

WANA: Security forces thwarted an infiltration attempt by the Khorasan faction of the Khawarij terrorists at the Pakistan-Afghanistan border.

According to sources, 20 to 25 Khawarij terrorists attempted to infiltrate into Pakistan from two locations in Kurram and North Waziristan on the night between Dec 27 and 28, using Afghan Taliban border posts. Pakistani security forces acted promptly and foiled the infiltration attempt.



Sources revealed that on the and Afghan Taliban jointly morning of Dec 28, the Khawarij opened fire on Pakistani posts

with heavy weapons without provocation.

Pakistani security forces responded swiftly and forcefully to the firing. According to sources, initial reports indicate significant losses on the Afghan side.

Effective retaliatory fire led to the death of over 15 Khawarij and Afghan Taliban fighters, with several others injured. Due to the effective counter-action and shelling, Afghan Taliban forces fled, abandoning six posts.



PM directs completion of smart meters' installation; steps to overcome power theft

ISLAMABAD: Prime Minister Muhammad Shehbaz Sharif on Saturday directed to complete the installation of smart meters as soon as possible to ensure transparency in the billing system and called for concrete steps to prevent electricity theft.

The prime minister chaired a review meeting on the performance of Electricity Distribution Companies (DISCOs). The deliberations centered on the affairs of Lahore Electric Supply Company (LESCO), Peshawar Electric Supply Company (PESCO) and Faisalabad Electric Supply Company (FESCO), PM Office Media Wing said in a press release.

During the meeting, the prime minister said that the overbilling was unacceptable and strict action would be taken against officers involved in such practices.

He expressed concern over the delay in the appointment process of Chief Executive Officers (CEOs) of the distribution companies and directed for ensuring CEOs' appointments through a highly transparent process and asked for its completion at the earliest.

Recruitment of workforce in distribution companies should be merit-based, with no compromise on transparency, he further added.

The prime minister said that all the available resources should be utilized to



meet the targets of NEPRA.

Minister for Economic Affairs Ahsan Iqbal, Minister for Power Division Sardar Owais Ahmad Khan Leghari, Minister of State for Information Technology and Telecommunication Shaza Fatima, Minister of State for Finance and Revenue Ali Pervez Malik. Prime Minister's Coordinator Rana Ahsan Afzal and senior government officials attended the meeting.

The meeting was given a detailed briefing on the achievement of targets which included recovery rates (up to November of FY 2024-25): LESCO: 96.82 percent, PESCO: 87.98 percent and FESCO: 97.57 percent.

LESCO, PESCO and FESCO offered consumers' facilities for complaint resolution and other services via call centers, emails, websites, interactive voice response (IVR) systems, and NEPRA's mobile and web services.

FAISALABAD: The Coordinator of the Minister for Labour and Human Resources Punjab has started conducting raids on various factories in Faisalabad, harassing their owners, while we are fully complying with social security contributions and paying all workers' dues. This was stated by Hazar Khan, Senior Vice Chairman of the Pakistan Hosiery Manufacturers and Exporters Association, during a media talk.

He said that workers' social security payments are being made in accordance with the minimum monthly salary of Rs. 37,000 set by the Punjab government, whereas social security laws do not set a limit on the maximum wage, and these workers are not subject to it.

Hazar Khan further said that, unfortunately, the Coordinator's team and the Social Security Commissioner's team have been harassing our factory owners for the last few days, forcing them to pay all workers' dues. He added that our industry is already facing major challenges, and these unforeseen raids could disrupt our Christmas and New Year orders, heightening the risk of worker unemployment.

He urged the government to promptly stop these surprise raids and restore the officers from the Social Security and Labour Departments who were suspended. He warned that if this issue is not resolved, a press conference will be held, and a strike will be called.

CDA pushes for Eco-friendly public transport in Islamabad

ISLAMABAD: Capital Development Authority (CDA) is intensifying efforts to establish an environmentally sustainable public transport system in Islamabad.

In a meeting chaired by CDA Chairman Muhammad Ali Randhawa on Saturday, progress on the operations of electric and feeder buses was reviewed.

Senior officials, including members from the Planning, Technology, and Finance departments, participated in the session.

During the meeting, it was revealed that 160 electric buses have been allocated to feeder routes, designed to integrate seamlessly with the city's Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) network.

The project also includes the establishment of 216 bus stops and four strategically located depots, supported by robust charging infrastructure.

Four feeder routes, operational since July this year, have already witnessed a notable increase in daily ridership.

He praised Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif's courageous stance on the Kashmir issue, describing it as a reflection of Pakistan's unwavering commitment to the cause and desire for a just and peaceful resolution to the longstanding dispute.

The minister extended congratulations on behalf of himself and the Prime Minister for organizing a successful event, and appreciated the efforts of the Federal Secretary of Education and his team.

Engineer Amir Muqam expressed his pride in being part of an event held in the heart of Islamabad that celebrates Kashmiri culture and heritage, showcasing solidarity with Kashmiri brothers and sisters.

"The event provides an opportunity to experience the richness of Kashmiri culture, art, and history, which embodies a unique blend of Buddhist, Hindu, and Islamic traditions," he pointed out.

He acknowledged the immense challenges faced by the Kashmiri people.

"Despite these adversities, the resilience and determination of the Kashmiri people are evident in their continuous efforts to preserve and promote their cultural heritage," he noted.

The minister lamented the decades-long Indian occupation of Kashmir, which has caused significant damage to the region's social, cultural, and economic fabric. He underscored that repeated strikes and shutdowns have severely impacted the region's economy, while the ongoing Indian terrorism and extremism have turned the lives of Kashmiris into a nightmare. Despite these challenges, he commended the Kashmiri people for keeping their traditions alive and preserving their cultural identity. He recalled that the Kashmiri Muslims had ideologically aligned their future with Pakistan even before its creation, and Pakistan has never abandoned the Kashmiri people during difficult times.

DG ISPR Says the Country is in Safe Hands

he DG ISPR began his latest to individuals and groups who participate press conference by highlighting the professional achievements that demonstrate the war readiness of the armed forces to counter any foreign

aggression. As evidence, he elaborated on various professional tasks undertaken by the armed forces to prepare them to face any adversity. These included the construction of dams, restoration of the Kachi Canal, rehabilitation of the Sibi-Harnai railway track, construction and opening of schools in Balochistan and the erstwhile FATA, the establishment of medical camps, border control along the Afghan-Pakistan trade corridor, and measures to counter electricity theft. He informed the audience that disproportionate funds have been invested in Balochistan to alleviate and improve the socio-economic well-being of its people, highlighting this as one of the armed forces' most significant professional achievements.

He also elaborated on other professional achievements, including the punishment meted out to the alleged 85 civilian perpetrators of the events of May 9 by military courts. He equated this to the swift justice delivered to civilians involved in violent agitation in the USA, UK, and France, while conveniently overlooking the fact that in the countries he cited, such punishments were handed down by civilian courts, not military courts.

The ISPR Chief also claimed the distinction of labeling various sections of Pakistani society with his preferred terms. He referred to the TTP Pakistanis as Khawarij, labeled social media activists, whether operating inside or outside Pakistan, as "digital terrorists," and described Pakistanis living along the border areas as "smugglers." Additionally, he branded those exercising their constitutional right to assembly and protest as "armed thugs." This time, he added yet another label to his repertoire-"political terrorists"-referring gag social media platforms in order to safe- the armed forces remained engaged with

in processions, sit-ins, or protests. Without explicitly naming PTI, he implied that this term exclusively applies to its members and supporters. While describing the armed forces'

approach to Afghan policy, he stated that the armed forces are engaged with the Afghan government at various levels, both bilaterally and through mutually friendly countries. He clearly conveyed that such engagements are undertaken at the direction of the Army Chief.

It can be easily anticipated that, in future press conferences, should this policy fail, its failure will be conveniently attributed to the civilian leadership, who, according to the armed forces' narrative, are often portraved as neither competent nor

capable of handling such sensitive matters. This strategy of shifting responsibility has been effectively employed by the armed forces in the past. A recent example is the policy of negotiating a settlement with the TTP, which was led by the former Army Chief and DG ISI. Not a single civilian was involved in the negotiations, the signing of agreements, or the facilitation of the TTP's settlement in certain regions of Pakistan. These actions were undertaken without any coherent or effective efforts to deradicalize TTP members or ensure their integration into society as responsible citizens. However, now that this policy has failed, its failure has conveniently been attributed to the former civilian government.

The DG ISPR reiterated the commitment of the armed forces to the defense of the country. In this regard, he identified social media activists as the biggest enemies of the state and elaborated on a comprehensive offensive set in place to counter this threat. He stated that millions of dollars have been invested to

guard the country from the onslaught of political parties both overtly and covertly, 'digital terrorists," who are incidentally Pakistanis, both within the country and from the overseas Pakistani community. He also accused human rights organizations, civil rights movements, and international human rights watchdogs of fictitiously highlighting human rights abuses by fabricating and disseminating fake videos on social media. He advised these organizations to focus instead on human rights abuses in Gaza and Indian-Occu-

pied Kashmir. The DG ISPR also rightly identified governance issues as the root cause of the societal, economic, and law and order challenges facing the country. However, he conveniently stated that these were the responsibility of the civilian

leadership and bureaucracy. Conversely, during his press conference, he did not hesitate to convey the perception that the armed forces are in control of every facet of national life without exception. He touched upon governance issues, political matters, foreign policy, domestic politics, the justice system, development projects, border control regimes, developments in Balochistan, Afghan policy, and relations with India. In fact, the DG ISPR made it clear during his press conference that the armed forces are fully in control of the entire governance system, while conveniently shifting the blame for the root causes of the country's myriad issues onto the civilian government.

While replying to a question, the DG ISPR stated that the armed forces have no favorite or unfavorite political party, seemingly unaware that his entire press conference targeted one political party and its leaders, labeling them as "political terrorists." While professing the armed forces' neutrality, he also mentioned that


which he claimed was irrefutable evidence of their neutrality.

The DG ISPR repeatedly used a standard narrative in his comments. He claimed that the armed forces, with the help of the people of Pakistan, defeated the D-Chowk protesters who allegedly carried firearms, tear gas shells, and nail-studded batons, and referred to them as "political terrorists" who had killed Rangers personnel. However, he conveniently omitted any mention of civilians allegedly killed by the Rangers' direct fire. He further stated that the armed forces would defeat the political party marked with a "red cross" with the help of the people of Pakistan. Similarly, he asserted that the armed forces would defeat digital terrorists and smugglers with the support of the people of Pakistan. Yet, he failed to provide any reason, logic, or evidence to substantiate the claim that the people of Pakistan support the armed forces in their actions against these various "terrorists," all of whom happen to be Pakistani citizens.

Following the heavily attended press conference, the entire Pakistani nation has been assured that it is in the safe and capable hands of Pakistan's armed forces. The message conveyed was that no harm could come to the nation under their protection. While traditionally the armed forces were the defenders of the country's borders, during Zia's era, they additionally assumed the role of defending the country's ideological frontiers. Now, they have taken on the additional title of defending the nation's social media space. Practically, they have become the defenders of every aspect of national life without exception. The nation is thus reassured, feeling safe, sound, and protected under the firm and patriotic grip of the armed forces.

Criminal Networks Exploit Fake Documents for Global Visa Fraud

According to the investigation, individuals from countries like India, Bangladesh, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, and Afghanistan-where obtaining a visa is often a difficult task—are turning to Malaysia to procure fake visas for these destinations.

The scheme involves unregistered consultancy

agencies and rogue agents who operate from for individuals seeking a better life, but it their rooms, offering visa consultancy services for a fee ranging from 3,000 to 15,000 Malaysian Ringgit. These agents prepare visa applications with fake bank statements, hotel bookings, forged details, and sometimes even fake work permits, which are then submitted to embassies.

n a startling investigative report, it fying the authenticity of documents like work representing European countries, the U.S., has been revealed that fraudulent visas, bank statements, insurance, and hotel the UK, and Japan etc, take immediate action.

They must verify the authenticity of visa applicants' work visa permits, bank statements, company letter, travel insurance, and hotel bookings with official sources to ensure that the documents submitted are genuine and not tampered with. In many cases, visa applicants present bank account balances as low as 5,000 Ringgit but artificially inflate

Yet, these embassies fail to carry out basic checks. To combat this, it is essential that these embassies include clear disclaimers on their websites and visa application forms, warning that providing fake documents or information will result in legal action. Offenders should be handed over to the police or immigration authorities, and the media should be notified through press releases to discourage individuals from resorting to fraudulent methods.

It is high time that strict action be taken to curb this growing problem, and prevent the exploitation of the visa system that continues the UK, etc. The majority of those entering to compromise the security and integrity of these nations.

Pakistan launches ambitious Carbon Market Policy to combat climate change

The policy is supported by international organizations such as USAID, World Bank, UNEP, and GIZ, which are aiding Pakistan in building carbon market regulations, a carbon registry, and a pipeline of projects. These partnerships are expected to mobilize significant capital and expertise to turn the policy into impactful actions for climate resilience.

Federal officials emphasized that the policy will channel investments into sectors with high emissions reduction potential, foster the deployment of clean technologies, and contribute to achieving Pakistan's Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs).

With this policy, Pakistan has extended an invitation to global carbon market players to $collaborate \, in \, developing \, projects \, that \, support$ national development, uplift local communities, and contribute to a sustainable low-carbon economy.

"This policy marks a decisive step forward for Pakistan's climate ambition. It's a call to action for both domestic and global partners to join hands in creating a resilient, low-carbon future for Pakistan," stated the ministry spokesperson.

As one of the most climate-vulnerable nations, Pakistan's proactive approach through national climate funds, while only 5% of credits its Carbon Market Policy could set a benchmark for other developing nations striving for sustainable growth and climate action.



China launches investigation into beefimports

ISLAMABAD: China's commerce ministry on Friday launched an investigation into imported beef at the request of representatives from its struggling domestic industry, it said.

The local price of beef in China has trended downwards in recent years, with analysts blaming oversupply and a lack of demand as the world's second largest economy has slowed.

At the same time imports have surged, with China representing a hugely important market for countries like Brazil, Argentina and Australia.

The application for an investigation from domestic associations said that a sharp increase in beef imports in recent years "has had a significant adverse impact on the domestic industry", the commerce ministry said in a statement

Beef imports in 2023 were 65 percent higher than in 2019, it quoted the producers as saying.



The investigation takes effect from Friday and should take eight months, but "may be extended appropriately under special circumstances", the announcement said.

Normal trade will not be affected during the investigation period.

Brazil, the world's biggest beef exporter, said it "will seek to demonstrate that Brazilian beef exported to China does not cause any type of harm to the Chinese industry, and is, on the contrary, an important factor in complementing local Chinese production."

Its foreign ministry noted that, "in principle, no preliminary measures will be adopted, and the 12 percent 'ad valorem' tariff that China applies to beef imports will remain in force.'

Brazil's statement said that China, its main trading partner, this year received more than one million tonnes of Brazilian beef, a 12.7 percent increase over last year.

It added that it was committed to defending Brazil's agribusiness sector and was "always seeking constructive dialogue in search of mutually beneficial solutions" with China.

Record Rs39 per unit hike in power tariff in 2024 bamboozles consumers

ISLAMABAD: While 2024 proved to be a good year for people as prices of items of daily use came down, a record increase in electricity prices during the same year not only hit the industrial sector hard but also forced domestic consumers to install solar plates so that they did not have to pay inflated electricity bills.

The tariff for the consumers of stateowned power distribution companies (DISCOs) went up by Rs39 per unit in just one year, while there was a hike by Rs26.11 per unit in the tariff for the consumers of Karachi Electric (K-Electric).

The consumers were given electric shocks under the heads of monthly and guarterly fuel price adjustments as well as line losses and capacity payments.

Hence, an additional burden of millions of rupees was put on them.

According to the National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA),

under the head of a monthly fuel adjustment, thus putting an additional burden of Bs32.68 per unit on consumers while these were reduced only four times under the same head during the year under review.



The NEPRA has said that similarly, the power tariff was increased four times under the head of quarterly fuel adjustment during the year, 2024; hence putting an additional burden of Rs6.57 per unit on the people.

The Authority goes on to inform that while on the one hand, a record hike in

electricity prices were increased eight times electricity prices gave sleepless nights to the people, on the other hand, the government was also forced to revisit its energy policy.

Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif formed a Taskforce so that the power production cost could be brought down.

The Force held negotiations with the independent power producers (IPPs) so that the burden on the government as well on the people could be reduced.

So far, agreements with five IPPs have been terminated while negotiations with 13 IPPs are in the final stages, the NEPRA has informed.

The Authority has also shed light on the performance of Discos, which it had termed 'disappointing'.

It has said that the poor performance of these DISCOs caused a loss of Rs596 billion to the national exchequer in just one year.

Moreover, the NEPRA has disclosed that 140 people lost their lives in the country during one year due to electrocution.

SBP issues new regulatory framework for exchange companies

ISLAMABAD: The State Bank of Pakistan has issued a new regulatory framework for exchange companies, effective from January 1, 2025.

According to reports, under this framework, exchange companies are required to adjust their policies and systems in accordance with the new regulations by June 30, 2025.

The minimum paid-up capital for exchange companies has been increased to Rs. 1 billion. Full implementation of this paid-up capital requirement is expected by 2027. By December 2025, exchange companies must ensure their paid-up capital reaches Rs. 600 million, and by December 2026, it should be Rs. 800 million.

Furthermore, exchange companies are required to maintain 15 percent of their regulatory reserves as cash security with the State Bank. Exchange company shareholders and directors must seek State Bank approval before withdrawing company funds or taking loans.

State Bank has also mandated that exchange companies can only use financing for vehicle-related loans. Exchange companies must report their returns, regulatory reserves, and documents to the State Bank for framework compliance.

The new framework is designed to increase transparency within exchange companies and is aimed at strengthening investor confidence, according to the State Bank.

Earlier, the State Bank of Pakistan



launched a new version of the Electronic Credit Information Bureau (eCIB) system V2 in Karachi.

According to reports, the new eCIB system, will be operational from January 1, 2025. The newly introduced V2 aligns with technological advancements and reporting standards.

It introduces several updates and amendments to credit information

reports. What is eCIB?

The Credit Information Bureau (CIB) of the State Bank of Pakistan, established in 1992 under Section 25(A) of the Banking Companies Ordinance-1962, plays a crucial role in credit risk management and promoting a sound credit culture within the financial system.

Initially, CIB's activities were focused on collecting and organizing data of borrowers with loans of Rs. 500,000 and above on a quarterly basis. However, the system evolved significantly with the introduction of eCIB online facilities in 2003, making CIB the first in the region to offer such services.

The revamped eCIB, operational since September 2005, now incor-

porates a wider scope by removing the minimum reporting threshold, capturing data from more than 4 million borrowers across about 100 member institutions.

This new system uses advanced technology, including high-capacity servers, security measures, and pointto-point encryption, improving efficiency, speed, and reliability. The enhancements enable financial institutions to make informed lending decisions, assess credit risks more accurately, and expand access to credit across diverse borrower categories like SMEs, agriculture, and consumer finance sectors.

The strengthened CIB contributes to the financial stability and promotes international standards in Pakistan's financial system.

Notably, this year Arshad Nadeem won the men's javelin title, Pakistan's first individual gold at an Olympics, with a Games record of 92.97m.

Komal Khan to lead Pakistan in ICC U19 Women's T20 World Cup

LAHORE: The Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) on Saturday revealed the squad for the upcoming ICC U19 Women's T20 World Cup 2025.

The Women's National Selection Committee named a 15-member squad that will partake in the 16-team tournament, scheduled in Malaysia from January 18 to February 2, 2025.

Wicketkeeper-batter Komal Khan will lead the side, while Zoofishan Ayyaz will be vice-captain of the team.

Pakistan team, which recently featured in six-team ACC U19 Women's Asia Cup in Malaysia will undergo a training camp at the Hanif Mohammad High Performance Centre in Karachi from 31 December to 9 January.

The team will depart for Malaysia from Karachi via Dubai on 10 January.

According to the tournament's format, there are four groups, with each group consisting of four teams.

Pakistan are placed in Group B alongside England, Ireland and the USA. Pakistan will play their opening match on 18 January against the USA.

This will be followed by the encounter against England on 20 January, while Pakistan's last group match will be against Ireland on 22 January. All three Pakistan matches will be staged at the JCA Oval, Johor in Malaysia.

Following the conclusion of the Group Stage fixtures, three teams from each group will qualify for the Super Six. The bottomranked sides from Groups A and D, and B and C will contest in last place play-off on 24 January

The 12 teams, which will qualify for the Super Six stage will be divided into two groups. Group one will include the top three teams each from Group A and Group D while Group two will have top three teams each from Group B and Group C.

In the Super Six stage every team will carry forward their wins, points and Net Run-rate (NRR) which is secured against their fellow Super Six qualifying teams. Each team will play two games in the Super Six stage

The top two sides from the two super six stage groups will qualify for the semi-finals. The semi-finals are set to take place on January 31, while the final of the tournament will be played at Bayuemas Oval in Kuala Lumpur on 2 February.

Telecom operator ordered to refund Rs2 billion to customers

ISLAMABAD: The Islamabad High Court has upheld the Pakistan Telecommunication Authority's (PTA) order for Pakistan's digital and telecommunication service provider ZONG to refund more than Rs 2 billion to customers.

Justice Mian Gul Hassan Aurangzeb dismissed Zong's appeal against the PTA order, directing it to refund Rs2,028,038,584 (more than 2 billion, 28 million rupees) collected from customers on account of service/maintenance/cards/operational fee charges from 26.04.2019 to 12.07.2019.

The court observed in its decision "Cellular mobile operators, including the appellant, had been charging Rs10 from customers each time they purchased and used a prepaid card valuing Rs.100/- as assistance/maintenance / administrative service charges".

Justice Mian Gul Hassan Aurangzeb said that the Supreme Court, in its order, expressed that the service charges could not have been validly and legally imposed on the amounts loaded by users of mobile phone devices."

IHC dismissed Zong's appeal against the PTA decision calling it not maintainable

According to the court order, PTA

directed Zong to provide complete details of service/maintenance charges recovered from 24.04.2019 onwards.

It was reported that Zong had charged and collected Rs2,028,038,584 from its customers between 26.04.2019 and 12.07.2019 on account of service/ maintenance/card / operational fee charges.

PTA directed Zong to refund the said amount to all its concerned subscribers in the form of a balance amount without any validity restriction.

Earlier, Pakistan's Telecom Operators Association expressed concerns over the heavy taxes slapped in budget 2024.

In a letter written to the Chairman of the Standing Committee on Finance, Salim Mandviwala, the Telecom Operators expressed concerns over the heavy taxes introduced in the budget.

The telecom sector has warned that foreign investment might withdraw from Pakistan if tax issues are not resolved. According to the telecom operators, unresolved tax issues could lead to legal complications for the government.

The letter highlights that two major market players have already decided to leave Pakistan. The telecom sector contributed PKR 340 billion in tax revenue last year, and has attracted direct investment of USD 15 billion to date, the letter stated.
