological crops with improved traits. This innovation has allowed the development of new crop varieties that are safe for human health and the environment. For example, in cotton cultivation, imported cotton varieties such as India's Nech-6 and Nech-51, resistant to bollworm, and China's XinLuZao-52 and XinLuZao-78, resistant to bollworm and herbicides, are being integrated into 13

local varieties. Field trials for these enhanced varieties will begin on a large scale in 2025.

I would like to clarify that, based on the

genetic purity of these imported varieties: XinLuZao-52 at 82%, XinLuZao-78 at 88%, and Chjuntay-2 at 89%. These Create an Additional Value Chain", along- levels exceed the 80% threshold considered optimal for high varietal quality.

In 2025, 4.5 tons of seeds from these varieties will be prepared for planting on 200 hectares. By 2026, seed production will increase to 90 tons for cultivation on 4.000 hectares

Other notable developments include the Porloq-4 and Porloq-7 varieties, which are resistant to salinity, highyielding, and produce long fibers, developed using the Phytochrome A1 gene. In these varieties will be cultivated across 100.000 hectares.

Ensuring food security, creating a favorable agribusiness environment, enhancing value chains, attracting investments, and developing rural areas remain top priorities.

To achieve these goals, the Ministry of Agriculture collaborates with international organizations, including the International Development Association, the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, the Japan International Cooperation Agency, the Asian Development Bank, and the International Fund for Agricultural Development. These partnerships have resulted in agricultural investment projects totaling \$2.062 billion.

Between 2016 and 2023, these projects financed 2.671 initiatives worth \$1.045 billion, creating over 50,978 new jobs.

To advance agricultural education and innovation, the National Center for Knowledge and Innovation in Agriculture, along with 13 regional Agro-Service Centers, was established under Presidential Decree and Resolution, dated February 3, 2021.

Today, Agro-Service Centers offer over 100 services in 17 areas through public enterprises and 18 additional modern services through the private sector.

From 2021 to 2023, these centers, 2025, 4.2 thousand tons of seeds from in collaboration with researchers from the ministry's scientific institutions, conducted more than 3,400 seminars and training sessions. Over 74,000 agricultural specialists participated, significantly enhancing their expertise.

he ongoing 2024 World Internet Conference in Wuzhen, Zhejiang province, themed "Embracing a People-Centered and AI-for-Good Digital Future – Building a Community with a Shared Future in Cyberspace", highlights the importance of artificial intelligence in today's world. With its rapid development, AI has emerged as both a promise and a challenge, pushing the boundaries of high-tech potential while raising profound ethical and social questions.

Thus, integrating data resources across industries is crucial for accelerating China's digital transformation.



ISLAMABAD: A new report, "The Distributed Divide -How Solar Expansion Affects Non-Adopting Consumers and Utility Economics" by Arzachel, reveals that non-solar consumers have borne a staggering burden of PKR 200 billion in FY 2023-24 due to the rapid expansion of solar energy adoption. This transition has caused an estimated tariff increase of PKR 2 per kWh for grid-dependent consumers, underscoring the financial burden and inequities stemming from the insufficiently managed expansion of solar adoption through



behind-the-meter systems and al PKR 131 billion in costs annufinancial burden on non-solar consumers is projected to escalate further. For the current fiscal year, a 5% reduction in grid tion is expected to shift addition- adoption, the report calls for


