ISLAMABAD: Federal Minister for Law and Justice Azam Nazeer Tarar said on Tuesday that the federal government is closely monitoring the situation in Parachinar, with daily reports being provided to the prime minister and the interior minister.

The issue was raised by Abdul Qadir Patel, who informed the National Assembly about a report indicating that 19 children had died in Parachinar due to shortage of medicines.

Tarar said that the federal government is fully aware of its responsibilities regarding the situation in Parachinar.

He confirmed that continuous communication has been maintained with the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KP) government. He further said that the federal government is prepared to fulfill both its constitutional and moral obligations.

Tarar called on the Parliamentary Secretary for Health to gather further details and provide an update to the Assembly on the ongoing situation.

The minister said that, according to the Constitution, maintaining law and order falls under the responsibility of the provincial government. However, he assured that the federal government cannot remain detached in such circumstances and is ready to intervene if necessary.

Law ministry announces major reforms in Criminal Procedure Code

ISLAMABAD: The Ministry of Law and Justice has announced significant reforms in the Criminal Procedure Code (CrPC) 1898.

According to reports, Federal Law Minister Azam Nazeer Tarar presented the wide-ranging amendments in the Criminal Procedure Code, which were unanimously approved by the federal

According to the Ministry, the amendments were recommended by a committee formed under the leadership of Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif. The proposed reforms in the Criminal Procedure Code reflect consultations with bar councils, lawyers, prosecutors, and judges. Key reforms in the Criminal Procedure Code include the introduction of an electronic system for filing FIRs, along with initial inquiry powers for registering FIRs. Furthermore, only female officers will be authorised to arrest women under the new amendments.

The reforms also emphasise the use of modern investigative tools, including audio and video recordings, to enhance evidence accuracy.

As per the new amendments, prosecutors will now have the authority to highlight deficiencies in police reports, ensuring better transparency in the investigation process.

In cases where evidence is insufficient, the Criminal Procedure Code amendments allow for the suspension of investigations, providing a clearer legal process. The Ministry stated that these reforms will improve transparency and accountability in law enforcement agencies.

Following cabinet approval, the proposed amendments in the Criminal Procedure Code will be presented to Parliament for final legislation.

Pakistan faced dengue surge in 2024

Pakistan is facing a significant rise in dengue fever cases in 2024 with over 20,000 infection cases recorded. Over 10 fatalities have been reported so far. The disease, transmitted by Aedesaegypti and Aedes Albopictus mosquitoes (commonly found in areas with dense populations and poor water management), continues to pose serious health challenges

Punjab has emerged as one of the hardest-hit regions, recording 6,838 cases this year. Followed by Sindh with over 5,000 reported cases (mainly from Karachi). Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK) with 4000 cases, Balochistan with 1200 cases, Islamabad with 1,200 cases, and Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) with 800 cases of dengue fever reported this year.

The authorities are striving to control the outbreak through targeted operations to destroy mosquito breeding sites and raising public awareness about preventive measures.

World Health Organisations Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) region has reported 12 million Dengue cases in 2024. This highlights the need for comprehensive preventive strategies and worldwide effort to tackle the disease.

In Pakistan, ongoing efforts are focusing on vector education, public education, awareness campaigns, and timely medical assistance to mitigate the impact of dengue fever. Public vigilance and adherence to preventive measures are the key to controlling this outbreak.

Federal police begin investigations into PTI protest cases

■ he federal police have initiated investigations into multiple cases following the Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf (PTI) protest at D-Chowk According to sources, Joint Investigation Teams (JITs) have been formed to probe all cases related to the PTI protest.

Eighteen JITs have been established for 18 separate cases. Each JIT will be headed by a Superintendent of Police (SP) from the respective zone. The teams will also include officials from the Special Branch (SB), Station House Officers (SHOs), ISI, and IB.

The JITs will record evidence and statements of the suspects involved in the cases. Their complete reports will then be submitted as part of the prosecution pro-

This development comes as the authorities move to investigate the incidents surrounding the PTI protest at D-Chowk, ensuring a thorough and systematic inquiry into all related matters.

Earlier on December 13, PTI founder Imran Khan had been named in an FIR filed over the deaths of three Rangers personnel during the party's protest in Islamabad on November 26.

According to the FIR, registered at Ramna Police Station, Imran Khan and his wife Bushra Bibi, along with other party leaders, are accused of murder, terrorism, and other charges.

The FIR states that the plan to attack the Rangers personnel was hatched in Adiala Jail, where Imran Khan had met with his party leaders. The plan was executed by Bushra Bibi and other party workers, who incited the protesters to attack the Rangers personnel.

The FIR also named other PTI leaders, including Omar Ayub, Sheikh Waqas Akram, Salman Akram Raja, Ali Amin Gandapur, Murad Saeed, Zulfi Bukhari, Raoof Hassan and Hammad Azhar, who allegedly conspired to attack the Rangers personnel.

The incident occurred during PTI's recent protests in Islamabad, where a car driven by an unidentified driver ran over three Rangers personnel, killing them

Sunshine Gold dethrones Black Gold

force shaping global economies over the past two centuries, acting as both a maker and breaker of fortunes. Fluctuations in oil prices and supply chain disruptions have historically been a nightmare for governments worldwide. Low oil prices in the mid-20th century encouraged the production of large, fuel-inefficient vehicles, the conversion of coal-based power plants to oil-based ones, and the industrial shift to oil as a primary energy source. This transition boosted the economies of oil-producing nations, significantly raising the quality of life for their populations. Once regarded as an efficient and clean source of energy, oil—often called "black gold" evolved into a potent political and security tool for oil-rich nations.

By the mid-1970s, oil-producing countries, especially OPEC members, realized the political leverage and economic influence they wielded. The 1973 oil embargo, led by Arab nations, demonstrated how increased oil prices could disrupt global economies and even trigger regime changes. Oil became a weapon that could bring even powerful nations to their knees. In response, oil-importing nations began transforming their industries by developing nuclear power plants and producing fuel-efficient vehicles. However, their reliance on oil persisted. Devastating nuclear plant disasters, such as Chernobyl (1986) and Fukushima (2011), shifted the focus towards renewable energy sources.

Scientists explored several options to reduce dependence on oil, including nuclear fusion, where hydrogen atoms fuse to form helium, releasing immense energy. However, the extreme heat generated by fusion reactions proved too intense for any material currently known to mankind to withstand, making the technology unviable for practical energy generation. Alcohol-based fuels, like Japan (\$6 billion) benefits from resi-

alternatives, but motorists often criticized their performance. This compelled scientists to turn to renewable energy sources such as wind, ocean waves, and solar power as the most promising avenues for reducing reliance on oil. Among these, solar energy emerged as a frontrunner, steadily challenging the dominance of "black gold" with increasing effectiveness.

Recognizing the vast potential of solar energy, countries around the world began making substantial investments in developing innovative technologies to harness it. Global investment in solar energy has surged, with China leading at over \$100 billion in 2023, pioneering perovskite-silicon

tandem cells with efficiencies exceeding 30%, and dominating low-cost panel production. The United States follows, investing \$56 billion, achieving breakthroughs like quantum dot solar cells with 39.5% efficiency and advanced grid-scale storage. India, at \$25 billion, excels in agrivoltaics and bi-facial cells (22% efficiency), while Germany, with \$19 billion, advances thin-film solar cells (26% efficiency) and decentralized storage. Japan, investing \$17 billion, developed multi-junction cells achieving 47% efficiency and floating solar farms.

The global shift to solar energy has enabled significant economic savings by reducing reliance on oil imports. China leads with annual savings of \$13 billion through extensive solar adoption in industries, followed by the United States at \$11 billion due to reduced oil usage in power generation. India saves \$9 billion annually, leveraging solar for rural electrification and industrial needs, while Germany's \$8 billion savings result from replacing oil-fired power plants.

Australia (\$4.5 billion) achieves savings through rooftop solar and large-scale gold nations save over \$60 billion annually, demonstrating solar energy's role in enhancing energy security and cutting

If solar cell efficiency continues to improve, reaching consistent 40-50% efficiency in the coming decades, solar energy could progressively replace oil

across various sectors. By 2035, solar could significantly reduce oil demand for electricity generation, which accounts for 10-15% of current usage, especially with advancements in energy storage and grid integration. By 2050, with widespread adoption and enhanced

technology, solar could replace 70-80% of global oil demand, particularly in electricity, transportation (via electric vehicles), and industrial heating. A complete replacement of oil by solar energy is plausible by the 2060s, contingent on overcoming technological, political, and infrastructural barriers.

This transition would bring profound economic changes. Oil-importing nations would save trillions, enhance energy security, and reduce geopolitical risks, while oil-exporting countries could face severe economic disruptions, necessitating diversification. Global energy markets would shift towards renewables, fostering job creation in solar industries but challenging oil-dependent economies. Additionally, transitioning to solar energy would significantly reduce greenhouse gas emissions, offering environmental and health benefits.

Good news is that sunshine gold (solar energy) does not hold the same economic and security value for producing and consuming countries as black gold (oil).

il has been a dominant ethanol blends, were also introduced as dential and industrial solar systems, and For sunshine-producing countries with abundant sunlight, solar energy offers economic opportunities through domestic farms. Collectively, the top ten sunshine use and export, but unlike oil, it cannot be monopolized or wielded as a geopolitical weapon. Solar energy's decentralized nature makes it accessible to many, reducing the ability of any one country to dominate it.

For sunshine-consuming countries, solar energy provides significant economic benefits by lowering energy costs and enhancing energy security, reducing reliance on foreign oil. However, the security value of solar energy will depend on technological advancements, such as storage and grid infrastructure, and international cooperation.

To foster a win-win situation between sunshine-rich and non-sunshine countries, the global community must right now prioritize equitable collaboration in renewable energy development and trade. This would involve cross-border energy sharing through advanced grids and storage technologies, technology transfer, and joint R&D to adapt renewables to diverse climates. Establishing global green funds, fair carbon credit systems, and hybrid energy solutions can ensure financial and energy access equity.

In addition, international cooperation should be emphasized for fair revenue distribution, capacity building, and private sector engagement, alongside ethical resource management and community empowerment.

By integrating diverse renewable energy sources, fostering innovation, and strengthening global climate agreements, the global community should create a sustainable and inclusive energy future that addresses economic disparities and mutual dependencies.

Education: A Divide Between Claims and Reality

The education sector is always presented as a government priority, but schools, colleges, and educational boards paint a different picture. In rural areas, schools are either closed or have turned into ruins. Where schools are operational, teacher

absenteeism, outdated curricula, and poor learning environments are major challenges. Corruption and a contractor-based system in education boards have eroded quality education. Thousands of children are deprived of schooling each year, and those who do study remain far behind global standards.

Health: Failed Policies and Public Misery

Contrary to the Chief Minister's claims, the state ofgovernment hospitals remains abysmal. Shortages of medicines, lack of doctors, and inadequate medical facilities reflect the health sector's decline.

Even in major cities like Karachi and Hyderabad, basic healthcare is missing, while in rural areas, hospitals exist only in name without proper staff. While efforts to eradicate polio are visible, diseases like hepatitis and dengue continue to spread unchecked, leaving people vulnerable.

Water and Drainage: A Persistent Crisis

Despite repeated promises, the water and drainage

systems in Sindh remain a critical issue. Contaminated and toxic water is being supplied to the population, leading to numerous diseases.

Urban areas see overflowing sewage on roads, while in rural areas, people travel miles to fetch clean water. Poor drainage systems leave cities submerged during rains, and the government's focus appears limited to media photo sessions.

The law and order situation in Sindh continues to deteriorate. From organized crime to political interference in the police, irregularities are evident everywhere. Despite government claims, crime rates have surged, and the justice system has weakened significantly.

Development Projects: Empty Promises on Paper

The government frequently announces development projects for urban and rural areas, but on-ground assessments tell a different story. Many projects have either failed to start or collapsed before completion.

The Reality of Development in Sindh

The people of Sindh still grapple with basic problems. Education has not improved, healthcare is inaccessible, employment opportunities are scarce, and law and order remains a concern. Development is visible only in projects that serve those in power.

When compared to ground realities, Sindh's claims of development appear to be nothing more than illusions. Out of School and Out of Hope: Education **Challenges in Balochistan**

"Only through the right education can a better order of society be built up." The constitution of Pakistan guarantees primary education to all the children of the country, but millions of adolescents in Baluchistan are out of school and struggling to find purpose. The youth of Baluchistan

is facing the problem of a poor education system. The education system in Baluchistan is substandard, and it has many flaws. Baluchistan youth constitute over 65 percent of the province's population, but over 1.2 million children are out of school in the province. The literacy rate in the province

is 54.5 percent, which is less than the country the province. The 2024–25 budget for higher average literacy rate of 60-65 percent. It is one of the alarming issues, and it has a significant impact on the youth of the province.

There are numerous causes and reasons behind the poor structure of the education system in the province. Corruption and nepotism are significant barriers to improving the education system in Baluchistan. Teacher recruitment is often influenced by political figures, such as MPs and MNAs, who priorities personal connections over merit.

Currently, the number of government schools in the province is more than 15,000, but more than 3,500 schools have been closed across the province, and 542 schools have been closed since the new government took charge. The majority of the schools are nonfunctional due to absenteeism of teachers, and many primary schools have only one teacher. The teacher-student ratio is 1:44, which further exacerbates the quality of education. Teacher absenteeism remains a

ccording to Jawaharlal Nehru, persistent issue; many of them are engaging engage in criminal activities like stealing cars with extra jobs or working in private teaching academies, which further increases the prob-

males and females across education in Baluchistan is 5 billion Pakistani rupees which is primarily for salaries and this budget does not leave so much money for academic research. Some other challenges that higher education in Balochistan faces is unpaid salaries, lack of facilities and lack

of qualified administration. The poor education system of the province has many impacts. Due to socioeconomic disparities, many of the youth are not able to pay their fees to pursue their higher education after their completion of secondary education, and due to poverty, many of the children are working as laborers in different hotels, car washing shops, automobile repairing shops, and petrol pumps, and many of them are working in hazardous conditions in the agricultural sector. These children, who are out of school, are exploited by their owners both physically and mentally, and in some cases they are sexually abused, and the adults who are unable to pursue their higher education

and motorcycles, and many engage themselves in drug addictions, which is very

alarming for society. The government must take immediate reforms to solve the issue of the closure of schools across the province. The hiring of the teachers should be only merit-based. The government authorities should increase the educational budget in order to give some relief to the students. They should improve and expand the higher education facilities. The government must take steps towards women's education; they should launch awareness campaigns in the rural areas to promote girls education in Baluchistan.

In a nutshell, the education system in Baluchistan is plagued by numerous challenges, including corruption, lack of infrastructure, teacher absenteeism, and limited higher education opportunities. These issues have not only hindered educational progress but have also contributed to alarming societal problems such as child labor, gender inequality, and youth involvement in crime and drug addiction. With over 1.2 million children out of school and a literacy rate below the national average, immediate action is crucial. The government must prioritize merit-based hiring of teachers, address the closure of schools, and allocate sufficient budgetary resources to improve facilities and support academic research. Furthermore, expanding higher education opportunities and promoting girls' education through awareness campaigns are essential steps toward reducing gender disparities and empowering the youth of Baluchistan. By addressing these systemic issues, the province can pave the way for a more educated and prosperous future for its people.

LAHORE: Pakistan batting maestro Babar Azam is on the verge of achieving multiple milestones in ODI cricket during the upcoming three-match series against South Africa, scheduled to commence on Tuesday in Paarl.

The former Pakistan captain has the opportunity to break South African batting legend Hashim Amla's long-standing record of fastest to 6000 ODI runs.

Amla achieved the feat in 123 innings while Babar has so far scored 5809 runs in 117 innings. He needs 191 runs in his next five innings to break the record.

It's worth noting that Babar holds the record for being the fastest batter to score 5000 ODI runs, having achieved the landmark in 97 innings.

Babar Azam has scored 19 ODI centuries, placing him in an impressive second position in the list of most hundreds by Pakistani batters. He is just one century away from equaling the legendary Saeed Anwar's record of 20 centuries.

During the upcoming three-match ODI series against South Africa, Babar needs to score two centuries to surpass Saeed Anwar and further secure his legacy in cricket history.

If he scores centuries in all three matches, he will join David Warner, Sourav Ganguly, and Tillakaratne Dilshan in tenth place

on the list of most hundreds in ODIs. It's worth noting that after the series opener today, Pakistan and South Africa will play subsequent ODIs in Cape Town and

Johannesburg on December 19 and 22 respectively. Meanwhile, the two-match Test series will kick off in Centurion on December 26, followed by the second Test in Cape Town, starting from January 3.

Justice Mansoor Shah proposes climate court to tackle environmental challenges

ISLAMABAD: Justice Mansoor Ali Shah, the senior-most judge of the Supreme Court, says a climate court should be established to tackle the country's environmental challenges.

Addressing the 2024 United Nations Climate Change Conference via video link, Justice Mansoor Ali Shah has said Pakistan's constitutional courts are addressing environmental matters.

He noted that the country was facing severe climate change challenges and highlighted the role of the Climate Change Authority in tackling climate justice.

He referred to cases like the cement plant in Kallar Kahar, where environmental concerns such as water scarcity were addressed, and the CDA case, where the court directed that planning must be eco-friendly. Recommendations were also made to relocate marble crushing plants or adopt modern technology.

Justice Shah stressed the critical need for climate finance, which is not reaching Pakistan. He suggested that both public and private sectors can contribute to climate finance, describing it as the new form of

Karachi breaks new record in tax collection

KARACHI: The Large Taxpayer Office (LTO) Karachi has set a new record in tax collection, reporting a 20 percent (pc) increase in tax receipts compared to the same period last year.

Reports suggest that, during the first five months of the fiscal year 2024-25, LTO Karachi collected Rs1,110 billion in taxes, a significant rise from Rs924 billion in the corresponding period of the previous

LTO Karachi's direct tax collection during the first five months amounted to Rs542 billion, up from Rs451 billion in the same period last year, marking a 20pc increase. The office also issued Rs47 billion in 2024-25.

refunds over the same period.

Indirect and sales tax collection by LTO Karachi saw an 18pc rise, accumulating Rs494 billion in the first five months. This compares to Rs420 billion collected in the corresponding period last year.

The increase is largely driven by higher local transactions, where sales tax collection saw a 30pc jump to Rs203 billion. However, challenges remain in the collection of import sales tax due to a decline in import bills, according to sources from the Federal Board of Revenue

LTO Karachi, also known as the 'Mini FBR,' has collectively collected Rs1,160 billion in total taxes over the first five months of the fiscal year

Jailed former PM Imran Khan postpones civil disobedience movement

ISLAMABAD: Jailed former prime minister Imran Khan has announced his decision to postpone the civil disobedience movement for a few days on party leaders' request.

"Imran Khan agreed to the party leaders request of delaying the civil disobedience movement," Khan's sister Aleema told reporters outside the Adiala Jail on Tuesday.

"I am worried about the country and I should wait for a few days," she said while quoting her brother.

On December 5, jailed former PM $\,$ Khan revealed his "trump card" by announcing a civil disobedience movement if the government failed to act on the party's demand. He also formed a negotiating committee to fulfil those



demands, including the release of political prisoners and a judicial inquiry into the events of May 9 and November 26.

His orders came after several PTI supporters had lost their lives due to "state terrorism" during his "final call" for nationwide protests on November 24. Such protests aimed to demand the restoration of the PTI's electoral mandate, the release of detained party members, and the reversal of the 26th Constitutional Amendment.

After violent clashes between security forces and PTI protesters in Islamabad, the party leadership quickly retreated from the Red Zone on November 27. The three days of protests resulted in six fatalities, including a police officer and three Rangers struck by a speeding vehicle, according to officials.

OGRA approves major increase in gas prices across Pakistan

ISLAMABAD: The Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA) has approved significant hikes in gas prices, affecting consumers nationwide.

According to reports, the decision, sent to the federal government for final approval, will see an average increase of 25.78 percent (pc) for consumers in Sindh and Balochistan, while consumers in Islamabad, Punjab, and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa will experience an 8.71pc rise.

Under the new tariff structure, the average gas price for Sui Southern Gas Company (SSGC) has been set at Rs1,762.51 per MMBTU, and for Sui Northern Gas Pipelines Limited (SNGPL), it's Rs1,778.35 per MMBTU. These changes aim

to address financial needs totalling Rs527.55 billion for SNGPL and Rs319.78 billion for SSGC, along with adjustments for prior receivables. The companies had originally

sought increases in gas prices as high as 208.67pc but were met with public hearings by OGRA last month.

OGRA's decision to forward the recommendations to the federal government for final approval means that a notification will be issued once the government grants its consent.

This revision in gas prices comes amidst rising financial pressures on the gas companies, with SNGPL receiving approval to recover over Rs50 billion from previous adjustments, and SSGC allowed to recover Rs48.85 billion.
