

ISLAMABAD: The National Assembly reconvened on Monday after a two-day break to resume debate on the federal budget for fiscal year 2025-26.

Minister Finance Muhammad Aurangzeb is expected to formally conclude the budget debate later today, with a final vote scheduled for

The session, presided over by Speaker Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, was marked by fiery speeches and intense confrontations between treasury and opposition members.

Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) Chairman Bilawa Bhutto Zardari delivered a wide-ranging speech, touching on the federal budget, regional security, and foreign policy particularly condemning the recent US-led strikes on Iranian nuclear sites.

Addressing the assembly, Bilawal warned that any radiation leak from the attacks on Iranian nuclear facilities could have affected not just Iran but also neighboring countries like Pakistan.

He harshly condemned Israel's aggression, accusing Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu of "genocide" against Muslims and declared, "Iran's sovereignty must be respected."

The JMC serves as the highest institutionalized platform for bilateral cooperation between Pakistan and the UAE. The upcoming session will take forward the agenda of deepening strategic, economic and development cooperation between the two brotherly countries.

GILGAT /RAWALPINDI: President of All Jammu and Kashmir Muslim Conference and former Prime Minister Sardar Attique Ahmad Khan said that the American attacks on Iran's nuclear sites are highly condemnable. These attacks are stubbornness, aggression and war crimes. After backing Israel, now America has come out in the open. American aggression is tantamount to destroying world peace. US President Donald Trump, demonstrating deceit and deception,

went back on his promise not to start new wars. He said that the entire Kashmiri and Pakistani nation stands with Iran, he expressed these views while talking to the media. Security Plan Finalised for Muharram in Attock: 110 speakers banned to ensure peace

ATTOCK: To maintain religious harmony and law and order during the holy month of Muharram, the Attock district administration has imposed gagging orders on 42 controversial speakers and barred 68 Ulema and Zakireen from entering the district. Alongside these preventive measures, a comprehensive security plan has been finalized for Muharram processions and majalis, with troops placed on standby to respond to any untoward incident. These details were shared by Deputy Commissioner Attock, Rao Atif Raza, while speaking to the media on Monday.

The DC informed that of the 145 scheduled Muharram processions in the district, 28 have been classified as highly sensitive (Category A), 25 as moderately sensitive (Category B), and 92 as low risk (Category C). Similarly, out of 745 majalis, 181 are marked as Category A, 30 in Category B, and 544 in Category C.

In response to a query, Rao Atif Raza stated that 754 majalis will be organised across the district, including 66 in Attock, 70 in Hasanabdal, 173 in Fatehjang, 325 in Pindigheb, and 120 in Jand. A total of 145 Zuljanah processions will take place—29 of them licensed and 116 traditional.

He said that more than 2,500 police officials will be deployed for security arrangements. The deployment includes 5 DSPs, 10 SHOs, 180 Sub-Inspectors and ASIs, 119 Head Constables, 1,100 Constables, 20 Lady Constables, Elite Force personnel, and over 640 trained volunteers. Organisers have also been directed to deploy their own volunteers

at entry points, equipped with walkthrough gates and metal detectors. The DC emphasised that strict surveillance will be maintained by law enforcement agencies to monitor the movements of religious extremists, proclaimed offenders, and other elements that could disrupt peace.

Government Efforts Have Been initiated to Restore the Historic Forts of the Cholistan Region

MULTAN: Efforts have been initiated to restore the historic forts of the Cholistan region. A comprehensive restoration project worth Rs. 2.90 billion has been prepared to preserve these forts in their original form. In the budget for the upcoming fiscal year, Rs. 1.89 billion have been allocated for this purpose.

Additional Chief Secretary South Punjab, Mr. Fuad Hashim Rabbani, expressed his gratitude to Chief Minister Maryam Nawaz Sharif for providing the funds. Sharing details of the project, he stated that Rs. 1.80 billion will be spent on restoring the Derawar Fort to its original state, and the project is expected to be completed within two years.

He further informed that Jamgarh, Meergarh, Moujgarh, Deengarh, Phulara, and Marot Forts will also be restored to their original conditions. Fuad Hashim Rabbani added that more than 20 historic forts in Cholistan will be preserved in phases, and this restoration of cultural heritage will help promote tourism in the region.

Iran-Israel conflict could have severe repercussions for Pakistan: Madood Khan

MUZAFFARABAD: Former President of Azad Jammu and Kashmir and senior diplomat Sardar Masood Khan has warned that the escalating Iran-Israel conflict could have grave and far-reaching implications for Pakistan's national security and stability.

In a series of media interviews, Khan expressed deep concern over the Iran and Israel, cautioning that a making it vulnerable to exploitation by

prolonged war could trigger a new wave of refugee influx into Pakistan, similar "Groups backed by hostile foreign to the aftermath of the Afghan conflict.

"If the war drags on, there is a strong possibility of a mass exodus of Iranian refugees towards Pakistan," he stated, noting that such a scenario would strain Pakistan's resources and social fabric.

Khan emphasized that a potentially more dangerous outcome would be the widening scope of hostilities between weakening of the Pakistan-Iran border.

Dr. Riffat Parveen Siddiqui, Chairperson of the Department of Library Science at the University of Karachi, attended the event as Guest of Honor. She





BBC's biased coverage of Israel's war on Gaza

srael's war on Palestinians from the outset has been fought in the media, and even at a more aggressive level since October 2023. Israel has poured huge resources into its propaganda drive, to persuade particularly Western powers that its war and actions were justified. It has denied journalists access to Gaza, and killed over 185 Palestinian media workers in the enclave in this period.

Few media networks have been under more sustained Israeli assault than the BBC. Its global reach of 450 million people puts it in the front line of Israeli government efforts. It parades its reputation for impartiality, but as a new data-driven report published last week highlights, when it comes to Palestinians this is far from the case. Some argue the BBC has become complicit in Israel's war crimes. The Gaza coverage has been like walking on eggshells, the BBC refusing to call out what is going on. The abundant use of the passive voice where the party committing the crime is not identified is a notable feature.

The report from the Center for Media Monitoring, a Muslim Council of Britain project, examined the BBC's coverage of Israel's war on Gaza primarily between 7 Oct. 7, 2023 and Oct. 6, 2024. For this 12-month window, a total of 3,873 articles and 32,092 broadcast segments were analyzed using AI and human

Some of the findings are jaw dropping. BBC presenters shared the Israeli perspective 11 times more frequently than the Palestinian perspective (2,340 vs. 217), even when interviewing neutral third parties, such as humanitarian organizations. That is not even close. BBC article headlines referred to Palestinian casualties just two times more than Israeli casualties, despite there having been 34 times more deaths in Gaza.

Statistics do not tell the whole story, as BBC editors are quick to point out, but this report highlights alarming patterns of coverage. The absence of proper context is stark. Previous Israeli wars and atrocities in Gaza get scant reference. That 70 percent of the population are 1948 refugees is not there. Even with the Israeli war on Iran, no mention is made of Israel's nuclear arsenal and its refusal to sign up to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty.

The BBC's coverage of international legal issues is incredibly poor, and again favorable to Israel. The BBC rarely used occupation to describe the legal status of Gaza. Only recently did it finally get its international editor to pen a still timid piece on whether Israel had committed war crimes in Gaza. Since the International Criminal Court issued an arrest warrant for Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu, the fact that he is wanted for war crimes and crimes against humanity is rare-

Worse, BBC presenters have actively shut down the widespread debate on whether Israel has been committing genocide in over 100 documented cases according to the report. This is extraordinary since the International Court of Justice determined that the situation in Gaza was so serious it had to order provisional measures against Israel to prevent genocide. That was in January 2024 and the situation is considerably worse now. Most human rights groups have determined Israel is committing genocide.

"Pakistan's Nuclear Deterrent: The Last Line of Sovereignty Amid Global Hypocrisy"

n recent years—and more alarmingly in recent weeks-there has been a steady uptick in international discourse subtly, and at times overtly, targeting Pakistan's nuclear capability. Under the deceptive umbrella of "non-nuclear proliferation," influential voices across Western capitals and affil-

iated think tanks have begun a new campaign of narrative engineering. The recent tweet by Mir Moersi, an Israeli political scholar, suggesting the elimination of Pakistan's nuclear arsenal, is not an isolated remark-it is a reflection of deeper strategic ambitions.

These kinds of statements do not emerge in a vacuum. They are often the echoes

of closed-door conversations held in policy circles across Washington, London, and Tel Aviv-disguised as academic or humanitarian concerns, but in reality functioning as soft weapons in psychological warfare. The aim is simple: pressure Pakistan into disarmament, weaken its defense posture, and leave it strategically vulnerable.

Pakistan's nuclear program, however, is not a mere political symbol. It is the result of decades of sacrifice, scientific advancement, and an existential need to maintain strategic parity in a hostile neighborhood. The notion that this program can be undone by diplomatic coercion or foreign-sponsored disinformation campaigns is not only naive but dangerously ignorant of

Pakistan's history, its sacrifices, and its geopolitical realities.

The global powers who preach non-proliferation have never held Israel accountable for its clandestine nuclear capabilities. Nor have they imposed sanctions on India for its continuous military modernization and provocative actions in the region. Yet, Pakistan, which has never used its nuclear power irresponsibly or aggressively,

is consistently singled out and subjected to moral scrutiny.

Because Pakistan's nuclear capacity is not just a deterrent it is a geopolitical obstacle. It ensures that Pakistan cannot be bullied into submission, fragmented through military adventurism, or dragged into proxy conflicts without serious consequences.

These lobbies do not merely aim to spark debate; they aim to provoke responses. A narrative is floated, Pakistan reacts defensively, tensions rise, and before long, a manufactured diplomatic crisis begins. The next stage is even more dangerous: military posturing by adversaries, international media pressure, and perhaps a false-flag operation to justify direct action possibly against Pakistan's nuclear assets.

This is a strategic script we've seen before in Iraq, in Libya, in Syria. All had either begun or attempted to begin defense programs, and all were dismantled under the guise of interna-

Pakistan must be clear-eyed and firm. Its nuclear doctrine is defensive, not offensive. It is a safeguard-not a threat. It is the one element in Pakistan's defense strategy that levels the playing field against far larger, better-funded, and increasingly aggressive regional actors.

The state must launch a proactive counter-narrative: diplomatically, academically, and in media. Our ambassadors and envoys must challenge these narratives at international forums. Pakistani think tanks and media must expose the hypocrisy behind selective non-proliferation efforts. And above all, internal security must be intensified around our strategic instal-

In a world where allies are temporary and interests are permanent, Pakistan's nuclear program is the single most enduring guarantee of national survival and sovereignty. It cannot and must not be compromised under any foreign pressure—be it diplomatic or psychological.

Those who target Pakistan's nuclear assets under the slogan of peace are often the very architects of war. The nation must be vigilant, united, and unapologetically assertive in defending its right to deterrence. The campaigns against us are not just political—they are existential.
