

Market Stability Improves, But Ordinary Citizens Still Face Economic Hardship

KARACHI: Former Chairman of the All Pakistan Customs Agents Association, Sheikh Muhammad Tariq, has said that while Bloomberg Intelligence's recognition of Pakistan as one of the emerging markets showing rapid improvement in sovereign default risk is encouraging, the reality on the ground remains far more complex and subdued.

He stated that Bloomberg's report reflects improvements largely due to financial discipline, stringent IMF conditions, deferred loans from friendly nations, and controlled imports — not due to growth in exports or improved productivity. "Pakistan has repaired its financial image internationally, but domestically, the economic foundations remain fragile," he remarked.

Commenting on the recent stability of the Pakistani rupee, Sheikh Muhammad Tariq emphasized that this calm is not organic but rather the result of administrative controls, import restrictions, and carefully managed financial flows. "Exports have not seen significant growth, and industries continue to grapple with energy shortages and policy uncertainty," he said.

Sheikh Muhammad Tariq acknowledged that Bloomberg's recognition is important as it reflects restored confidence through financial discipline. However, he stressed that sustainable improvement requires more than controls. "True progress demands structural reforms, enhanced energy efficiency, a broadened tax base, and exportdriven productivity."

He concluded by saying, "Pakistan in 2025 is neither in crisis nor in comfort. It stands in a state of uncertain calm — a calm achieved through control, not through real economic growth. Real success will come when this stability begins to improve the lives of ordinary people."

Has Ladakh slipped from Modi's hands?

he Modi Government is currently trapped on all sides: on one hand, there is declining popularity in the upcoming Bihar elections and, on the other, a civil disobedience movement against the BJP Government in Ladakh has created a serious situation.

The increasing bloodshed in the Himalayan region is a clear indication of the Modi Government's complete failure. Since September 24, 2025, the youth in Leh, the capital of Ladakh, have been protesting against the Central BJP Government. Protesters set fire to a police vehicle as well as BJP offices, while the police used tear gas and batons to disperse the crowd. As of now, the protests have resulted in the deaths of five young individuals, over 70 injuries and 30 police officers also injured.

In the meantime, notable activist Sonam Wangchuk has emerged as a leader. Recent protests have been organized in solidarity with Wangchuk, who has been on a hunger strike demanding full federal state status and constitutional safeguards for Ladakh. A well-known environmental activist, Wangchuk established a university-level institution in Ladakh named the Himalayan Institute of Ladakh, which operates entirely on solar energy. The institution is managed not by technical staff, but by students. He has received international recognition for extraordinary services to the community, engineering work and as an educator. Wangchuk has termed these protests as a continuation of Generation Z after Nepal.

Since the situation deteriorated in Ladakh, Wangchuk has been in the government's crosshairs, arrested under the CBI on charges of inciting youth through provocative statements and misleading people by citing references to Arab Spring-style protests and Generation Z protests in Nepal. The Modi Government has also revoked the FCRA license of Wangchuk's NGO. Leh is currently under strict surveillance by Indian security forces, but the Modi Government seems to have forgotten that the struggle for freedom in Kashmir has been ongoing for the past 77 years under the shadow of gunfire.

The roots of this protest movement trace back to 2019 when India abrogated Articles 370 and 35-A of the Constitution, stripping the oppressed valley of its special state status. Previously, Ladakh was part of the State of Jammu and Kashmir, which was then divided into three separate parts, bringing Ladakh directly under federal administration. In its quest for power, the Modi Government, desirous of a majority in Ladakh, had promised to make it an autonomous state. According to the Times of India, the BJP Government's negligence and criminal silence on Ladakh's issues is concerning. After the abrogation of Article 370, Ladakh lost its state status and the people are now on the streets demanding constitutional rights and state autonomy.

Pak Army's Frontline Response to 2005 Earthquake

October 8, 2005, stands as one of the single most devastating natural disasters in the entire history of the country, leaving an undeniable and indelible scar upon the collective memory and consciousness of the nation. Striking at precisely 8:52 AM local time, the earthquake registered a severe magnitude of 7.6 on the Richter scale and had its immediate origin near the major city of Muzaffarabad, the administrative center of Azad Jammu and Kashmir. Within a terrifying span of just a few minutes, entire towns and countless scattered villages were violently and completely reduced to rubble, with the naturally mountainous terrain of the region serving only to dramatically compound and exacerbate the scale of the destruction. Across the affected areas, critical buildings violently crumbled, major roads and highways cracked open, essential communication systems failed immediately, and the desperate cries of the injured and the dying filled the air, creating a scene of utter devastation. The sheer magnitude and scope of the physical destruction were profoundly beyond anything Pakistan had ever experienced before, and the agonizing aftermath severely tested the collective resilience, compassion, and underlying unity

of the country in an unprecedented way. The tragedy also instigated a genuine cultural shift in how Pakistan officially approached the enforcement of building codes, the practice of emergency drills, and overall public awareness regarding the reality of natural disasters. he massive seismic event that component of the school curriculum in tragically struck Pakistan on certain regions, and the continuous development of early warning systems, while still an evolving process, became a prominent fixture in the national conversation on security and preparedness.

Furthermore, the 2005 earthquake exacted a profound and lasting psychological and emotional toll on the entire affected population. The trauma experienced by the survivors—particularly the

many children who lost their families, homes, schools—was immense and pervasive. Unfortunately, specialized mental health support services were severely under-prioritized during the initial, chaotic phase of emergency relief. However,

Dedicated community centers and support groups emerged organically, and survivors were actively encouraged to share their traumatic experiences, formally honor their profound losses, and begin the painstaking process of rebuilding their lives. Public memorials were erected in many towns to respectfully honor the thousands of victims, and the anniversary of the earthquake is solemnly observed every year to both remember those who were lost and to publicly reaffirm the nation's commitment to continuous preparedness and deep-seated solidarity.

Conversely, if the deal remains clouded by ambiguity or conditional promises, it risks reigniting the same cycles of violence and exploitation that have defined the region for decades.

Peace cannot be manufactured through deadlines and ultimatums. Yet, when innocent lives and the freedom of captives are at stake, swift mediation and humanitarian action become moral imperatives. The international community, particularly the Muslim world and the United Nations, must prioritize humanitarian considerations over geopolitical calculus. They must ensure that any transitional phase in Gaza's governance is conducted under a lawful, transparent, and inclusive framework. Only then can reconstruction evolve into reconciliation and only through such integrity can the region move toward a durable and just peace. This moment is perilous, yet it also holds promise provided that the guarantees

ICCI-Uzbek Embassy agree to deepen trade ties, enhance connectivity



ISLAMABAD: President Islamabad Chamber of Commerce and Industry (ICCI) Sardar Tahir Mehmood, along with Senior Vice President Tahir Ayub and Vice President Mohammad Irfan Chaudhry, paid a visit to the Embassy of Uzbekistan in Islamabad to discuss ways for strengthening bilateral trade and economic relations between Pakistan and Uzbekistan.

Pakistan's First Digital Panel Survey Reveals

ISLAMABAD: The Pakistan Institute of Development to 30 districts, now including Economics (PIDE) unveiled landmark findings from the Pakistan Lahore, Karachi, Hyderabad, Panel Household Survey (PPHS) and Peshawar. The 2024 round 2024—the country's only longterm, nationally representative household survey tracking economic and social change for more than two decades. The evidence-packed seminar titled "Pakistan Panel Household Survey (PPHS): Key Insights and Implications for Policymaking" featured Dr. Shujaat Farooq, Dean of Research at PIDE, and was moderated by Dr. Karim

Dr. Farooq announced that 76 percent of the households surveyed in 2010 were successfully re-tracked in 2024, an exceptional achievement in longitudinal research. Supported by RASTA-DDR and conducted division problems, highlighting

Middle- and matric-level dropout rates stand at 34 percent and 21 percent, respectively, underscoring significant inequalities in learning outcomes.

On the health front, the survey highlights major progress. Antenatal care coverage has increased by 28.5 percentage points since 2001, reaching 80.9 percent, while skilled birth attendance rose by 69.5 points to 88.5 percent. Home births have dropped sharply to 11.6 percent—a decline of 57.5 points-and TT vaccination coverage reached 72.3 percent, marking a 35-point improvement. However, regional disparities persist, particularly in Balochistan, where access to maternal healthcare remains

Child malnutrition trends

show improvement, with stunting declining from 60 to 43 percent and underweight children dropping from 50 to 33 percent, although wasting increased slightly. Food insecurity, however, remains widespread. Only 19.5 percent of households can always afford desired meals, while 30 percent sometimes go without three meals a day. Inflation was identified by more than 60 percent of households as the most severe shock impacting their livelihoods.

The PPHS also paints a nuanced picture of poverty and inequality. Using the Cost of Basic Needs (CBN) method, Pakistan's poverty rate stands at 30.5 percent, 36.6 % in rural areas and 17.8 percent in urban areas. Rural poverty has declined from 46.1 to 37.5 percent, and urban poverty from 41.0 to 23.4 percent, yet income inequality has widened, with upper-income groups' consumption rising faster than that of lower-income panel households. Analysis indicates that, with better inflation control, the poverty rate could have been lower by around seven percentage

Social protection coverage has improved significantly. Around 22 to 23 percent of households now benefit from programs such as BISP and Zakat, up from 10 percent in 2010, while 10 to 11 and economic policy design. percent have access to microfinance networks. Additionally, around 60 percent of households report engaging in charitable giving, though mostly through informal channels.

Moderator Dr. Karim Khan commended the study's methodological rigor, emphasizing that its precise tracking of households and split families makes PPHS an invaluable source for policy analysis. He noted that the findings directly inform inclusive social



The seminar concluded with policy priorities centered on reducing learning poverty, expanding women's economic participation, strengthening social protection systems, improving iob quality, and investing in child well-being infrastructure such as playgrounds, libraries, and safe study spaces.

PIDE announced that the PPHS 2024 microdata will soon researchers and students, along-

side a 15-chapter, 200-page technical report prepared by RASTA. Dr. Farooq expressed optimism that this dataset will support "dozens of PhD theses and policy papers," contributing to Pakistan's evidence-based policy ecosystem.

CCP slaps Rs1.5bn fine on two steel companies for price-fixing

ISLAMABAD: The Competition Commission of Pakistan (CCP) has imposed a fine of Rs1.5 billion on two major steel companies for price-fixing and cartelization in the steel sector.

According to a CCP spokesperson, investigations revealed that the two companies illegally increased steel prices by up to 111% over the past three years, causing consumers losses worth billions of rupees.

A CCP report stated that the price of raw steel was artificially raised by Rs146,000 per tonne, with clear evidence of collusion and coordinated price manipulation between the

In its report, the commission said both companies consistently aligned prices between 2021 and 2024 to boost profits and create an artificial shortage in the market.



Acting on complaints filed by consumers and the builders' associations, an inquiry was launched in June 2024.

As part of the investigations, teams comprising CCP officials raided the offices of the two companies to obtain crucial evidence that led to the issuance of show-cause notices in March 2025.

The companies have been directed to deposit the fine within 60 days.

Failure to comply will result in an additional penalty of Rs100,000 per day of delay.

CCP Chairman Kabir Sidhu said that any form of cartelization or price-fixing would not be tolerated in any market.

He added, "Unfair profiteering in essential sectors like steel not only raises construction costs but also burdens ordinary consumers. The CCP will further tighten its oversight to prevent such practices."

ECP to issue Punjab LG elections schedule in Dec under existing law
